# NEW YOUTH CENTRE FOR CAMBOURNE TO OPEN IN 2022

A new purpose-built centre for young people in Cambourne is set to be completed earlier than initially planned, after South Cambridgeshire District Council agreed to loan Cambourne Town Council funds towards the project.

As part of the planning agreement for the Cambourne West development, the Town Council is set to receive a contribution of £500,000 from the developers towards the youth building. However, this funding will only become available in around three years, when people move into the 300th home on the development. To ensure the Town Council can complete the new youth centre as soon as possible, South Cambridgeshire District Council has agreed to provide a loan to bridge the gap.

Construction work is underway at Back Lane and the new youth centre is expected to be completed in February 2022. The building will be a highly insulated timber structure and feature solar panels, air source heat pumps and LED lighting to minimise its carbon footprint. There will be covered cycle parking and young people will be part of a project to plant surrounding trees and hedges to develop skills and promote the importance of ecology in Cambourne. It will replace the dated Cambourne Soul building on Back Lane.

There will be a main hall, club room, studio space, kitchen, office and counselling room. There are plans for open access drop-in sessions for young people when the new building is complete, along with the space to better cater for young people who are isolated or disabled. It will act as a hub from where activities can be organised; a focal point for youth activities in Cambourne.

Cambridgeshire County Council has also assisted by giving a Communities Capital Fund Grant of £237,000 to enhance the youth building, and support activities for young people during the recovery from COVID-19, to help address social isolation.

# Offer of free trees to parishes is doubled

An offer of providing free trees to South Cambridgeshire's villages is being doubled – in line with the District Council's strategy to Double Nature.

Last year (2020) every parish council in the district was offered three free trees to encourage more planting. This year, parishes are being invited to apply for six free trees. With trees absorbing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, they play a key role in helping to combat climate change.

A total of 54 parish councils took up the offer last year as part of South Cambridgeshire District Council's efforts to increase tree canopy cover. This year, they will be offered a choice of native trees which can be either pot grown or bare rooted.

Council Leader Cllr Bridget Smith said: "It was terrific to see communities across South Cambridgeshire getting involved in more tree planting last year as a direct result of our three free trees scheme. This year we want to do even more; not least because six free trees is easier to say than three free trees! But on a serious note, we know that South Cambridgeshire has well below average tree cover and relatively little nature-rich land. Through our continuing plans to Double Nature, we want to change this. "Although we are again only talking about a relatively small number of trees for every parish, this is about encouraging wider planting schemes and generating interest amongst communities in trees.


"We had a lovely morning last year at Fulbourn Recreation Ground, joined by local schoolchildren, who helped us plant the first trees as part of this scheme; one of the children had never planted a tree before. So, anything we can do to nurture an interest in nature and recognition of the importance of trees is time and money well spent."

Along with around 2,000 local councils across the world, South Cambridgeshire District Council has declared a climate and ecological emergency. Its business plan priority 'being green to our core' was commended earlier this year as being "exemplary" as part of the 2021 iESE Public Sector Transformation Awards.

In May 2020, the district's first Zero Carbon Strategy was adopted, to lead the transition to low carbon living across South Cambridgeshire. Then, in February 2021, District Councillors adopted South Cambridgeshire's first Doubling Nature Strategy, setting out an approach to increasing wildlife-rich habitats and the tree canopy and improving access to green spaces.

### **Trespassers warned to keep off 3G pitches**

CAMBOURNE TOWN FC AND CAMBOURNE TOWN COUNCIL have issued a joint statement addressing trespassing on the 3G pitches in Cambourne.

The statement said: "Over the past few months there have been many instances of trespassing on the 3G pitches. This has occurred both whilst the facility has been locked, and whilst it has been open and in use by those that have a booked time slot.

