Junior parkrun launches in Cambourne



At the end of July, junior parkrun finally launched in Cambourne. It's a free, weekly, timed 2km running event for children aged four to 14, and takes place every Sunday morning at 9am on the sports playing fields.

Every week, thousands of children take part in hundreds of junior parkrun events across the country. The aim is to have fun - children are free to run, jog or walk their way around the course at whatever pace they wish. Every child is clapped and cheered to the finish line, regardless of how long they take. Parents and guardians are also welcome to accompany participants around the course, or to cheer them on from the side.

Planning for the Cambourne event began in autumn 2019 and it was due to launch in summer 2020, before being

delayed by the pandemic. The launch was funded with support from Living Sport, Public Health Cambridgeshire, Cambourne Town Council and South Cambridgeshire District Council.

"During the first few weeks alone, we've already seen hundreds of children take part in the event," said co-event director Philip Abel. "Many have completed their first ever parkrun here in Cambourne! It's been a joy to see so many happy smiling faces each week and feedback from participants and parents has been overwhelmingly positive."

Children can also earn participation rewards by attending multiple times. After completing 11 runs they earn a half marathon wristband, followed by a marathon wristband after 21 runs and an ultra marathon wristband after 50 runs.

■ Junior parkrun is organised and run entirely by volunteers. Each week around 20 volunteers are needed for an hour on Sunday morning to help run the event. No experience is necessary, so anyone interested in helping out is encouraged to visit the volunteer section of the website, www.parkrun.org.uk/cambourne-juniors or to email the volunteer co-ordinator at cambournejuniors@parkrun.com You can also find more information at facebook.com/cambournejuniors



East West Rail comes to Cambourne

I was very glad to be able to welcome Simon Blanchflower, Chief Executive of the East West Rail Company (EWR), and senior figures from both EWR and the Department of Transport to Cambourne last week.

At the very first stop on a tour that would take us across twelve parish boundaries, we met with Parish Chairman Cllr Joe O'Dwyer and fellow Councillor David Jones for a detailed and well-informed presentation.

Discussion ranged from the position of the station to the environmental impacts of EWR and the potential benefits of a route to the North or South of the town.

If East West Rail is to come via Cambourne, we are all agreed that there must be a station for the town. However, it is also vital that some of the town's assets are protected from an encroaching route, including the environmentally important Country Park which has been a haven for many over the last 18 months.

With issues such as this, there is a stark difference between a comment on a screen and listening to local concerns directly from impassioned parish representatives. Perhaps I am being overly optimistic, but in Cambourne you could see the impact of the presentation on the faces of our visitors. These are the things we need East West Rail to appreciate, bringing to life the text of our local responses to the recent consultation.

As we await those consultation results, I am preparing for the second 'statutory' consultation in early 2022, which comes before any final decisions are made.

There is still time for you to fill in my survey at www.anthonybrowne.org/form/ewr-survey and help inform my actions before that time.

I will continue to campaign for clarity on all routes, with a fair chance to comment on each one in relation to any others. Our communities must not be separated by any route, all routes must be electrified, and the embankment, a profound and unnecessary eyesore which only exacerbates the impact of the line, needs to be reconsidered.

Plea to save our Windmill in Bourn!

We need your help saving Bourn Windmill from collapse

Bourn Windmill is one of the oldest windmills in England dating from c1635 and is designated as an Ancient Monument. It is special as it is a trestle post mill and one of only seven surviving in the UK today.



Sadly, the windmill is currently closed to the public and two charities, Cambridge Past, Present & Future (CPPF) and Cambridgeshire's Action with Communities in Rural England (ACRE) are working together with the windmill volunteers to attempt to save it from collapse and restore it to working order.

£30,000 Available for Local Organisations

As part of Cambridgeshire County Council's Covid Local Support Grant, £30,000 has been given to a range of local organisations in South Cambridgeshire to support families over the summer months with food, fuel and other emergency supplies.

The educational charity Cambridge Online has received a grant of £15,000 to support 105 families who are financially vulnerable. The money will buy equipment to help refurbish laptops and buy tablets and data packages for online access.

