Bourn Windmill volunteers continue fundraising efforts

As you will know from previous articles the Bourn Windmill has been closed all year because it was deemed unsafe due to extensive decay found within the wooden supporting trestle.

Scaffolding was erected during the summer of 2020 to ensure the weight of the mill was taken off the trestle, but also supporting it from the sides to make it safe in high winds.

Although no remedial work was done this year, the mill volunteers have not been idle. There have been several visits from the appointed engineers and the charity Cambridge, Past, Present and Future (CPPF) to ascertain the best way



forward. As you can imagine, with a Grade 1 listed building everything has to be run past the regulatory body, Historic England and this takes time. CPPF are currently preparing a bid for a Heritage Lottery Grant and the volunteers have done their

bit, by hosting three groups for an in-depth explanation (externally) of the history and workings of the mill followed by afternoon tea taken in Kate Armstrong's delightful garden. Donations from these visits along with private donations have so far reached the incredible total of £10,000, which, with the emergency grant of £23,500 from Historic England covered the cost of the scaffolding and investigations.

To highlight the plight of the mill, there have been various interactions with the media, namely radio interviews and most recently, interviews and filming with Look East.

Along with various grants, a further £12,500 is now required from donations in order to pay for the restoration and repairs, so we can safely re-open the mill to the public again. Please give what you can to <u>www.cambridgeppf.org/Appeal/</u> <u>save-bourn-windmill-appeal</u>

Cambourne GP, Dr Rakesh Modi, wins research award

We are proud to have Dr Rakesh Modi working with Monkfield Medical Practice and celebrate with him having just received the RCGP/NIHR First5 Research award for his work on the SAFER trial. a programme of research investigating screening to detect atrial fibrillation, a heart condition responsible for 1 in 10 strokes.

The award scheme is organised by the Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP) and NIHR Clinical Research Network. It recognises outstanding general practitioners and their contributions to research.

The First5 Research award is for GPs who demonstrate an emerging interest and experience in delivering National Institute of Care Research/Clinical Research Network research within a primary care setting. Dr Modi won his award for his outstanding contributions to the SAFER atrial fibrillation research during the period from 1 January 2020 - 30 June 2021, an exceptionally challenging period.

Cambourne Nature Reserve: lakes and ponds

The lakes and ponds around Cambourne provide habitat and freshwater for many different species. Did you know there is such a thing as a water stick insect? They look a bit like a mantis and can grow to 5cm. They breathe underwater by using their bottom like a snorkel! Young dragonflies (nymphs) live under water and eat anything smaller than themselves, including fish and tadpoles. Part of their jaw can shoot out from their face to capture prey. The plants and freshwater invertebrates provide food for larger animals like toads and ducks.

Here are some ways to ensure the lakes around Cambourne stay healthy for wildlife:

Please keep dogs out of the water: they disturb wildlife and churn up silt. When silt settles in the water it covers underwater plants which reduces the oxygen levels in the water.

Watch the ducks and swans, but please don't feed them: adding nutrients to the water can reduce oxygen levels and cause water birds to become aggressive.

Please don't release fish or unwanted pets like terrapins into lakes and ponds. These affect the balance of predators and prey and reduce populations of our native species.

Many of the Trust's West Cambs Hundreds woodland reserves became very muddy over winter, which causes damage to sensitive plants on path edges. In order to ensure these woods



remain special for generations, the Trust will be restricting access during the winter and bluebell season. Please check our website for up-to-date information on reserve closures. www.wildlifebcn.org/nature-reserves

Have your say on plans for congestion charging

One of the key questions asked by the Greater Cambridge Partnership's 'Making

Connections' consultation is around congestion charging for vehicles entering Cambridge City. Since many residents of Cambourne work, shop or visit Cambridge on a regular basis this is an issue which affects the majority of people in Cambourne. In their plans, a city-centre congestion charge could cost up to £15 per day, or a wider zone could cost £5, roughly the same cost as a day rider bus ticket.

District and County Councillors in South Cambs have raised serious concerns about congestion

charging in the past, and I agree with their remarks around cost implications, business impact and inequality. Chief amongst those are worries that the charge is regressive, one that would unduly impact those less well off.

In my view, any charge would need to be introduced in tandem with much improved, far cheaper public transport.

However, I am very aware that many residents of South Cambridgeshire rely on transport links into Cambridge. It is therefore vital that I fully understand your views on this. 4. Give to others

This may be giving time, words, gifts or practical help. Whether volunteering regularly or small acts of kindness, giving to others is associated with an improvement in our own wellbeing.

5. Mindfulness

Pay attention to the present moment. Being aware of what is taking place in the present and enjoying 'the moment' is good for your wellbeing. Hope CIC: Environmentallyfriendly foodbank opens in Cambourne

The Cambourne Community Food Project is now open for users from 11am to 2pm every Wednesday, at the Hub community centre, supporting the community during the winter period. All South Cambridgeshire residents are welcome to access the foodbank, which will provide affordable food from as little as 25p, as well as free emergency food for those in crisis. In addition, further financial support and signposting to onward referrals, such as to Citizens Advice or South Cambridgeshire District Council's new Income Maximisation Officer, will be provided.

