Cancellation of Volunteer Fair

Unfortunately, we made the decision to cancel the event at the Hub on 22nd January and instead made the event virtual. All the information from groups that were going to attend has been collated on the Town Council website. From the homepage you can find this under the Community tab and then click Volunteers Fair. Listed here are all the current volunteering opportunities in and near to Cambourne with links to organisations website, social media handle and contact details. If you are interested in volunteering this year, please have a read and find out which organisations need some helping hands this year. Many organisations rely on volunteers in order to keep going, so if you do have some spare time to help a group out, please contact them directly.

Budget 2022 – 2023

Cambourne Town Council has to consider the budget for the next financial year and submit it to the District Council at the end of January each year. This is a challenging process as Cambourne continues to grow and the Council always strives to maintain or improve the services it provides to the residents of Cambourne.

This has been even harder this year due to the further effects of COVID-19. The Council has had to close some of its facilities throughout most of the year and this has meant there had been a deficit in income and there was no funding available from South Cambs District Council or from central government.

When considering the budget for 2022 to 2023, it became apparent that if the

Council wanted to maintain the current service level and budget for inflation, additional funds for the replacement of the play equipment and surfaces in the oldest play areas; resurfacing of the MUGA; contribution to the final funding for a 20mph speed limit in Cambourne; take account of the deficit over the last financial year and potential reduced income in 2022-2023, the Council would have to look at increasing the current Band D.

The budget also includes the construction of the Youth Building and the first floor of The Hub - these are funded by grants and s106 monies that have to be spent on these projects or be refunded to the developer or grant-making body.

After reviewing the above, the council has had to increase the Band D point by 3% to £146.50 - an increase of £4.27 per year (35.5p/month). Therefore, Cambourne Town Council will be levying a precept of £582,895 on South Cambs District Council.

Setting the Band D rate at £146.50 will allow the Town Council to continue to maintain and improve the level of service it provides for the community.







## **Cambourne Nature Reserve: Wildlife Trust** A Wild Thank You to all Volunteers

The Wildlife Trust BCN have been trialling work parties on Cambourne Nature Reserve and we want to extend a huge thankyou to volunteers who have come along to help. So far, the tasks have included: cutting back overhanging vegetation near Oaks Wood, removing fly-tipped rubbish, carrying out footpath maintenance on Crow Hill, and improving habitat for wetland birds by removing scrub around Whomping Willow Lake. These work parties have encouraged people to step forward to be rangers, so there are now more volunteers reporting problems, recording wildlife and litter-picking.

If you are interested in joining the work party at Cambourne the next one is Saturday 12th February. Feel free to contact me about other volunteer opportunities including Bourn toad patrol.

The Wild in the Woods family session is on the Wednesday during half term, and these sessions will continue throughout the year during school holidays - we'll be looking for signs of Spring on Cambourne rature reserve, and hope to spot blackthorn flowers and willow catkins, hawthorn and elder leaves in the hedges, and hear resident birds like blackbirds, chaffinches and yellow hammers singing their territorial songs. There might even be a great spotted woodpecker drumming in the woods.

On our nearby woodland sites you might see bluebell, primrose and oxlip leaves coming up; conditions will be very muddy, so do take wellies, and stick to the middle of paths to avoid trampling plants and compacting soil on the edges. Some reserves have restricted access in winter, so visit our website before you go: www.wildlifebcn.org/explore/reserve-updates

## Latest Covid Support Grants for Businesses

## South Cambridgeshire businesses can now apply for the latest COVID Government support grants via the District Council.

Applications are now open for the latest grant schemes to be administered by South Cambridgeshire District Council.

The first is the Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant (OHLG). The second is further funding available via the Additional Restrictions Grant (ARG). Full eligibility criteria, and online application forms, can be found on South Cambridgeshire District Council's website at <u>www.scambs.gov.uk/omicron-grants</u> **The Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant (OHLG)** 

The OHLG is targeted at businesses within the hospitality and leisure sector which were trading as registered Business Rates payers in South Cambridgeshire on 30 December 2021. These businesses could be eligible for a one-off payment because the rise of the Omicron variant led to severe impacts on their industry.

Grants of up to £6,000 are available, depending on the rateable value of each business. Businesses in hospitality, leisure and tourism accommodation sectors, who offer in-person services (like food and drink, experiences and lodging for holiday purposes) are being encouraged to check the full eligibility criteria online to see whether they are eligible to apply. Eligible businesses should apply for these grants by 18 February 2022. Payments will be made by 31 March 2022.

#### **Additional Restrictions Grant**

The Council has decided to make best use of the ARG funding from Government by providing support to eligible businesses that do not have a rateable value, and/or are ineligible to receive the OHLG, but nonetheless operate in the supply chain to businesses in the hospitality, leisure and accommodation sectors. Businesses eligible to apply for the ARG should operate within:

Hospitality, leisure, accommodation, personal care, the travel and tourism sector including group travel, travel agents and tour operators, coach operators, wedding industries, nightclubs, theatres, events industries, wholesalers, English language schools, breweries, freelance and mobile businesses (including caterers, events, hair, beauty and wedding related) gyms, and other businesses that may not have received other grant funding.

