Test and Trace QR codes

The Government has encouraged venues to prepare for the launch of the new app to track the spread of Covid-19.

The NHS Covid-19 app was launched Thursday 24th September. Everyone is encouraged to download the app and scan QR codes as a way of checking into a venue such as pubs, restaurants, hairdressers, cinemas and community facilities. QR codes will be an important way for NHS Test and Trace in England to contact multiple people if coronavirus outbreaks are identified in venues.

Locally, QR codes have been created for the following Town Council venues:

- The Town Office
- The Hub Community Centre
- Blue School Community Centre
- Sports Pavilion
- Great Cambourne Cricket Pavilion
- Bowls Pavilion
- Lower Cambourne Cricket Pavilion

QR codes will be located upon entry/exit doors as well as other locations throughout the venue.

NB: A QR code consists of black squares arranged in a square grid on a white background, which can be read by an imaging device such as a camera. It looks like a square chequer board.

Community buildings and sports facilities

The community buildings, sports pavilions, and sports facilities re-opened on Monday 7th September. The Government guidance allows for up to 30 people to meet to participate in group exercise as long as social distancing can be adhered to, so we were pleased to welcome back some of our regular hirers.

The football teams and football enthusiasts were pleased to be back

training and playing on the 3G and MUGA. Hand sanitising stations have been installed at community buildings and sport facilities. Face coverings must be worn in community buildings until appropriate to remove it (for example: an exercise class). We are still not accepting any private bookings for social gatherings such as a birthday parties. We will announce changes to this status on our website and Facebook page when we are able to take booking enquiries.

Merger of the Football Clubs

Unfortunately, the merger of all the Cambourne football clubs has been delayed by a year. However, early preparations have started with the Council taking back the bookings of the 3G, MUGA and grass pitches. Some teams have started playing in the new Cambourne Town FC strip for this season. The strip was agreed earlier in the year by the Cambourne Town FC working party.

There is still work to be done in order to successfully merge the clubs in time for next season. There is fantastic commitment from all Cambourne football clubs and they are fully supported by the Council and Cambridgeshire FA. The successful merger will make Cambourne Town FC one of the biggest football clubs in the County.

Rule of 6

Since Monday 14th September, it is against the law to meet in groups of more than 6 people who you do not live with together. This is for both indoors or outdoors.

Please note, the police have legal powers to enforce this ruling and can issue fines. There are exemptions to this rule which can be viewed on the Government website. (Information correct at time of writing, see www.gov.uk for latest updates).

New bus routes to Cambridge, Bedford and St Neots

Two new bus services were introduced at the end of August to improve bus links to Cambridge, Bedford and St Neots – the 905 and the X3.

The well established X5 route from St Neots to Cambridge has been renamed the 905 and now turns right at Caxton Gibbet to go via Cambourne, then onward to Cambridge, via Cambridge Regional College and the Cambridge Science Park.

This service runs every 30 minutes on weekdays passing stops in Great and Lower Cambourne. At the weekend, it goes every half hour from outside Morrisons to Cambridge Parkside, but doesn't stop at CRC or the Science Park.

The second new service is Whippet's X3 which will go hourly seven days a week to Addenbrookes Hospital from Huntingdon, Godmanchester, Papworth and Cambourne. The buses will stop at Cambridge Railway Station and extra buses are promised at shift change time for the Biomedical Campus.



The service improvements seem to be partially in response to the slow progress of the Cambourne to Cambridge busway (C2C), which was put on pause at the end of June amid rows and controversy. "While other politicians have spent the last year talking about additional transport provision in the Cambourne area that would not be in place for several years," said Combined Authority Mayor, James Palmer in March, "I have seen that we need solutions now;

That is why I promised these bus routes in February, and that's why I'm so pleased to announce the start of service on both routes."

However, in September SCDC District Councillor Gavin Clayton, advised caution. Speaking in the Cambridge Independent News he said: "A cause for celebration? Of course, but scratch beneath the surface and it's clear that these measures are simply a sticking plaster over transport problems that should have been addressed long before now."

Chatting to Cambourne residents, it's seems that the X3 has been welcomed by sixth formers travelling into Cambridge.

Some people working standard office hours have also found it a useful way to get to work.

There also seem to be quite a few people who do not realise there is now a good service from Cambourne to St Neots and on to Bedford and are yet to make use of the new services.



Cllr Dr. Shrobona Bhattacharya organised The Festival of The Bucket List 2020 for tourism and said.



This is working very well and we are managing to keep up with the demand with short turn around. To our disappointment we are unable to invite you in to browse and have a queueing system outside the library, to maintain social distancing. At reception you can return books and collect items from staff who have issued them in advance.