They also provide free ongoing support to all families who use the service. The aim of the new scheme is to provide computer devices and internet connections to help South Cambridgeshire families and households gain online access for education, to access services or for social interaction. Other grant recipients include:

- Cambridge City Foodbank, which was awarded £3,000 to help expand the fresh food offer in Trumpington, Cambourne and Northstowe. The money will also support families in South Cambridgeshire with other food and fuel provision.
- Care Network, which was awarded £1,000 for its 'community navigator' and 'help at home' teams, which help people to continue to live independently.
- Age UK, which was awarded £8,000 to support older residents through the community warden scheme, and to help to provide a fruit and veg service for older people.

Smaller grants, which have been awarded to South Cambridgeshire Parish Councils, local food networks, community food banks and Covid community groups.

Cllr Bryony Goodliffe, Chair of Cambridgeshire County Council's Children and Young People's Committee said: "I am delighted that we were again able to offer financial help to struggling families. The new Joint Administration at the County Council is committed to providing support to the children and their families in recognition of ongoing impact of the pandemic and decided it was imperative to top up the grant offered by the Government to make a real difference to those families who need it most.

The Covid Local Support Grants are designed to support local organisations and charities which are helping vulnerable people in our community as we move out of Covid restrictions. Working together, Cambridgeshire County Council and South Cambridgeshire District Council are supporting charities that are helping many hundreds of households in the district.

Achievements in Education and Science

I am very glad to say that at the time of writing, 87% of South Cambridgeshire residents have had their first dose of coronavirus vaccine and 75% their second.

I am very proud of the contributions our area had made in the fight against Covid-19 be it the researchers at AstraZeneca, the genome sequencers (who do almost as much genome sequencing for Coronavirus as is done across the rest of the world) or those who have assiduously followed the rules and taken up the offer of a vaccine.

I similarly offer my congratulations to those who

have received their GCSEs and A-Levels, I have been working with my parliamentary colleagues in Cambridgeshire to lobby the Secretary of State for Education for additional funding for local schools.

I am delighted our efforts have resulted in such substantial changes, with all four Primary Schools in Cambourne and the Village College receiving increases of between 2.1 and 2.5 per cent per pupil.

I will certainly be pushing for additional funding for our schools in conversations with the Minister for Education in the future.

For now, I hope that parents, staff and pupils alike are enjoying their summer break. It is certainly well deserved.

Sepsis

September 13th is World Sepsis Day.

On rare occasions a condition called sepsis can develop as a complication of an infection. The body can over-respond to the infection which can lead to damage to major organs which can be fatal.

Knowing the signs and symptoms of sepsis and acting on them quickly can be life saving. Sepsis can occur at any age but symptoms may be slightly different.

In young children (under 5s) warning signs may include: blotchy/blue or pale skin; lethargic, difficult to wake or floppy; skin unusually cold to touch; very fast breathing rate or finding it hard to breathe; a rash that does not fade when pressed

with a glass; no wee or wet nappies for 12 hours; not drinking/ feeding normally; unusual or high-pitched cry; an older child who is confused or who seems to have a stiff neck.

Symptoms of sepsis in older children and adults are similar with particular concerns about cold or blotchy skin; extreme shivering; rash; not passing urine; slurred speech or confusion and extreme breathlessness.

Although a high temperature can be a symptom of sepsis, so can an unusually low temperature, therefore if you are worried about symptoms seek urgent medical help. Call NHS 111 for advice or 999 if you are very concerned.

EDUCATION

Educating Otherwise:

Freedom and flexibility.

One of the great things about alternative education is the flexibility it offers. During this pandemic time Max's education schedule was not slowed at all. We were able to pre order the materials we needed for the entire year and despite a small hiccup with one course that was substituted for another, everything else went well. We are just waiting on his tests to be graded by moderators and he will have his ICCE (similar to GCSE) certificates which is not bad considering he is 13. It was amusing as my wife who also sometimes works as a substitute teacher was teaching the same mathematical formula to students much older than him. He will of course continue in education as he can't get a job yet at 13 but the extra few years will allow us to cater his education to his interests incorporating real world and life skills not offered in every school; such as electrics, plumbing, woodwork and metalic skills including car maintenance and renewable power systems. We have already covered principles of flight and some simulated structural engineering. Some of the software although listed as a game has surprisingly complex build mechanics and having dealt with aircraft myself for many years, it was an easy tool to teach. The ones below Max designed and built entirely himself including a faster loading mechanic for ammunition.



