# **Look to the Skies!**

On October 19th 2020, a public consultation co-sponsored by London Luton Airport (LLA) and National Air Traffic Services (NATS) was launched for review and comment.

Together, LLA and NATS are responsible for low level arrivals into Luton Airport and NATS is the main navigation service provider for the United Kingdom. Changes are proposed for a new holding pattern also known as 'stack', to serve Luton Airport. The holding pattern is needed when air traffic is busy so planes fly in a pre-defined formation until they are cleared to continue with their descent to land. The current airspace design for Stansted and Luton has been relatively unchanged for decades, despite growth in low fare holidays flying out of both. Due to their geographical locations being close together it requires a high level of complex manoeuvres on the part of air traffic controllers to manage flights sharing the same approach route as Luton and Stansted currently do. Even with expert controllers, delays are inevitable causing disruption to landing slot times, giving rise to issues for onward flight connections. The proposal seeks to introduce a new holding pattern situated in airspace between Alconbury and St Neots that will allow for Luton to no longer share the approach route with those flights going into Stansted. So, LLA and NATS feel it is time to simplify things.

Looking to the future, when flights return to pre-pandemic levels coupled with anticipated growth in flight stock, the airspace design needs to be fit for purpose. There is no proposal to alter departures from Luton or to change departures and arrivals for Stansted. There are two options: (1) create a new holding pattern for LLA arrivals above 8,000 feet and maintain the current

method to take them down to the runway, managing flight instructions manually, known as vectoring. (2) vectoring as in option (1) but the holding pattern this time will be at 8,000 feet and above, with predetermined arrival flightpaths to which planes will automatically fly without intervention by air traffic controllers. This is the preferred option.

The new holding zone will impact the airspace above Cambourne. For Lower, Great and Upper Cambourne there will be a noticeable change in the form of aircraft noise. When you consult the virtual exhibition (see link below) you will be able to see details of the proposed changes. There is a tool for you to put in your post code and you will find what impact, if any, there is. Also, you will see an executive summary outlining the proposal along with maps and videos.

The consultation period is set to run for 15 weeks and 5 days, closing, Friday February 5th 2021.

A formal Airport Change Proposal is planned to be submitted to the aviation regulator the Civil Aviation Authority in June 2021. If approved, implementation is planned from February 2022.



#### **Road Safety Update**

#### **Yellow Lines Consultation**

Cambourne Town Council has been listening to the concerns raised by residents regarding on-street parking and the road safety issues it causes. The Council has agreed to the installation of yellow lines on De La Warr Way, Sackville Way and to the west of the High Street opposite the Hub Community Centre. These were put on hold for road adoption works to be completed. The works have largely been completed, therefore the Town Council is going to request that the County Council install yellow lines on these roads. The Town Council took the



opportunity to revisit the consultation on the east of the High Street (adjacent to the Cemetery) and Back Lane up to Osier Way, extending the existing yellow lines. The Town Council have agreed to request the County Council yellow-line these areas at the same time as the above roads.

The Town Council has also agreed a new consultation for yellow lines in other areas of Cambourne because of the concerns raised by residents about pedestrian safety and parking issues, including close to schools. The suggested areas are:

- Jeavons Lane, extending the existing yellow lines (near Jeavons Wood)
- School Lane, extending the existing yellow lines (near Monkfield Park Primary School)
- Jeavons Lane (from the Tennis Court extending past junctions for Miller Way, Stagwell Road and Stitch Road).

Prior to carrying out the consultation it was felt that we should give residents the

opportunity for other areas to be suggested to be added to the consultation. If you have any suggestions of a road to be yellow lined to improve parking issues and pedestrian safety, please email community@ cambourneparishcouncil.gov.uk by Monday 23rd November.

#### 20 mph Speed Limit

The final traffic counts have been completed and have been issued to the County Council to enable a PFHI Scheme to be drawn up by the County Council to assess the level of signage and if any traffic calming measures are required. This should allow the scheme to be agreed, ready for implementation in mid to late 2021.

#### **Pedestrian Crossing**

Work has progressed with the County Council on the Parallel Crossing (Zebra



Crossing with cycle crossing alongside) on Lancaster Gate, close to the Eastgate junction. The consultation by the County Council has now ended and the scheme is progressing through the various stages, with an intention to start installation in Spring 2021.