The Cambourne Community Food Project is run by Hope CIC (Community Interest Company) - an organisation that has run successful projects such as male support services, school projects, befriending services and supporting residents to access emergency food and other essential items - with support from South Cambridgeshire District Council, Cambourne Town Council and food donations from Morrisons Cambourne.

The pilot will initially run for a trial period of four months, and residents in the area are encouraged to use the service if they are in need. Cllr Bill Handley, South Cambridgeshire District Council's Lead Cabinet Member for Community Resilience, Health and Wellbeing, said: "It's fantastic to see what can happen when a team of dedicated individuals set their minds on caring for the community." Throughout the pandemic, Hope CIC has been supporting South Cambridgeshire residents and it's brilliant to see that the next stage of this support come to fruition, as the four-month pilot project launches.

Seema Achall, Community Champion at Morrisons, said: "It's an added bonus for the project that, through partnering with Morrisons in Cambourne, not only will good ambient food with 1+ year shelf life be provided, but also some fresh food that is still good quality that would otherwise end up in landfill can be used and appreciated while it is still nutritious and fresh."

Mahesh Hettiarchchi, Founder of Hope CIC, said: "Hope CIC was set up to support disadvantaged communities, in particular those who are in poverty and facing social isolation including those from BAME communities. The need for our project was identified through the volunteering work we undertook during the Covid crisis, such as delivering food parcels, collecting prescriptions and undertaking other home help activities for those who were isolated or shielding.





During the lockdowns we also managed to help local schools in Cambridge by providing laptops for students who did not have access to online learning.

"Our aim is to work with our local community to identify other needs they have and support them through these needs in the long term. The Vine sets up wellbeing room to support students' mental health





THE VINE INTER-CHURCH PRIMARY SCHOOL: The Vine Preschool has recently set up a new wellbeing room, and is enormously thankful to CMS Cambridge, the furniture division at Cambridge, design and fit-out specialist COEL, who donated a sofa, chairs and a storage unit as well as a soft cuddly fox.

The Good Plant Company also learnt about the project and supplied some stunning plants for the room.

The need for a wellbeing room for such young children has come from the impact of COVID and the restrictions that the lockdowns placed on them during their formative years.

Many of the children have missed out on fundamental social experiences, not visiting extended family, places such as a

beach, a zoo or even a cafe. Arriving at preschool for the first time amidst the hurly burly of many other little ones and no mummy or daddy to be seen can be overwhelming and it is hard for them to process.

Since children have returned we have noticed a demand for a quiet space, somewhere peaceful and calm.

We wanted to create a breakout area where children can re-centre themselves. The kids may come here on their own, with an assistant or a friend.

They are free to talk about their emotions and what they can do to cope with their feelings.

The room is deliberately kept clear of distracting or stimulating things such as games or activities. If a little one comes here it is to rest and restore and feel comforted; sitting peacefully, looking at a picture book or talking about how he or she feels with a helper.

We are already seeing the benefit of having the wellbeing room. Making the space comfy with appealing furniture and beautiful plants really helps calm the children down. They feel peaceful in this space and we have no doubt it will help facilitate an easier transition for the youngsters as they get used to a new environment.

The Vine school has a strong biblically rooted vision, which drives all aspects of our school life. Through supporting our pupils' mental wellbeing, we aim to 'let peace dwell here and the rooms be full of contentment.'

The five days' of Diwali is celebrated by the Hindu, Sikh, Jain and Buddhist (Nepal) communities around the world.

The festival of Diwali symbolises the victory of light over darkness, knowledge over ignorance, good over evil, and right over wrong. It signifies the opening of our own true light which sparkles within us. The communities ignite the oil lamps in their houses and exchanged sweets and gifts among the families in Cambourne. Many houses in Cambourne were seen decorated with the lights and rangoli designs.







One might have noticed that Diwali festival falls on different dates each year as it depends upon the position of the moon and Hindu Lunar Calendar.

Traditionally, families stay awake the whole night to keep replenishing ghee in the diyas for these to stay lit till the morning.

The Diwali festival celebrates Bhagwan (God) Shri Ram's returning home at Ayodhya along with his wife Sita ji and brother Lakshman ji, after exile of 14 years living as a Sanyasi (monk) culminating in the slaying of the evil demon king Ravan who had abducted Sita ji.

In Cambourne, on this evening, during a specific muhurat (auspicious period), people performed puja of Bhagwan Shri Ram, Sita ji, Lakshman ji, Devi Lakshmi (Goddess of wealth), Devi Kali and Bhagwan Shri Krishan. The children enjoyed fireworks and helping with making Rangoli - patterns drawn at the entrance and inside the home, using rice flour, colours, flowers and diyas.