Select and Collect

This enables you to use our online form to request books based on your preferred genres at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/library. We choose books based on the information provided and stock available at Cambourne library. Alternatively call Customer Services on 0345 045 5225 to forward your request to the library. We will contact you when your items are ready to collect.

Reservations

Specific titles can be reserved online from home in the normal way, although reservations for picture books have been suspended. There are no reservation fees on adult cards for the time being.

IT facilities available by appointment only, with a limit of one 45 minute appointment per day per customer. Although, the session time allowed is much shorter than in normal times, we are pleased to be able to tell you that we now have new computers with updated software, so we hope these will prove popular.

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking to recruit more on-call firefighters to help serve local communities across the county.

CFRS is looking for people from all backgrounds to become on-call firefighters and provide emergency cover from either their home or their workplace.

On-call firefighters are a vital part of our Service and community. They respond to

a wide range of incidents, from fighting fires, attending road traffic collisions, animal rescues to supporting other emergency services.

In addition to responding to emergency incidents, our on-call firefighters support their communities by providing information and advice on a range of community safety topics.

They receive an annual wage to reflect the time they commit to being available plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights (one evening a week for two hours).

It's a hugely rewarding role, and we hope to encourage members of the community from all backgrounds to get in touch and find out more about becoming an on-call firefighter.

Continuing to Eat Out to Help Out in Cambourne

I have been out and about across the constituency over the last few weeks, seeing first-hand, some of the fantastic work being done by residents, as well as understanding the troubles that many have faced. I also had the chance, one or two times, to Help out by Eating Out! I was delighted to see that over 122,000 meals have been claimed for by the 107 restaurants, cafes and pubs in our area, including a number of establishments in and around Cambourne.

I have no doubt that there are businesses in South Cambridgeshire today which, without this brilliant scheme, may not have made it through the summer. I hope local people will continue to support them in the months ahead.

I want to discuss two key local farming issues this month - Nature-Friendly Practices and stopping "Hare Coursers". We are fortunate to have the Chairmen of two national groups in our area - Martin Lines of the Nature Friendly Farming Network and Robin Page, former BBC presenter and Chair of the Countryside Restoration Trust - both of whom have welcomed me to their farms over the last few weeks. I have also been working with DEFRA to ensure that their views, and that of many constituent farmers, are heard.

In terms of Hare Coursing, we must look at new ways to secure a firm deterrent for Hare Coursers, who continue to plague our farms. Information on Hare Coursing can be found on tinyurl.com/y6pgz59p and I urge anyone who witnesses any suspicious behaviour to report this

Better Transport Links for Cambourne

I have been continuously working with the local authorities and Stagecoach directors since 2019 regarding local transport.

Cambourne has been longing for better transportation for a while and I am pleased to say that the direct buses to the Science Park, Cambridge Rail station, Addenbrookes and St. Neots railway station we now have, will ease the situation considerably for Cambourne residents.

Our next meeting with the Directors of Stagecoach and County Councillor Mark Howell is about to take place and we will propose a cheaper circular bus route which connects the furthest corners, from West to Upper Cambourne, the college and the shops, along with more connections with the local villages.

I am happy to receive feedback from you that I can discuss with the directors in the future.

COVID pandemic is now more than a health crisis; it now has consequences beyond the spread of the disease and has social, cultural, educational, religious, psychological and domestic implications globally.

The collective wellbeing of the family, community and the society can make the difference. Residents can play a greater role to reduce human suffering and loneliness iwithin their own local community.

World Mental Health Day - 10th October

World Mental Health Day is an opportunity for us all to think about our mental health.

For many of us Coronavirus and the restrictions of lockdown have been a challenge for our mental wellbeing.

Restarting work, school or groups can be particularly difficult for those who have been shielding or isolating. Changes to what we were used to, can be stressful. For many, anxiety or feelings of panic about health risks can be very troubling.

People do have different views on what is the right way to behave which can contribute to negative feelings when people do not behave the

way we think they should. Many have experienced mental, physical or financial challenges or loss and our ability to process these difficulties is affected by these very different times.

There is no 'normal' response to this situation so start by being kind to yourself.

The charity Mind have some useful ideas on their website about our mental health and Coronavirus: finding safe ways to connect with people is important and don't be afraid to ask for help; following a plan and routine for your days can be helpful, including set times for sleeping; thinking about being creative in whatever way suits you and eating well, keeping hydrated and keeping moving will all positively affect your mental wellbeing as well as your physical health. "Don't tell anyone you're from Cambourne!" **Cambourne Pioneers Reflect on the Early Days**

In 1999, Nick and Carole Sayer drew a circle on the map to find places within an hour of London for their young family to call home somewhere more convenient for Nick's commute and somewhere homely with maybe a butcher and a baker on the high street and friendly, likeminded people nearby. The place they settled on was

a new town called Cambourne - "A village built in the old Cambridge style". That was the promise but, when Nick and Carole arrived, it was 25 houses in the middle of a building site (Monkfield Lane, in the area around the current dentist's) and they were among the first residents. Now, just over 20 years later, and ready to move on again, they reflect on the growth of Cambourne and those early days.