# Remembering Joanne Pointer, reception worker at Monkfield Medical Centre

The staff at Monkfield Medical Centre are sad to announce the recent passing of their colleague, Joanne Pointer.



Jo was a much loved member of the Monkfield Medical Practice and was our longest serving staff member. She started work in 2006 when she joined the small team led by Dr Peter Bailey.

During the fourteen years that she worked in Cambourne, she was an active part of the administration team.

During her time working at the practice the number of patients registered has grown ten-fold. This led to greater complexity in administration but this was never a problem for Jo. In particular, she excelled in her role as Prescription Clerk. This is a difficult and responsible role, ensuring that patient requests for medication are correctly and safely processed in a timely manner. Her kindness, honesty, thoroughness and competence shone through and assisted both patients and staff in ensuring the safe processing of the many daily requests.

As a colleague, she had a genuine interest in each of us and one of the highlights of the day was walking into the office behind reception to receive a cheerful greeting from Jo. She cared about how we all were, enquiring after our

families or how our holidays had been. If staff sometimes had to bring their children in to the practice for any reason, it was Jo that the children always wanted to see because of her kindness and humour.

Jo treated our patients in the same way and would often highlight a situation, if she thought someone was in difficulties.

She loved the outdoors and whenever possible at lunchtime, she would enjoy walking around and exploring Cambourne, regardless of the weather. Her other great loves were traveling and her family.

Jo died after a short illness on 23rd September 2020. She is survived by her beloved husband Dave and her sons, of whom she was justly very proud, James and Tom.



### Bourn Windmill at risk of collapse unless funding can be found



Bourn Windmill, one of the oldest windmills in the UK, is at risk of collapse. The charity Cambridge Past Present and Future (CPPF), who purchased it in 1936 and restored from a state of dereliction into working order, is now working hard to save it.

Graham Bruce, Chairman of the charity's volunteer team who help maintain the mill, explained: "During a routine inspection in 2020 we found evidence of rot in the cross beams that help support the weight of the mill. This was concerning and the charity contacted Historic England for help."

The conclusion of their initial surveys is that there is a risk that the beam could fail and the mill could collapse. It was considered that it was not safe enough to complete the investigative surveys and they have recommended that the mill is made safe by scaffolding/propping to enable them to

complete their surveys, assess the damage and design a scheme of repairs to secure the future of the mill.

The mill is now closed until further notice, although it can still be viewed from nearby. The mill has been placed on the 'Heritage at Risk Register' by Historic England.

The total project costs are likely to be £50,000-£100,000. CPPF is delighted to have been awarded an initial grant of £23,250 by Historic England and has launched a major fundraising appeal to add to this. The windmill dates from before 1636. It is an open trestle post mill which means that the whole mill rotates around a central pole. There are only around 50 of this type of extraordinary windmills remaining in the UK, 5 of which are in Cambridgeshire.

They will show on your account until you collect them and you may receive an email reminding you. If you do not wish to collect, they will still show on your account until we check them in for others to be able to order.

**IT Facilities-** IT facilities available by appointment only, with a limit of one 45 minute appointment per day per customer.

**Printing and Photocopying-**As there is no cash handling, you will need the correct change to drop into the coin box, 20p per page of A4 black and white and 75p per colour page.

# Cambourne swimming pool under consideration again

As West Cambourne takes shape, existing parts of Cambourne are set to benefit from the funding, developers are committed to putting into the surrounding area. Among these benefits could be the long-awaited local swimming pool, to be located in Great Cambourne.

When work is complete, West Cambourne will make up a fourth village in the extended town of Cambourne. The three themed areas that planners are using to describe the different

neighbourhoods – Sheepfold, Swansley Park and Woodfield will fall away and the village will be referred to as West Cambourne. Although in some quarters it has been labelled Cambourne West, this will no longer be the case.

Just before the last council elections in 2018, the land on which West Cambourne is being built, which previously fell under



Caxton and Elsworth Parish Councils, was transferred to Cambourne Town Council, along with the 5 existing houses in the area.

So West Cambourne will become very much part of Cambourne as a whole and existing facilities in Cambourne are set to benefit. First, The Hub will be extended into the currently unfinished upper floor to accommodate additional community space and a larger administrative facility.

