

We continue to provide our reservation, select and collect services. Photocopying service is also available along with access to our PCs. To keep all our customers safe please bear in mind that if you "drop in" to use the copier and the designated number allowed within our PC area has been reached there may be a wait for you to use it.

#### **Select and Collect**

This enables you to use our online form to request books based on your preferred genres at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/library. We choose books based on the information provided and stock available at Cambourne library. Alternatively call Customer Services on 0345 045 5225 to forward your request to the library. We will contact you when your items are ready for collection.

#### Reservations 50p charge (adult)

Specific titles can be reserved online from home in the normal way. With both the selcet and collect as well as reservations services we issue your books in advance. This way it enables us to keep safe our staff and customers by reducing the contact time needed for the books to be collected. They will show on your account until you collect them and you may receive an email reminding you. If you do not wish to collect, they will still show on your account until we check them in for others to be able to order.

IT facilities are available by appointment only, with a limit of one 45 minute appointment per day per customer.

#### **Printing and Photocopying**

Please bring the correct change to drop into the coin box, 20p per page of A4 black and white and 75p per colour page.

# **Efforts to Save Windmill in Bourn**

Thank you very much to those of you who donated to the Save Bourn Windmill Appeal after reading about it in the November edition of the Crier. Over £3,000 has been raised via the website so far. 'Our project to save Bourn Windmill is underway,' said James Littlewood, CEO of charity Cambridge Past, Present and Future (CPPF). 'Thanks to a grant from Historic England and crowdfunding efforts we have appointed a specialist team of conservation architect, structural engineer and millwright. They have designed a scaffold system to support the windmill and we hope to have this in place by Christmas, which will be a great relief. In the new year they will carry out inspections of the supporting beams in order to determine the extent of the problem and the best solution for repair.'

Kate Armstrong who lives at Mill Cottage added, 'The mill car park will be locked during this period, although there will be limited access to view the work via the footpath.

Graham Bruce, Chairman of the charity's volunteer team who help maintain the mill, will be photographing the process and CPPF will be updating their website as things progress.'

The first phase of the project will cost upwards of £30,000. The second phase may cost up to £100,000.

# **Updated Covid-19 Business Support from SCDC**

#### **Business Grants for the November Lockdown**

The application process is now open for grants for businesses forced to close or adversely affected due to the national restrictions imposed on 5 November. Please visit our website for more information https://tinyurl.com/y6dy9edx

#### **Local Restrictions Support Grant (LRSG)**

Non-essential retail, leisure, personal care, sports facilities and hospitality businesses forced to close will be eligible for this grant. This includes business that are closed but are offering an online or click to order/delivery service. Current eligibility criteria:

- Properties with a rateable value of £15k or under, grants of £1,334 per month are available, or £667 per two weeks
- Properties with a rateable value of between £15k-£51k, grants of £2,000 per month are available or £1,000 per two weeks
- Properties with a rateable value of £51k or over, grants of £3,000 per month are available, or £1,500 per two weeks.

#### Additional Restrictions Support Grant (ARG)

The Additional Restrictions Support Grant has been made available by Government for each Local Authority to use its discretion to decide how best to support local businesses affected by local/national restrictions. South Cambridgeshire District Council will make this funding available to the following business types:

- Non-rate paying businesses required to close by Law because of the national lockdown measures (e.g. those operating in shared spaces or spaces where they pay rent but are not the ratepayer).
- Non-rate paying business which have not been mandated to close themselves but have been severely impacted by the restrictions.
- Rate-paying businesses which have not been mandated to close, but have been severely impacted by the restrictions. Businesses falling within the above categories and which are within South Cambridgeshire District Council's boundaries, will receive a single grant of up to £3,000 to cover the four-week national lockdown period.

## VAT deferral update

If you deferred VAT between 20 March and 30 June 2020 and still have payments to make, you can:

- pay the deferred VAT in full on or before 31 March 2021
- opt in to the VAT deferral new payment scheme when it launches in 2021
- contact HMRC if you need more help to pay.

### Guidance for businesses: Tier 2 regulations

South Cambridge District Council eent into Tier 2 from 2nd December. This means:-

- businesses and venues can continue to operate, in a COVIDsecure manner, other than those which remain closed by Law,
- Pubs and bars must close, unless operating as restaurants.
- Hospitality venues can only serve alcohol with substantial meals. Hospitality businesses selling food or drink for consumption on their premises are required to provide table

service only, in premises which sell alcohol close between 11pm and 5am.