It also was a great tool to teach the history of transportation. I will also be teaching him about desktop publishing later on, so he can help me in my work with the Crier. Always look for those teachable moments to "raise up a child in the way he should go" as one book put it. Individualised directed learning in subjects that are needed and hopefully that he will be excited about with endless possibilities. Donavan Bangs

Getting the pupils involved is of great importance, as they realise that wildlife isn't just on TV, but also in the school grounds and possibly on their doorsteps. In our community posts we publish wildlife that has been spotted in Cambourne or further afield that has been sent in by our pupils and parents. Hopefully, by encouraging an interest in nature, our children will want to look after the wildlife both here and in the wider world.

Youth had a great time this summer! Young people from across Cambourne have enjoyed a variety of activities provided by CYP and Romsey Mill across the summer holidays. We ran a programme with a weekly lunchtime group and skills workshops for those aged 16-19 (with the session on CV writing being a particular highlight) and an afternoon each week of inflatable fun on the sports fields. It was great to see a lot of new young people engaging with the sessions, alongside those who have been involved previously.

In addition to the activities in Cambourne, we ran several trips across the summer for young people who we have been supporting, including go karting, climbing, trampolining, bowling, safari park and aqua park. We also took our football group to Peterborough to take part in a tournament against other teams from within Romsey Mill's groups in Hampton.

These activities have provided a lot of space for positive engagement with young people in the community. As well as offering opportunity for fun and new experiences, we have also been able to work one-to-one with several young people to

provide targeted support. Some of this has been around navigating education and work-related decisions, while for others it's been support for their relationships and mental health.

We're delighted to be able to share that Emma Slater, who has been on maternity leave, has returned over the summer to work one day a week with us in Cambourne as a Youth Support Worker (in addition to covering other areas within the Romsey Mill team), and that Emma Whitbread, who was originally covering this maternity leave, will be continuing as a permanent, full-time Youth Development Worker in Cambourne. We're looking forward to continuing to develop and grow the opportunities for youth work within our community and schools.

As we move into the new term we'll be restarting our regular programme of weekly youth clubs, alongside the continuing support for individuals and small groups.





Submissions to the Crier

What do you need to consider when submitting Items?

Suitability

Is the item to do with Cambourne. This is a local publication so the items will usually be directly related to the community. Something that happened here or someone from here did something. Examples would be fairs or festivals locally or a local person competing in a national competition. If you are submitting as part of your occupation, like librarian or nurse or councilor or such it should also be about what is going on or what you have done or helpful information concerning the community. If you have something outside your occupation to submit that is fine but it would need to be a separate article but still locally based. For example, I am the Pastor of Peacehaven Baptist church and if I wanted to speak about editing the crier in-depth, or homeschooling, or my solution to slipping drainpipes (hint it is a self-tapping stainless steel screw through the bracket into the pipe) I would do it in a separate article from my pastoral thoughts.

Size

The length of the article will vary and is flexible to a degree month to month depending on the number of submissions. On average most articles will be about half a page which would often include photographs. Consider that when writing. It is always good to be concise in what you say as it means it may be more likely to be included and more likely to be read. If you submit 200 words and a decent photo or two it is easier to work with than some which are sent in with over 1000 words. This brings us to the next part

Editing

Any articles submitted are likely to be edited regardless of who submits them, including other editors of the crier. Some are edited for size, a page and a half of writing about every aspect of an event will be reduced. (We literally have had this.) Other times it will be edited for relevancy. Often we get items that relate to multiple locations or events and we may remove the parts that

have nothing to do with Cambourne. We also edit for clarity. If we spot an obvious mistake we will try to correct it. Like a reference to an event on a date that does not exist. (yes that has happened).

Format

Send the articles in an editable format if possible. What I mean is plain text in an email or in a word document or suchlike. Do not send text as some pdfs or a jpg. As if it is not in a useable format we are not likely to wish to retype everything. (I have done that but it is not fun.) Do not put everything in little text boxes if possible as it means multiple cuts and pastes with more chances something may be missed.