At the point of 1000 houses being built in West Cambourne, funding will be released to give West Cambourne a new community building, a new sports pavilion, an all-weather running track and sports pitches. Funding will also be made available for the creation of additional indoor sport. This is currently planned to be used to provide an indoor swimming pool at the current

location of Everyone Active in Great Cambourne, subject to a feasibility check on the viability of maintaining and running the facility.

With 2,350 new homes planned, Cambourne is set to grow by around fifty percent of its current size with the first homes likely to go on sale in the spring of 2021.

# The show must go on....virtually

Cambourne's local drama group, Sundial Theatre Company is currently well into rehearsals for their Christmas production of "A Christmas Carol". Based on Charles Dickens' famous story of the haunting of Christmas hater Ebenezer Scrooge, this will be the group's first venture into a new medium, as the production will be staged in December totally on-line.

"When lockdown hit in March, we sadly had to cancel our planned production of Rumpelstiltskin," says Chair, Simon Hagan. "As the year progressed, we wanted to put on something that wouldn't be affected by the changing rules about audiences and meeting up and we came up with the idea of doing a show on-line, similar to other theatre groups around the world who were doing the same."

The production will be a truly socially distanced production, with all the actors performing individually from their Cambourne homes and the whole thing being brought together in a sort of souped-up version of Zoom. Although it will be quite different from a normal theatre production, there will be music and effects to create a lively hour of entertainment to get you in the mood for Christmas. Performances are on the 17th, 18th and 19th December, with tickets at just £3.50 per household with a pound from each sale going to a local charity. ### North Cambourne Station Consultation

As part of a meeting between EWR (East West Railway) and local Parish Councillors, and myself officials confirmed that the possibility of a railway station to the North of Cambourne was under active consideration.

I worked towards securing a Northern option as part of my general election campaign and have written to the Secretary of State for Transport on this issue.

Twenty-eight Parish Councils were represented at the meeting, which was addressed by the EWR Director of Strategy Will Gallagher, with Program Delivery Director Ian Parker taking questions on the design and implementation of the railway.

Several other local concerns were also raised during the meeting, including early electrification of the railway and the environmental impact.

East-West Rail is clearly listening to local opinion and I am delighted to hear they are considering a station North of Cambourne. I'm now calling on them to include any such option as part of a future public consultation.

I believe there is a very powerful case for a station to the North of Cambourne, where it will avoid many much-loved areas of natural beauty and will provide better connections with other transport links, such as the A428.

We need better public transport links through South Cambridgeshire, but it is important that any engagement is wide-ranging, transparent and happens as early on in this process as possible. Residents have the right to know what they can expect from this project."

# £50K Fund to Support Local Communities

South Cambridgeshire District Council announced a £50,000 fund to help communities in the event of a Corona Virus outbreak.

South Cambridgeshire's Parish Councils and community groups can now request additional grant funding from the District Council – to help them respond rapidly if there is a Coronavirus outbreak in their village.

The Council has set aside £50,000 to support communities. In order to make sure it can reach people in the greatest need quickly, upfront grants of between £100 to £400 are now being offered to parish councils and community groups that are at the forefront of their village's response to Covid-19.

The grants can be used to pay for:

- Hand sanitiser and basic protective equipment
- Printing of leaflets to help keep people informed about the work being done and help available
- Paying for a few days' shopping or topping up an electricity meter for people who need to suddenly self-isolate and are in financial hardship

The funds are intended to give initial aid for a few days only until other measures can be put in place, such as a claim for housing benefit, help with applying for Universal Credit, or an application to the Council's own Hardship Fund.

The Council is writing to Parish Councils,

community groups and lead volunteers inviting them to apply for the grants.

### Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month

November is Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month. The pancreas is part of the digestive system and is responsible for producing digestive juices and hormones which control blood sugar (insulin and glucagon).

There are several types of pancreatic cancer and the causes are not fully known. However, the risk increases with age, if you smoke or are obese (overweight) and there can be more of a risk if a close family member has been affected.

One of the major symptoms of pancreatic cancer is pain in the upper abdomen which moves around to the upper back. The pain can come on after eating, may be worse when lying down

(compared to sitting up) and may improve with leaning forward. Other symptoms can include jaundice (a yellowing of the skin or eyes, dark urine and sometimes itching); unexplained significant weight loss, or unexpected development of diabetes which is not associated with weight gain.