Both the Town Council and CTFC Committee have received complaints of trespassing from club coaches, parents and other users of the facility. The issues reported are:

• Scaling of the perimeter fence to enter and leave the facility whilst locked

• Use of foul and abusive language

• Use of scooters, e-scooters and bicycles on the 3G pitches

· Damage to nets and goals

• Inappropriate footwear leading to potential damage of the 3G surface

- Extensive littering
- Refusal to vacate the facility when asked
- Intimidating behaviour

• Re-entering the facility following a booked time slot, after being asked to leave

It is important to remember that the 3G is a pay-for-use-facility that must be booked in advance. Not all trespassing has the intention of causing damage to the facility or distress for other users - some just want to play football - unfortunately, others have caused serious issues and there have been frequent instances of many trespassers entering the facility at a given time.

The council advises that anyone witnessing trespassing should call 101 and report it to the police.

A letter has been sent to the Police and Crime Commissioner for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, signed by the Council Chair and Chair of Leisure and Amenities Committee, to request direct assistance from the South Cambs Police Team in helping mitigate the issue of trespassing by coordinating enforcement actions with the Council and Club Committee. The letter also requests improved engagement in general with issues in the local community and a direct line of communication to the South Cambs Police Team.

Additional security notices and danger signage has been ordered and will be attached to the 3G fencing.

To be clear, any use of the 3G facility outside of a formal booked time slot, or without previous explicit agreement from the Town Clerk or authorisation from the Town Council, is trespassing and the Council will seek enforcement action in all occurrences."

### A big thank you from the Save Bourn Windmill appeal



**SAVE BOURN WINDMILL APPEAL:** Our stand at Cambourne Fete in September raised £89.50 for the *Save Bourn Windmill Appeal* to save one of the oldest windmills in the country which is at risk of collapse. We would like to thank all those who visited the stand and for the good local support through donations. There was much interest in the repairs, with many expressing a wish to visit the mill when it reopens.

So far, locally, we have raised more than £8,000 towards the £50,000 needed for work to conserve and restore Bourn Windmill.

The oldest parts date to the late 1400s and it is one of the five oldest windmills in the UK, which has been owned by the charity, Cambridge Past, Present & Future since 1931. Lord Norman Foster, the renowned architect, visited and studied the mill during his time at the University of Cambridge in the 1950s.

The mill's wooden structural beams are more than 140 years old and need to be replaced as they have significant damage and can no longer safely support the mill, hence the scaffolding and its closure to the public.

# Volunteer at the wildlife trust

The role is informal and can be done, for example, while on a regular dog walk. There are also some seasonal opportunities, such as helping migrating toads cross roads safely in March, and supporting community events from spring to autumn. 

### Environmental concerns at the heart of local plans says Greater Cambridge Shared Planning Service

#### A list of potential development sites, chosen to minimise carbon emissions and set Greater Cambridge on a clear path to a net zero carbon future, has been published for the new Greater Cambridge Local Plan.

The proposals now go forward to be scrutinised by councillors, along with a clear warning to central government that delivery of the proposals will depend on increasing the area's future water supply.

The new Local Plan, which will set out where new homes and jobs would be developed to 2041 and beyond, aims to minimise carbon emissions and maximise biodiversity and green space improvements, social inclusion and creating great places to live and work. As a result, sites have been chosen which will be close to high quality public transport and within walking and cycling distance of local destinations and services, to minimise future car use. Only 19 new sites are proposed to be taken forward into the new Plan. All sites were tested against a range of criteria, including flood risk, transport, biodiversity, heritage impacts and other important factors.

Most new sites have been suggested in and around Cambridge itself, because of the smaller carbon footprint they generate, with only 4 per cent of homes on proposed new sites being in rural areas. Proposals in and around the city include the major brownfield sites at North East Cambridge and Cambridge Airport, which are proposed for new low-carbon neighbourhoods. An extension to the biomedical campus around Addenbrooke's hospital is one of only four sites which are proposed to be released from the Green Belt. The plan will also continue to see homes built in locations such as Northstowe and Waterbeach that are already under way, as well as Cambourne.

