A new team will be set up in South Cambridgeshire to increase support for local businesses – particularly small and medium-sized companies.

At a recent meeting of the District Council's Cabinet, it was agreed that a new Business Support Service would be set up, with a remit to deliver activities offering practical advice and targeted support to existing and growing businesses in the District and those looking to move into South Cambridgeshire.

The benefit to Cambourne is that the Cambourne Business Park is part of the 'Cambridge Compass' Enterprise Zone. Further details can be found on:www.cambridgecompass.com

Any business locating within the Cambridge Compass Enterprise Zone sites between April 2016 and March 2021 could potentially be eligible for 100% relief on business rates. To determine eligibility, businesses are asked to complete a questionnaire where they must satisfy the necessary criteria, demonstrating the additional business growth that will be achieved by relocating to the zone.

- Offer bespoke packages of support to small and medium-sized enterprises - Help further develop the three Enterprise Zones in South Cambridgeshire, to encourage more businesses to locate to them - Guide companies wishing to relocate to the district or move within it - Deliver a programme of activities to support local village economies - Develop new and environmentally friendly tourism initiatives such as cycling and walking routes to encourage visitors into South Cambridgeshire communities - Provide guidance to companies on their response to the climate emergency, including advice on generating their own electricity, improving energy efficiency and recycling more waste and water - Make the entire Council more 'business friendly', such as by creating one point of contact for local companies and

becoming a vital link between the Council and other business support organisations

Growing local businesses and economies is one of the four priority areas in the Council's Business Plan and this new team, working closely with colleagues at the Greater Cambridge Shared Planning Service, will lead the authority's work in this area.

The service will work closely with neighbouring councils, and organisations such as the Chambers of Commerce, FSB, NFU and Visit Cambridge and Beyond to help complement the services that each provides.

Budget 2020 - 2021

Cambourne Town Council has to consider the budget for the next financial year and submit it to the District Council at the end of January each year. This is a challenging process as Cambourne continues to grow and the Council always strives to maintain or improve the services it provides to the residents of Cambourne.

As such, the Council has to consider carefully how it spends money on new projects like pedestrian crossings, 20mph speed limits, and the skatepark replacement as it has an impact on the Town precept.

When considering the budget for 2020 to 2021, it became apparent that if the Council wanted to maintain the current service level the Council would have to look at increasing the current Band D.

After reviewing the ongoing costs of maintaining the new and existing services, budgeting for inflation, the pedestrian crossing and contribution to work on 20mph speed limits in Cambourne and replacing the skatepark, it has had to increase the Band D point by 3% to £138.09, and increase of £4.02 per year (33.5p/month). Therefore, Cambourne Town Council will be levying a precept of £532,290.00 on South Cambs District Council.

Setting the Band D rate at £138.09 will allow the Town Council to continue to maintain and improve the level of service it provides for the community.

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking for on-call firefighters to join on-call fire stations around the county. On-call firefighters aren't based at a fire station, instead they carry a pager and respond to emergency incidents as and when they happen.

The Service has introduced a new daytime contract to the on-call service, which allows people to be available to respond to emergencies from just 24 hours a week, for example while working at their regular day job or from home.

The new contract is available for anyone interested in joining an on-call station, providing they can offer a minimum of 24 hours per week (between 7am and 7pm during the week) and attend the weekly drill night.

On-call firefighters can be men and women that come from every walk of life. They may be at home, working for themselves or a nearby company, or even out in their local community.

Volunteers must maintain their availability to respond to emergencies by staying within five minutes travel time of the fire station.

Volunteers also receive an annual wage plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights.





Back to Business after the General Election

After the General Election consumed so much of our time last year, it's time to turn our attention once again to Cambourne.

I have had several discussions with our new MP, Anthony Browne, regarding the Oxford to Cambridge train line. We are trying to ensure the Northern route across South Cambridgeshire is chosen. Prior to the election, I had several meetings with him to explain our position and he approached Grant Shapps, Secretary of State for Transport. Now that Anthony Browne has been elected, we have been working the last few days on an official letter to Mr Shapps formally opportunities. The City and District Councils have published a consultation on the joint Greater Cambridge Local Plan, covering housing, jobs and infrastructure development for the next 20 years. Many local residents are worried about the rapid pace of development in South Cambridgeshire, so I am concerned that the new plan contemplates a 61% increase in housebuilding in our area, approx 66,700 new homes. The joint consultation also suggests large scale developments on green belt land. It is crucial that our area does not fall victim to overdevelopment, and I will be fighting for more sustainable development. For further information please see www.greatercambridgeplanning.org

In the coming weeks, I will also be meeting with local NHS providers, businesses, schools, environmental groups and farmers to talk about the issues they face.

Time to Talk Day -Thursday 6th

At least 1 in 4 of us will have Mental Health

problems but we're all good at instinctively saying we're 'fine' when we may not be.

Time to Talk Day this year is focusing on the idea of 'asking twice'.

The suggestion is that after asking: 'How are you?' if you sense all is not well, you ask: 'Are you really ok?'.

Discussing our own mental health or someone else opening up about having struggles can feel daunting. However getting alongside someone, acknowledging their feelings, showing empathy, asking about what helps and being nonjudgmental can make a huge difference. It is not always easy to know how to begin conversations, but perhaps a discussion with people you know (without breaking confidences) including talking about celebrities who have opened up about their mental health problems could be your starting point. It may be easier to talk side to side rather than face to face, so conversations whilst driving, walking or shopping etc may feel more comfortable. If you have friends or colleagues with mental health conditions, look at the Mind website to help with your own understanding. However above all, listen well. It is the basis for people feeling cared for and valued and you don't have to have the answers. You just need to ask twice.

Members of both Councils have said they want as many people as possible get involved in developing the plan. A website has also been created at www.greatercambridgeplanning.org and this will the hub where people can record their thoughts, views and opinions. Both South Cambridgeshire District and Cambridge City Councils are committed to growing our economy and planning for new homes and a range of jobs which meet the needs of all our community.


The two councils' current Local Plans, which were given final approval in 2018, set out how the two areas will be developed up until 2031, with 33,500 new homes to be built and 44,000 new jobs to be created.

South Cambridgeshire District Council's Lead Cabinet Member for Planning, Cllr Dr. Tumi Hawkins, said: "This is a very exciting few weeks – it's not often we all have the chance to get involved in shaping such an important document that touches so many areas of our lives. Cambridge City Council's Executive Councillor for Planning Policy and Open Spaces, Katie Thornburrow, said: "It's so important to us that we reach people who don't usually comment on big issues like this and so we're working incredibly hard to reach everybody, especially those who can find it difficult to get involved for different reasons. We have the chance to make sure we have the right homes, jobs, transport, services and facilities in the right places in the decades ahead – while ensuring we preserve and enhance the environment at the same time. This is no easy task and will mean balancing many competing priorities and issues - and this is why we are determined to make it easier than ever before for people connected to Greater Cambridge to have their say. Please do give us your ideas because this really is our future."

Tips from the shed

Safely Drilling a hole in Stud Walls

If you need to hang something heavy if possible find a wall stud to secure to. If you do not have a stud finder simply get a decent little magnet and careflully go over the wall and if sticks that should be a screw head holding the plasterboard to the wall stud. Find one above or below to verify. Wall studs are often not used on external walls so find a solid bit by tapping the wall and listening will indicate where the plasterboard is dabbed on, but watch for pipes.

6 Surely every man walketh in a vain shew: surely they are disquieted in vain: he heapeth up riches, and knoweth not who shall gather them.