Food may not be absorbed properly which can lead to fatty, pale stools (poo) which may smell particularly unpleasant. Some people have more vague symptoms such as indigestion, changes to usual bowel movements with diarrhoea or constipation; loss of appetite or nausea and vomiting. Many of these symptoms can have other, much less serious causes but should always be discussed with a doctor.

Have you ever wondered how people are prepared for Christian ministry before being ordained and becoming a "Rev"? Part of it involves book learning and lectures, but another vital part of it involves training on the job.




# The Kids are creating 'Happy Houses' at The Vine

# Cambourne Village College is Fully Covid Compliant

With the first half-term under our belt, high standards of learning are being maintained at the College, despite some significant changes to the way we usually operate due to Covid-19 restrictions. Most readers will know that schools are required to operate a 'bubble' system to prevent pupils from mixing widely and we're fortunate that our school complex is divided into five wings. This means that each year group now has its own classrooms, dining, social areas and toilet blocks. We are thus able to trace pupil contacts in school effectively should we have to manage any positive Covid-19 cases, and this makes us hopeful that we'll be able to keep the school open throughout the winter.

Instead of pupils having lessons in the specialist areas of the school, teachers now circulate around the pupils' learning bases, observing social distancing, and the curriculum has been rearranged to prioritise theoretical over practical lessons. We're running a range of extra-curricular clubs again, although this is complicated by having to keep the year groups separate, and

music lessons are again in full swing.

In ways that we couldn't have foreseen, our excellent IT facilities are more valuable than ever. Each pupil in Years 7 -10 has exclusive use of an iPad which means that resources can be shared and work 'handed in' electronically. Those who are absent from school can keep up with their lessons via Microsoft Teams. Our biggest problem over the past half-term has been managing high levels of teacher absence, mainly due to staff or their family members self-isolating while waiting for the results of Covid tests. Speeding up the testing process will have a profoundly positive impact on schools.

In the meantime, we're all just happy to be back. Most of our pupils worked extremely hard during lockdown and staff have been impressed with the knowledge acquired and retained during remote learning. ### Local councils help with hungry families

After the government's decision not to continue to fund free school meals over the holidays - the County Council is reminding people in Cambridgeshire that there always has been and there still is support for those who need it.

The County Council and District and City councils are issuing a reminder to all those that are struggling to cope during the pandemic to make contact. This includes families who may be struggling but are not eligible for free school meals. Contact the Countywide hub on 03450455219.

District/City localities, supported by the countywide hub were set up to support people, whatever their needs might be due to the impact of the pandemic. These localities will - as they have

been for the last seven months - support people to access food and other supplies if they are struggling to provide for their families; and this will include those who are eligible for free school meals during the holidays. Advice and guidance is also made available to ensure families are maximising their eligibility for other benefits.

Schools will also be issuing reminders of how to access help from the localities to the parents of all children eligible for free school meals in Cambridgeshire.

South Cambridgeshire district council has pledged £25,000 to help with the provision of the scheme.

# **Government's Job Support Scheme for UK Business**

#### The Government's 'Plan for Jobs 2020'

Provided by South Cambs District Council.

#### Job Support Scheme

The Job Support Scheme is designed to protect viable jobs in businesses facing lower demand over the winter months due to the pandemic, to help keep employees attached to the workforce. The scheme will open on 1st November 2020 and run for six months.

The company will continue to pay its employees for time worked, but the cost of hours not worked will be split between the employer, the Government (through wage support) and the employee (through a wage reduction), and the employee will keep their job.

The Government will pay a third of hours not worked up to a cap, with the employer also contributing a third. This will ensure employees earn a minimum of 77% of their normal wages, where the Government contribution has not been capped. **Kickstart Scheme** 

The Kickstart Scheme will fund six-month work placements aimed at 16 to 24 year olds on Universal Credit and are deemed to be at risk of long term unemployment.

Funding will cover 100% of the relevant National Minimum Wage for 25 hours a week, plus the associated employer National Insurance contributions and employer minimum automatic enrolment contributions.

Individual pplications must be for a minimum of 30 job placements. The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority (CPCA) are acting as a local representative for the scheme.

#### Financial help and support

#### Self Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS) Grant Extension

The SEISS Grant Extension provides support to the selfemployed. The grant will be limited to self-employed individuals who are currently eligible for the SEISS and are actively continuing to trade but are facing reduced demand due to the pandemic.

