Exclusive: Anthony Browne MP talks to **Cambourne Crier**

In December, Cambourne Crier sat down for an exclusive interview with our local MP. Anthony Browne, and asked him for his views on issues affecting Cambourne and its residents

What led you to become an MP?

Being scientific and analytical I was offered a place at Trinity College in Cambridge to read Mathematics. I qualified three years later but despite having a plan to be a scientist and mathematician I found I had a wider interest in life than solely mathematics and initially followed a career path into business consultancy and then media and was a journalist for The Times, Observer and the BBC - including a spell at The Today Programme. I was very lucky in a lot of ways and have seen a lot of the world ranging from investigating global warming in the Arctic Ocean to the Iraq



Greenpeace Ship Rainbow Warrior.

I have always loved writing and appreciating new ideas and as I did more and more reporting about and around politics and saw how politics worked up close, I decided I would like to become an MP so I could do good for my constituents and for the country at large. There wasn't really a particular event or events, the situation just evolved.

A look back at 2021

Despite another challenging year a lot has happened and we would like to share some of the Town Council's biggest achievements:

■ Skatepark improvements: In Spring 2021 we received the good news that we had been awarded grant funding towards the skatepark refurbishment by Sport England and Amey Community Fund. At the end of May we started removing the old, unsafe ramps. The start date was delayed due to Coronavirus and availability of materials, but the refurbishment began in October and the contractor has worked efficiently to install the new ramps. We are looking to open the skatepark early this year and will hold an opening ceremony to celebrate completion of the work.



- Facilities: When the restrictions began to lift, we were pleased to reopen our community buildings and sports facilities and welcome back many groups and clubs to enjoy them again. We accommodated the Rapid Testing Centre in the Hub Community Centre from February to July 2021. They now run from the Lower Cambourne cricket pavilion three times a week to serve not only Cambourne but surrounding villages too.
- Youth Building: The main achievement is bringing forward the construction of the new youth building after we successfully obtained a loan from South Cambs District Council and a grant from Cambridgeshire County Council.

Work started on site in August 2021 and is on schedule to be completed by mid-February 2022. We look forward to working with Cambourne Youth Partnership and other youth organisations to extend the youth provision in Cambourne. The new building incorporates a large club room, music suite, quiet rooms, kitchen and a large activity hall.

- Cambourne Food Market: The Town Council hosted one of the first community events of 2021. Cambourne Food Market took place on a sunny bank holiday in May at the Great Cambourne cricket pavilion instead of the Hub car park. This allowed more space for people to sit out on the green and ensure social distancing could be followed. It proved to be a welcome opportunity for families, friends and neighbours to get together after a period of lockdown.
- Cambourne Community Fete: The Town Council's Cambourne Community Fete was hugely supported by residents, community groups and local businesses. It was a fantastic day filled with community spirit and we look forward to hosting an exciting community event next year.
- Light Up Cambourne: Every year we work closely with the volunteers of Light Up Cambourne, the Christmas lights committee. The Town Council grounds team spend about a month installing the Christmas lights and trees in Cambourne in time for the switch on event.

- Football Clubs: Since 2019 we have supported the football clubs with the formation of Cambourne Town FC. We were heavily involved in the organisation of the football tournament that took place over a weekend in September 2021.
- Volunteering: The Town Council has continued to support volunteers and groups in 2021. We continued to support Cambourne Volunteer Task Force as required, particularly during lockdown when demand for food parcels and collection of prescriptions was high.
- Community Litter Pick: In June we organised a community litter pick to coincide with the Great British Spring Clean and over 50 volunteers came along to join in and help clean up Cambourne.
- The Cambourne Food Project: We have also supported a Cambourne resident with the launch of the Cambourne Food Project a community shop that opens on Wednesdays at the Hub Community Centre run by Hope CIC. The shop is available for anyone in the South Cambs area to use. The community shop offers affordable priced food and essential products but can offer parcels for free as required.

We take this opportunity to thank the many volunteers in Cambourne for all their hard work supporting the Town Council voluntary groups and residents within the Town.

■ Councillors and Staff: In February we welcomed Cllr Stephen Drew to the Town Council. In October, Owen Baker joined the Town Council office team as Football Development Officer.

Morgan Groves joined the Town Council grounds maintenance team as an apprentice. Dave Lawrence left the grounds maintenance team in November to begin his retirement. The Town Council wish him an enjoyable retirement and thank him for his hard work with us since 2017.