Photographs

Ensure photographs if included are **ATTACHED** to an email and not just pasted in as it will result in low-quality images. The photos should be separate files for each photo. Sending a combined picture of 5 or more pictures as a single file is really difficult to work with (this happens a lot), and a lot of the editors do not have the technical skills to really deal with that. Ensure that any file you send you have the required permissions for it to be published. Also, ensure the file is of decent quality. A 22 kb picture from your 14-year-old flip phone is not going to cut it. (Yes, seriously that needed to be said.) Unless it is a simple logo minimum would be around 120kb but we would prefer 1Mb or larger as print quality needs to be higher than website quality. Also please avoid sending pdfs as photos just send a jpg. Even some png files cause problems if they have transparencies.

Conclusion

Remember all the editors are volunteers and not paid professionals. We do not have big budgets (or any budgets). You submit the articles and we do what we can to bring what we feel is relevant to you free of charge. We do the best we can. We are independent, local media giving back to the community that we like you call home.

Council to resettle refugees from Afghanistan

Three families from Afghanistan will be provided a home and essential support by South Cambridgeshire District Council in response to the international crisis.

Councillors have also said they will continue to work with Government and other agencies who are monitoring the crisis. This may mean further families could be supported to start a new life if funding is available and the right homes can be found.

The initial three Afghan families will be supported by the Council to relocate to the UK through the Afghan Locally Employed Support (LES) scheme.

The support follows commitments in recent years to provide homes to refugees from Syria, Iran and Sudan. Four families were housed under the previous scheme by the Council and in December 2020 a further commitment to support up to an additional four families per year was made.

The Council worked with an existing resettlement team and support workers at Cambridge City Council to integrate families who arrived during 2019/2020 into their new homes and communities, to ensure practical support was in place. Any new families arriving through the LES scheme will similarly need to be provided support and the Council is working on the detail of how that support will be provided through local partnerships.

South Cambridgeshire District Council's five-year Business Plan commits to working with national, regional and local partners to support the needs of refugees and asylum seekers.

Council owned homes are not planned to be used to meet the initial pledge to house three families and therefore it will not have an impact on the waiting time for local families who are already on the Council's housing waiting list.

A Day in the Life of a Social Prescriber in Cambourne



Monkfield Medical Practice

My name is Yvonne Herbert and I would like to introduce myself as the Social Prescriber based in Monkfield Medical Practice (MMP). I work in the surgery on a Wednesday and Thursday.

I start my day by reading the referrals I have received from GP's, nurses, pharmacist, and reception staff. One referral highlights a son is in crisis. He provides an informal caring role for his mother, and he feels overwhelmed. I call the son and arrange a home visit. We discuss their concerns and I make a referral onto Caring Together, for a Carers Assessment and a Carers Prescription, which enables the son to have a break from the caring role.

His mum is mourning the loss of her independence. I refer her onto the Occupational Therapy Team who provide aids and adaptations, which enable her to safely get in and out of the bath. I also support her to contact Cruise, to talk about the grief of losing her husband.

During the morning I refer a lady onto a befriender scheme. She feels lonely and isolated and says her quality of life is poor. We

talk about the local groups available in the community, but she has lost the confidence to attend. I offer some initial support to introduce her to a group.

During a telephone call a gentleman tells me that he is living in debt and unsuitable housing. He feels that his life is hopeless. With some encouragement and support, he takes the brave step to call a debt charity and sets up a repayment plan. We call the CAB who talk through his entitlement to Attendance Allowance, a disability benefit that is non-means tested. We also talk about his housing options and together we contact the housing department at the council.

Towards the end of the day I respond to emails and write up my notes, care plans and reviews. I receive a call from the local vicar who wants to discuss starting up some groups specifically aimed at men. I talk about the concept of a "Man in a Shed group" and offer to give a talk at the men's breakfast club.

As I close down my computer, I reflect on my day and the how privileged I feel doing this job. Patients and families share their stories, hopes, dreams and aspirations. They also share their fears and worries. They can feel daunted when faced with navigating health and social care systems and when accessing information and advice.

The Social Prescribing role enables me the time and space to really ask 'what matters' to you' and 'what do you want to achieve'.

There are Social Prescribers based in many GP surgeries across the county. If you are a patient of MMP, please contact the surgery to have a chat with the Social Prescriber. If you are not a patient at MMP, please contact your GP surgery.