The extension will provide two grants and will last for six months from November 2020 to April 2021. Grants will be paid in two instalments each covering a three month period. The first grant will cover three months' worth of profits from the start of November until the end of January. It will be worth 20% of average monthly profits and will be capped at £1,875 in total.

#### VAT Deferral 'New Payment Scheme'

The government will give businesses which deferred VAT due in March until June 2020 the option to spread their payments over the financial year 2021-2022. Rather than paying in full at the end of March 2021, businesses will be able to choose to make 11 equal instalments over 2021-22.

All businesses which took advantage of the VAT deferral can use the New Payment Scheme. Businesses will need to opt in, but all are eligible. HMRC will put in place an opt-in process in early

#### **Enhanced Time to Pay for Self-Assessment taxpayers**

The government will give the self-employed and other taxpayers more time to pay taxes due in January 2021.

Taxpayers with up to £30,000 of Self-Assessment liabilities due will be able to use HMRC's self-service Time to Pay facility to secure a plan to pay over an additional 12 months. This means that Self-Assessment liabilities due in July 2020 will not need to be paid in full until January 2022.

#### **Corporate Financing Facility**

The Corporate Financing Facility will remain open until 22 March 2021. Where a company has exhausted all other options, and is of strategic importance to the UK, the Government may also consider providing bespoke financial support.

The government is extending four temporary loan schemes to 30 November 2020 for new applications

#### 1) Bounce Back Loan Scheme (BBLS)

Bounce Back Loans are between £2,000 and £50,000, capped at 25% of turnover, with a 100% government guarantee to the lender to provide them with the confidence they need to support the smallest businesses. The borrower does not have to make any repayments for the first 12 months, with the government covering the first 12 months' interest.

#### Pay as you Grow - Bounce Back Loan Scheme

The government will give all businesses that borrowed under the BBLS the option to repay their loan over a period of up to 10

2) Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CBILS) The Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme provides loans of up to £5 million with an 80% government guarantee to the lender, giving lenders the confidence to provide finance to SMEs. The Government does not charge businesses for this guarantee and also covers the first 12 months of interest payments and fees.

#### **CBILS** loan extension

The government intends to allow CBILS lenders to extend the term of a loan up to 10 years, providing additional flexibility for UK-based SMEs who may otherwise be unable to repay their loans.

3) Corona Virus Large Business Interruption Loan Scheme The Corona virus Large Business Interruption Scheme provides loans of up to £200 million (to a maximum of 25% of turnover), with an 80% government guarantee to the lender.

#### 4) Future Fund

The Future Fund provides loans ranging from £125,000 to £5 million which are subject to at least equal matching from private investors.

# **Change of Roles for Youth Worker**



Youth Worker Jonathan Buwert (above) For the past 8 years, Jonathan Buwert has been involved in work with young people in Cambourne, working during this time as a youth worker for Cambourne Church, alongside roles within the West Cambridge Christian Youth Ministries (WCCYM) team and Cambourne Youth Partnership (CYP).

Three years ago, Jonathan also took on the role of Lead Youth Development Worker for Romsey Mill in Cambourne, working in partnership with CYP to develop the delivery of universal and targeted youth work provision in the town.

This was initially a part-time role, which Jonathan had alongside his work with Cambourne Church, but as of the beginning of November, he has now moved to work full-time for Romsey Mill, still with a focus in Cambourne. This means that he has finished in his role as Youth Worker for Cambourne Church. Jonathan says:

"When I first arrived in Cambourne and got involved, initially in a voluntary capacity, with youth work here, one of the things that I loved was the partnership of different organisations who all shared the desire to support young people holistically as they journey through the period of adolescence. There were a lot of ways in which different groups were working together, and continue to do so, and I have always felt that this ultimately leads to better support for young people. I have loved being able to be part of so many different groups, and it has given me a wide range of experience in youth work. It has been a difficult decision to hand in my notice for my job as a church youth worker, but I know that the church will continue to love and serve young people across the community as part of the church's wider ministry.

I am really excited by the opportunity to focus my work with Romsey Mill and CYP as we support young people in Cambourne.

Despite the challenges of the past few months, we are continuing to provide support for those young people who at most at risk, and are working on restarting some of the groups and activities that had been taking place before lockdown.