- Volunteers Fair: We will be hosting the Volunteers Fair again which will take place on Saturday 22nd January 2022 in the Main Hall of the Hub Community Centre between 11am and 1pm. 

Cambourne's Volunteer Task Force: Continuing to serve the community

CVTF has been serving the local community since the very start of the pandemic. We are a broad group of local volunteers backed by Cambourne Crescent, a local Muslim Charity. CVTF has provided support to the community in a variety of ways.

This includes delivering food parcels to struggling families, helping with grocery shopping (especially during the lockdown days when supermarkets could not fulfil the demand for home deliveries), collection and delivery of medicines for vulnerable or self-isolating, providing a point of contact for people feeling lonely/isolated, supporting other charities through delivery of supplies donated to us in excess of the need, driving people for vaccination appointments etc.

We had, in the past, operated our food bank activity through provision of weekly food parcels that could be collected or delivered.

Thanks to a return to relative normalcy and reduced demand, we moved to an on-demand shop-and-drop operating model for the food parcels. We have responded to a steady number of requests since. Some of these were referred to us by the Town Council or other public agencies while others have come to us directly from people in need of help.



Unlike the typical food bank model of supplying long-life items, we have been supplying food parcels containing typical items that are part of a weekly shopping, including fresh milk, bread, eggs, fruits and vegetables. This has worked well especially with the demand not going back to the soaring levels as in the earlier days of the pandemic. We are also pleased to mention that there have been very few repeat requests from the same recipients which is an indicator to us that our service is being used in the right way ie, a service for short-term help.

CERC registers for ESA CanSat Space Competition

The children of Cambourne are going ahead for the first time in the European CanSat competition which is organised by the European Space Agency (ESA) through the Cambourne Electronics and Robotics Club (CERC). The team is made up of four to six secondary school students, aged 13-19 years old.

The European CanSat Competition is an ESA Education project that promotes STEM literacy amongst young European students through project-based learning. A CanSat is a simulation of a real satellite, integrated within the volume and shape of a soft drink can. The team's challenge is to fit all the major subsystems of a satellite inside this minimal volume, launched by a small rocket.

The mentor of the club, Dr Sujit Bhattacharya, remarked that the CERC team participation will offer a unique opportunity for the

participants to have a first practical experience of a real spacerelated project. The students will be responsible for all the aspects: designing the CanSat, selecting its mission, integrating the components, testing, preparing launch and then analysing the data.

The founder of the club, Dr Shrobona Bhattacharya, wished the team all the success and is confident that the team will achieve all the mission objectives and the participants with their experience will inspire more students in the future to participate in such STEM-related activities.

A happy New Year to all

I recently visited The Vine Inter-Church
Primary School in Cambourne to present an
award to the winner of the Christmas Card
competition, Lydia, who at only 6 years old,
entered this year's competition to design a card
for South Cambridgeshire at Christmas.

Lydia's design of a festive-themed Wimpole Hall saw off stiff competition to take the top prize. I was delighted to present Lydia with a certificate signed by the Prime Minister, who was pictured with her winning design, alongside a Houses of Parliament Teddy Bear. She received a photograph of the Prime Minister with her card and Lydia and her class have also been invited to visit the Houses of Parliament in the New Year.

Last month, I launched a congestion charging

survey following the Greater Cambridge
Partnership's (GCP) 'Making Connections'
consultation, which proposed differing levels of
congestion charging for vehicles entering
Cambridge City. More than 1,800 people
responded to the survey and over 100 of those
came from Cambourne. The results showed over
80 per cent of respondents do not currently
support congestion charges, with just 10 per cent
in favour - a ratio of 8:1 against.

Given this result, and my own deep concerns about the unfairness to key workers on low incomes and the inherent problems in implementing such a scheme, I cannot support charging at this time. I am now convinced that congestion charging would split our community in two, this was borne out by many of the comments I received, many from Cambourne residents.

Keeping Cambourne safe in the New Year

May I take this opportunity to wish everyone in Cambourne a Happy New Year 2022.

A safety issue was raised by the Headteacher of Cambourne Village College and I visited the college along with members of Cambourne Town Council and the County Council to introduce more road signage at Swansley Lane and having a special cycle route to reduce risk and increase safety for children.

I also initiated the discussion to introduce the refilling of the food and cleaning materials at the local Council meeting and other community groups which helps less plastic packaging.

I also found that we are still using cash in our

local library to buy the greetings cards or to access the library facilities, I therefore requested that the local council introduce a card reader instead of using cash during the pandemic.