- hospitality businesses and venues selling food and drink for consumption off the premises can continue to do so after 10pm as long as this is through delivery service, click-and-collect or drive-through,
- early closure (11pm) applies to casinos, cinemas, theatres, museums, bowling alleys, amusement arcades, funfairs, theme parks, adventure parks and activities, and bingo halls. Cinemas, theatres and concert halls can stay open beyond 11pm in order to conclude performances that start before 10pm,
- public attendance at spectator sport and business events can resume inside and outside, subject to social contact rules and limited to whichever is lower: 50% capacity, or either 2,000 people outdoors or 1,000 people indoors,
- weddings and funerals can go ahead with restrictions on numbers of attendees 1 5 people can attend wedding ceremonies and receptions, 30 people can attend funeral ceremonies, and 15 people can attend linked commemorative events such as wakes or stone settings,
- organised outdoor sport, and physical activity and exercise classes can continue organised indoor sport, physical activity and exercise classes will only be permitted if it is possible for people to avoid mixing with people they do not live with (or share a support bubble with). There are exceptions for indoor disability sport, sport for educational purposes and supervised sport and physical activity for under-18s which can take place with larger groups mixing.

#### Could More of your Staff Work from Home?

Dr Liz Robin, Director of Public Health for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, said, "The virus passes easily from one person to another, and this can happen travelling to and from work or during breaks as well as in the workplace itself. We are urging employers to allow their staff to work from home where they can effectively do so. This will reduce interaction with others, protect themselves and avoid a potential outbreak in the workplace." The Government advice remains the same that people should be working from home where possible, and businesses are being asked to look at their workforce and consider whether everyone they have on site is absolutely necessary and whether more people could be working from home to limit the spread of the virus and potentially protect more workplaces from an outbreak occurring.

# The Covid-19 Vaccine is Good News for 2021

I was delighted to hear the news that the Covid Pfizer vaccine has been approved.

While there is still plenty of work to be done, this is undoubtedly good news and marks the beginning of the end of this pandemic. I expect the vaccination programme will begin steadily, targeting those who most need it, and in the meantime we must continue to press for fair treatment here in South Cambridgeshire.

I have said throughout the national lockdown that a one-size-fits-all approach would mean far higher than necessary restrictions on low infection areas like South Cambridgeshire, which would dramatically increase the economic damage.

Therefore, the only logical alternative is a localised tiered approach. That does not mean I think the current localised tiered system is perfect – far from it. With its very low infection rate, South Cambs should be in Tier 1, not least because I know how important this is to our pubs and hospitality industry.

I think there are strong arguments for Tier 1, but I know that public health authorities are adamant that we should not move down until the population is vaccinated.

I think that gets the balance wrong, because it only looks at tackling the virus, not at the wider harms from the restrictions, not least in terms of livelihoods and mental health. I also don't think decisions should be made on a Cambridgeshire-wide basis. I will be campaigning to make the tiered system more fit for purpose, or at least, fit for South Cambridgeshire.

In his 1939 Christmas broadcast, introduced to a new generation by the film The King's Speech, George VI quoted the opening lines of a poem:

I said to the man who stood at the Gate of the Year, 'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.' And he replied, 'Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be better than light, and safer than a known way.'

As we enter 2021 those words are as appropriate as ever. We do not know what the year ahead may hold. 2020 surprised us all in ways we never imagined, and the past twelve months have brought much that has been hard to bear. The same could have been said of 1939 by those listening to the king's Christmas speech following the outbreak of the Second World War. But in the midst of it all we are encouraged to place our hands into the Hand of God - like a toddler venturing into the unknown with confidence because of the comfort, guidance and protection of a loved and trusted parent.

A similar sentiment was expressed by the American Civil Rights leader, Ralph Abernathy, who said, "I don't know what the future may hold, but I know who holds the future."

God is to be trusted even as we step into the unknown of this new year. As it says in Psalm 37, "Trust in the Lord, and do good."







# Winter grant funding will help South Cambs children get online

Digitally-excluded children in South Cambridgeshire are to be given a helping hand to get online with funding from a package of grants financed via the Government's Winter Support Grant scheme. The extra support for children and families aims to ensure vulnerable households do not go hungry or without essential items over the cold winter months as the effects of the Covid virus continue to bite.

South Cambridgeshire District Council is using its £30,000 share of the grant pot allocated to the county to support local charities and community organisations, such as Cambridge Online. The long-established digital charity will help provide data packages or devices to children in families in the District who currently have no internet access, enabling them to get online to learn and keep up-to-date with school work and to socialise this winter. In response to the pandemic, Cambridge Online has been providing free computer tablets and internet connections to isolated people across Cambridgeshire, giving them access to the outside world, such as when ordering food deliveries online or keeping in touch with family and friends. A new team of digital champions has also been supporting people to learn digital skills by 'phone.With a £5,000 payment from the Winter Support Grant, awarded via the District Council, it will be able to provide devices and data to children who have been particularly affected.