Grants of up to £10,000 will be provided under the ARG, depending on turnover, fixed costs, number of employees and the scale of loses due to Omicron. Full eligibility criteria and an online application form can be found at <u>www.scambs.gov.uk/omicron-grants</u> and applications should be made 18 February 2022. Final payments will be made by 31 March 2022.

Since the start of the pandemic, the District Council has distributed a total of around £45million in Government business support grants to more than 5,000 South Cambridgeshire businesses. ## Lung cancer and its symptoms

Lung cancer is one of the most common types of cancer in the UK affecting around 47,000 people every year.

In some cases cancer can spread to the lungs from another place in the body and is known as 'secondary' lung cancer.

Cancer that begins in the lungs is called 'primary' lung cancer. There are two main forms of primary lung cancer depending on the type of cells in which the cancer starts growing. Nonsmall-cell lung cancer is the most common form; small-cell lung cancer is much less common. The type of lung cancer will make a difference to which treatments are suggested. Lung cancer mainly affects older people and is rare in people younger than 40. Although people who have never smoked can develop lung cancer, smoking is the most common cause and related to nearly three-quarters of cases.

Unfortunately it is can be difficult to detect lung cancer early as the symptoms can take a while to develop. The most common signs and symptoms are a persistent cough (for more than three weeks); coughing up blood; persistent breathlessness; unexplained tiredness or weight loss or an ache or pain when breathing or coughing. As with all cancers, the earlier lung cancer is detected the better. Although there may be other causes of symptoms, it is really important to speak with a GP and get checked out.

## **Educating Otherwise**

In a recent conversation with my home-schooled child, he enquired as to how long he needs to be in education as he has already passed the general level and is halfway through his intermediate level in the curriculum we have chosen.

I was able to inform him of the legal requirements as he is still quite young (13). He wanted to focus next year a little more on practical skills and in reality that is a good thing as that is often neglected in modern education.

Since leaving secondary school many years ago I was never in my adult life questioned about the urban renewal around the London docklands, but I have had to change tyres on a car and level paving slabs. A general education is good as a base from which to develop and grow but this should not be to the detriment of life skills.

When I went to college I found students there who did not know how to use a washing machine, or cook, or clean a bathroom. They were never taught and floundered when faced with real life. Many did not know about bank accounts or keeping receipts for taxes. Even the use of basic tools like hammers, saws and drills were beyond them. I think there is merit to the old fashioned delegation of chores as it teaches valuable skills in home management. Now in some schools, in some places, these are taught.

In many Japanese schools the students do the cleaning as well as some of the catering. What is really interesting is that for the first few years the main focus is not on academics but character.

Individual responsibility, morality and duty and such are an essential base for a person to grow. I felt it was important for my child to know how to do the basic things of life in case we could not help them - like if we were sick. He can go shopping, cook his food, do his laundry, wash his plates and put the bins out on time. Now I did not say he liked it (he is still a teenager!). It may not seem like much but in some situations that knowledge and experience will prevent panic and floundering and furthermore can be essential in helping others. As a home educator you are not just filling up a vessel with knowledge but shaping a person and helping to equip them for real life. Ask yourself what knowledge, skills or principles have made the most difference in your life? Pass that on with passion and they might just remember it.

## **Team CERC** wins a place in **FIRST LEGO** national finals

January saw the return of the IET FIRST® LEGO® League Challenge Cambridge tournament, a STEM competition sponsored by FIRST®, an organisation that Qualcomm Incorporated provides funding for, which invited 18 teams of young local people, aged 9-16, to take part in a range of robotics-themed challenges.

Following months of preparation, students joined a series of online judging sessions during the day-long virtual event. Teams competed with a LEGO robot which they had designed, built and programmed to autonomously complete as many missions as possible on a LEGO playing field, all within the 2.5-minute Robot Game. Teams were also tasked



with completing an Innovation Project, which, this year, involved identifying a problem linked to transportation.

Team CERC, the Cambourne Electronics and Robotics Club, were crowned overall victors of the tournament and were presented with the Champions' Award, securing a place in the national finals, which will be hosted by the IET on Saturday 26th February. Runners up, team RealTechBot, will also proceed to the national finals.

Other prizes on the day went to RealTechBot, who scored the most points during the Robot Game.

In addition to being judged on the performance of their robots during the Robot Game, each team was assessed on



the strategy and computer science skills that were behind their robot's design. Team WUS BOTS from Westminster Under School took home the Robot Design prize.

Cambridge the Pizza Robot triumphed in the Innovation Project category, which this year explored the future of transport.

Throughout the FIRST® LEGO® League challenge, teams are encouraged to demonstrate the FIRST® signature set of Core Values which celebrate discovery, innovation, impact, inclusion, teamwork and fun. FIRST® LEGO® League is a global science and technology challenge which sees almost 680,000 young people (across 110 countries) unite to build their STEM skills every year.


# CTFC is hosting weekly goalkeeper sessions