I am also happy to assist residents with various community activities (mainly outdoors and following social distancing) that includes art, heritage, science, technology, food, fundraising, sports, festivals and fairs. Anyone aged 13 – 24 are welcome to volunteer for the Duke of Edinburgh at Bronze, Silver or Gold level for giving back to the community and learning a new skill through these activities.

Coeliac disease

Coeliac disease is neither an allergy nor a food intolerance but is an autoimmune condition. In someone with coeliac disease, gluten (found in wheat, barley and rye) causes the body's immune system to attack its own cells leading to damage to the small intestine. This can stop it working normally and means the intestine stops absorbing nutrients from food properly. As a result, anaemia (low iron) or low levels of other nutrients may develop.

This can also cause weight loss (although not always) or poor growth in children. Coeliac disease occurs in around 1 in 100 people but is more common in those with family members who

are affected. It can develop in childhood or adulthood.

Other symptoms include gut problems, tiredness, headaches, mouth ulcers and skin problems, but also may not cause any symptoms at all. Coeliac disease can be checked (while gluten is still in the diet) with a blood test and may also require an endoscopy. Those who have coeliac disease must follow a lifelong gluten free diet. Eating even tiny amounts of gluten can cause severe symptoms and there are risks of long term health issues; therefore using separate chopping boards and utensils is necessary.

The good news is that once a gluten free diet is followed, symptoms are likely to disappear.

We are all becoming increasingly aware of the importance of supporting young people's mental and emotional health and wellbeing, not least because of the additional stresses that the last couple of years have had. Through the work of Cambourne Youth Partnership and Romsey Mill, youth workers are regularly providing wellbeing interventions with young people in Cambourne, from having supportive conversations with those with low level needs to providing more intensive one-to-one work alongside professional mental health involvement.


As part of our focus on developing this work, we are delighted to be partnering with Cambourne Church to launch a new youth wellbeing café. The café will be open from 3.30-5pm every Friday in term time in the Church Annexe, starting on Friday 14th January. Any young person aged 11-17 is welcome to come along, either to pop in during it or stay for the whole time. There will be healthy snacks on offer, along with a variety of spaces such as conversation tables, chill out zone and a creative area. Different themes will be explored each week with invited guests coming along to share their experiences and skills around wellbeing. Youth workers and volunteers will be available to talk to anyone who would like to have a chat and support with further signposting if that is helpful.

The youth café will be free to attend (including refreshments) thanks to the generous support of Monkfield Medical Practice who have secured funding to enable us to run the group.

I am really pleased to be the representative for South Cambs because I was born in my constituency, my school and my university are in my constituency and I'm especially proud of being the MP for Addenbrookes Hospital, which actually saved my life when I was a teenager.

What do you think when you visit Cambourne?

I particularly appreciate the architectural styles around Cambourne, there is such a wide range of different housing which all fit together well. This contrasts with other developments where all of the houses are the same. Cambourne has character. I also like the curvature of the streets, meaning it is not all long straight boulevards - but you do sometimes end up where you started! What is also good is that all of the pavements are pedestrian friendly and the whole town is cycle friendly, which in turn helps the environment and quality of life.

What do you think about developing the High Street in Cambourne?

You need a town centre which has character, rather than somewhere that is just glass and steel and tall buildings which don't really have any soul.

Cambourne needs a High Street which is more human scaled and lifts the spirits,

somewhere that you go and think, enjoy and appreciate. This town has a nice feeling about it, there is obviously a space in Cambourne for a High Street and currently there is not a lot there apart from grass. We want a High Street that brings joy to the hearts of the people in Cambourne rather than a High Street that depresses the spirits and I will keep pushing for that positive outcome.

How can you assist as our MP?

As an MP I respond to what people write to me about. For example, with planning issues I have influence but I am not the decision maker. With regard to the High Street development this is a decision for South Cambs District Council since they decide what gets built and what doesn't get built, however don't let this deter you from getting in touch because I can certainly express my views like I have with a number of other developments in the region.

With all issues, elected representatives care about public opinion and the more people who express a particular opinion the more politicians listen. So the more people who contact me about an issue,



the more leverage I can give it, since I can state that it affects a significant number of people.

However, people can also help the situation by writing to South Cambs District Council (or whatever is the appropriate authority for the issue in question), set up campaign groups, Facebook or social media pages, write to local media or start petitions to get their point across and be noticed.