Along with the possible locations for development, the proposals also include suggested new green space and wildlife projects, initial policy recommendations for low-carbon building and water conservation, and proposals for the amount of affordable housing that developers should provide in the future.

Cllr Katie Thornburrow, Executive Member for Planning and Transport at Cambridge City Council, said: "We have listened carefully to what we were told during our consultation in 2020 and our planners have taken up the challenge to be as ambitious about dealing with the climate crisis as we can be, within the wider constraints set by central government. We want to use land carefully and wisely – building on as small an area as we can, so we can boost the amount of land managed for nature and take steps to increase our biodiversity. Before we go further, we want to hear what residents think about the choice of sites, when public consultation starts in November.

"It is clear from the evidence that our concerns about water supply are well-grounded. This needs urgent action by

government and the water industry, if we are to realise the benefits that this Plan could bring to our communities."

Planners have developed the proposals following in-depth technical studies into issues such as water consumption, carbon emissions and biodiversity. Extensive public consultation was also carried out in early 2020 and respondents overwhelmingly said that climate change was the top priority for the plan. As a result, an ambitious vision has been developed which focuses on how carbon emissions can be decreased, while increasing quality of life for local residents. The vision states:

The objective assessment published by planners shows that: Current planned sites and planning permissions will deliver around 1,770 new homes per year up to 2041. These new homes are already confirmed in locations such as Northstowe, the new town at Waterbeach, new village at Bourn, Eddington, Darwin Green and land north of Cherry Hinton, generally via the current adopted separate Local Plans for South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City.

■ On top of this, the plan needs to allocate sites for around 550 homes a year, in order for housing to keep pace with the increase in jobs in the area.

Only around 4 per cent of these homes are proposed for rural village locations – 384 homes in total over the next 20 years.
 The proposals aim to meet this need in the right locations to meet the climate and environmental ambitions for the plan.
 Planners propose that 40 per cent of the homes built on sites which provide 10 homes or more, should be social rent, affordable rent, shared ownership or discounted market sale properties.

The proposals also state that, without urgent action by the water industry and central government, meeting these ambitions for the Plan may not be possible.

Plans for new sources of water supply, including potential new reservoirs, are being developed, but the report states that, on current estimates, these won't be built quickly enough to supply housing when it is needed. Without speeding up that process and additional interim action, development levels may have to be capped to avoid unacceptable harm to the environment, including the region's important chalk streams. Planners warn that this may lead to housing in the area becoming even more unaffordable so that those who work in Greater Cambridge may have to commute from further afield, increasing carbon emissions and congestion.



**CAMBOURNE WALKING FOOTBALL:** In case you didn't know, Walking Football is one of the fastest growing sports in the world and there is a weekly session based here in Cambourne, played by over-50s.

South Cambs Amblers WFC was set up two years ago and thrived even during lockdown thanks to a group of grown men - some of whom might look more at home in a rocking chair - who don their excuse for a football kit and enjoy the best 80 minutes of their week along with physical and mental benefits.

The rules of Walking Football are similar to 5-a-side, but with the aim of no tackling, no physical contact and no running to make it as safe as possible. Due to the pace of the game and because 3-touch is the adopted rule, players have to anticipate much more which makes it a thinking game as well.

Age UK is a massive supporter of the sport as it recognises how important the

social contact aspect is and it provides the opportunity to meet new people socially; especially at a time in their lives when social networks are shrinking. The physical benefits are obvious but do not be fooled into thinking it's a stroll in the park. Fitness tracker wearers who choose to put in a shift know it is easy to burn 800 or 900 calories in an 80-minute session.

This level of activity is not compulsory and players will find their own pace and must take it easy to start with to avoid injury.

Our sessions are held on the small MUGA between the old tennis courts and bowling club near Everyone Active.