"One of the things that drew us was the Comberton school catchment" says Carole. But initially, their small children Frances and Peter were destined to attend the "primary school" in Cambourne which was in the building which now houses the dentist. There were just seven children in the school of all ages. Despite the challenges, Carole is adamant there was a good spirit in this new town. "People were coming from all over the country and were eager to make friends. We had safari suppers, family get togethers." She remembers the first Cambourne Firework Night in November 1999, which was held at the top of someone's driveway. "It was great. We felt like pioneers." And when the church wanted to hold an Easter Service, in the absence of a church, the Sayers were



asked if their garage could be used. "The vicar came and sanctified the space with holy water," remembers Nick, "which made it the most blessed garage in Cambourne at the time."

Later on, the place for community activities became the Ark, a portakabin which used to stand near the Blue School

Of course, Cambourne was not welcomed by all in the surrounding area. The heavy floods in Bourn in the 2000's were blamed on Cambourne by some. Carole recalls watching a panto by the Bourn Players, where the Robin Hood baddie was renamed the Sheriff of Cambourne and the audience enthusiastically booed him whenever he entered. "I hate to admit it" says Carole

with a smile, "but I said to Peter my son: Don't tell anyone you're from Cambourne!"

As years went by and, as many of Cambourne's early settlers will confirm, not everything the developers promised was to materialise. The promised local golfcourse didn't appear (the proposed location

later to become Upper Cambourne). "Nick's mother kept saying when are they going to build the butcher and the bakers?" The arrival of Morrison's put pay to all that. "I think the developer expected Cambourne to be populated by executive couples," says Carole. "But instead it became a place for families."

Which is perhaps why Nick and Carole have decided to move on to Ely; with their children now grown up and living their own lives, they felt it was time to downsize and move to somewhere more central. "Somewhere where they actually do have a butcher and a baker on the high-street". They both agree that they have been extremely happy in Cambourne and that it has worked very well for them. "We have benefited from having lovely neighbours and forged some good friendships", says Nick.

"With it becoming a town and getting bigger, the roads have become congested," says Nick. "And the housing density in the new parts of Cambourne is much higher than when it started out. But it continues to be a place that suits families and since our family has moved on, it's time for us to move on too."


Educating Otherwise: Exam Challenges

When lockdown was first announced in March it was a time of great uncertainty. I was apprehensive for my future, especially for my education. When my Mathematics IGCSE was cancelled barely days later, I was downright terrified. I'd been studying for months at that point – would I ever get the chance to take the exam? A breath of relief came with an announcement that predicted grades would be used. My mother and I scrambled to find a past paper that was neat enough to be sent in and graded. Unfortunately, we found out soon after that predicted grades would be based on centre-assessed grades. Being home educated, and not attending a centre, I never had a chance.

I know that the Government has overlooked those outside of traditional schooling on a number of occasions. However, I think they really dropped the ball during this pandemic – doing a disservice to both homeschooled and traditionally schooled children. Many home-educated pupils and their parents were left in a state of panic and shock when exams that we'd paid to sit were cancelled. When the scandal concerning algorithm-altered grades came out I was admittedly, almost glad that I never had the opportunity to get a predicted grade. Today, I'm lucky to be signed up for my Maths exam in January 2021. But I and others would appreciate your support for our future by signing this petition to the Government: 'Require local exam centres to accept home-educated students for public exams' (https://petition.parliament.uk/petitions/333864).'

South Cambs Hall to close to the public

The Cambourne offices of South Cambridgeshire District Council will be closed to the public from Monday 28 September to help minimise the spread of Coronavirus.

This follows the Government's announcement yesterday (Tuesday 22 September) when the Prime Minister said that everyone who can work from home, should do so. The majority of Council staff have been working effectively from home for several months now.

South Cambridgeshire Hall initially was closed to the public back in March at the start of the Coronavirus pandemic. It reopened, for pre-booked appointments only, on Tuesday 15 September. Since then, fewer than 30 residents have visited the office as the vast majority of queries continue to be dealt with via the Council's website, My South Cambs portal, online platforms such as Microsoft Teams or Zoom or by phone.

As a result, to help minimise the spread of Coronavirus, the building will be closed to the public once again. The Council's website is being updated to reflect this change, with social messaging also confirming the closure. Signs will also be placed in prominent positions at the front of South Cambs Hall.