In short, politicians do listen to public opinion or they don't get elected again. It is difficult to exert influence when there is a lone voice, but when enough people express an opinion, politicians can exert influence based on that public sway of opinion. That is the joy of democracy.

Should a swimming pool be built in Cambourne?

A particular issue I'd like to hear about is swimming pools. I am aware that was a high priority in the Cambourne Town Council Parish Plan and Cambourne does not currently have a swimming pool, yet Melbourne does. There are various debates about where a pool could be situated, however this is something that I would be happy to support, along with more facilities for teenagers in Cambourne.

What current issues do you feel strongly about?

I am very keen that local people have more say and more control over what happens in their area, particularly developments in their vicinity. What is clear to me is that many people get angry about developments which affect them but over which they have little or no control.

Will East-West Rail be good for Cambourne?

I think East West Rail is good for Cambourne. Cambourne can be singled out as an area which is keen for East West Rail to proceed. It would help commuters

immensely who need to work in
Cambridge or even commute to London.
The journey from Cambourne to the
Biomedical Campus would only take about
10 minutes, which would be amazing. I
have also been pushing for the station to
be situated in North Cambourne.

Cambourne is typical of a lot of areas where there has been a significant population growth and public transport has not kept pace. I am also aware that the bus routes have not changed following the expansion of Cambourne with the people in Upper Cambourne sometimes having a 20 minute walk to get to a bus stop.

Tell us about your support for Biomedical Research

I know many people in Cambourne work in the area of biomedical research and what is happening in these companies is incredibly exciting and cutting edge, it really is world leading and in some cases it actually sounds like science fiction. The future is being created here and now. We really are advancing so quickly that in 10 years time we will look back at medicine in the year 2000 like we look at medicine in the Middle Ages. I am Vice-Chair of the All Party Parliamentary Group on Life Sciences and spend a lot of time talking to the Government about this subject and I am very supportive of this very important sector.

What are your opinions about diversity in Cambourne?

Cambourne is a very good example of people living together from different ethnicities and backgrounds in harmony and just getting on with their lives. I am delighted to say as an MP I have had no complaints at all regarding problems relating to diversity. It could be that Cambourne can be held up as a model for other new towns to follow in this area.

Do you have a New Year message to the people of Cambourne?

I know it has been a difficult couple of years, but I am confident that next year will be much better, with a return to normality with confidence. Hopefully everyone will be able to live the life they want to live. **Happy New Year!**

ANTHONY BROWNE was born in Cambridge and brought up on a farm near to Cambourne in the village of Fowlmere, where his parents grew wheat and potatoes as well as rearing chickens. "I always wished I could have been able to drive the tractor, but never did manage it!" he said. Anthony attended Milton Road Primary School followed by Fowlmere Primary School where he was lucky enough to win a scholarship to Perse School - one of only two available at that time - and then to Hills Road 6th Form college.

In fact, the biodiversity figure for Cambourne is about 40 per cent, which is much higher than most developments and something to be proud of. It is a living model for other developments who want to give access to nature and I have made that point on a number of occasions to DEFRA and the Department for Housing (now DLUHC).

Home Educators take advantage of the warm weather to indulge in some tree planting

EDUCATING OTHERWISE: We were blessed with blue skies and sunshine for our tree planting event on Monday 22nd November 2021 - a partnership between Cambourne Home Educators and Cambourne Town Council, with free trees from the Woodland Trust.

We had great fun creating a small new wood next to Great Cambourne Cricket Pavilion. The land is currently owned by developer MCA and managed by Randall Thorpe, who gave permission for the planting. Soon the land will be adopted by Cambourne Town Council and the Grounds Team will look after the trees

We planted 135 saplings of a variety of species including hazel, crab apple, downy birch, hawthorn and goat willow, which will produce leaves, pollen, fruits and seeds as food for caterpillars, butterflies, bees, aphids, other insects, birds and mammals such as mice, voles, foxes and badgers. Larger trees will provide



nesting sites and shelter for birds and small mammals such as wood mice and habitats for mosses, liverworts, lichens and fungi. The trees will also absorb air pollution and carbon dioxide which affect our climate.

"This wood will create an important wildlife corridor by linking up the patches of woodland either side," said Warren, Head Groundsman from Cambourne Town Council, who prepared the land beforehand and joined us planting trees with his colleague Chris.

It'll be amazing to watch these trees grow over the years and know that we all did something positive for Cambourne wildlife and our planet. Thank you very much to everyone involved!


