■ Road closures and traffic control for Cambourne 10K

The Cambourne 10K Run will take place on Sunday 10th April with an earlier race start time of 9.30am. School Lane (entrance/exit of Lower Cambourne) will be closed from 9am for the duration of the race so that runners can safely cross. The diversion will be in place to enter Cambourne from the main entrance along the A428.

Beaufort Road will not be closed; however it will be marshalled to allow runners to safely cross so please expect delays.

■ Cambourne cemetery opens area for Muslim burials

At a recent Council meeting, it was agreed to open a section of Cambourne Cemetery for Muslim burials. The Council sought guidance from Cambourne Crescent and other local cemetery managers: The grave should be perpendicular to Mecca, with the deceased's body positioned so their right side faces the Islamic holy city.

This means the layout of graves is slightly angled. The cemetery is currently laid out with graves facing East. The graves will be laid out facing North-orth-ast.

Update on pub development

Following the opening of the new Holiday Inn Express hotel, we contacted McMullens for an update on the development of the new public house which will be adjacent to the hotel. A representative said: "We are currently finishing off five sites that were delayed in the last 24 months and then we will make the call on Cambourne, the last new build site opens in March. The build costs have risen dramatically, coupled with a trebling of utility costs and the high build spec requested during planning the finances are going to be a big hurdle to overcome but we hope to find a solution."

Wildlife Trust April 2022

Did you know that on the doorstep there's easy access to one of the most amazing wildlife spectacles in England? The UK has nearly half the world's population of common bluebells, and in

population of common bluebells, and in Cambridgeshire they grow in great density creating amazing displays in ancient woodlands, so it's important to look after the places where they are found.

Bluebells are not immune to the impacts of climate change and habitat destruction. Protecting ancient woodlands is a top priority for the Trust, enabling wildlife to thrive and ensuring people can continue to enjoy this spectacle. Various challenges - milder, wetter winters have led to muddy conditions underfoot, and path encroachment causes damage to plant life.

Our native bluebells are also at risk of hybridising the Spanish bluebell and to add to this, visitors to nature reserves sometimes illegally harvest bulbs. Here are ways you can help: Please do not pick



bluebells - they are a protected species and it's an offence to pick the flowers or dig up the bulbs. Please stay on official paths when visiting nature reserves. It's easy to compact soil without realising, making it harder for shoots to push through, or for roots and bulbs to access oxygen. In early spring damage to leaves reduces the energy they store for next year, damaging flowers reduces food for bees and other pollinators.

Please buy any bulbs from a reputable source, and buy common (English) bluebell, rather than Spanish bluebell It's tricky to predict when bluebells will be at their best, but it is usually mid to late April. The Wildlife Trust in Cambridgeshire



will be running spring flower guided walks in Gamlingay Wood and Waresley & Gransden Woods, as well at other woods in the region, bookable via the website: staff members will be present during the walks weekends. Some bluebells can be seen on Cambourne Nature Reserve on the northern boundary parallel to the A428.

At some nature reserves parking can be busy, restricted or not available, so please check the website page, 'know before you go' before you visit, and park respectfully. www.wildlifebcn.org/explore/reserve-updates www.wildlifebcn.org/bluebells

The Chief Rabbi of Ukraine has asked Christians to read aloud Psalm 31 in an act of solidarity with the people of that nation. I have been doing so, and by the time you read these words that unfolding war will have developed in ways I cannot now foresee.

More lies will have been told. More people will have been displaced. More blood will have been shed. And the ancient poetry of the psalms will remain relevant.

"Set me free from the trap they set for me." (Psalm 31 v.4) "LORD, have mercy, because I am in misery. My eyes are weak from so much crying, and my whole being is tired from grief." (Psalm 31 v.9)

"All you who put your hope in the LORD be strong and brave." (Psalm 31 v.24)

In this suffering world Christians look to Jesus. He did not sidestep the pain of human existence, but rather embraced it all the way to the cross. He was executed by crucifixion with the poetry of the psalms on his lips. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Psalm 22 v.1)

But evil, suffering and pain did not have the final word. Easter is the basis for our hope that, as Jesus defeated death itself, in the end Life and Love win - not because of anything we have done, but because of what God has done for us in Jesus.

May you know the surprising hope and joy of Easter this year. God bless.

I am horrified by the Russian invasion of Ukraine. I have been particularly moved by the stories I have heard from constituents of Ukrainian origin and with Ukrainian family.

I will continue my support for strong sanction and as open a refugee policy as possible. I have also been inspired by the tremendous response from the people of South Cambridgeshire to this crisis. I am proud to see so many collection points popping up across the constituency.

As ever, the people of South Cambridgeshire have shown themselves to be remarkably generous and warm-hearted. I have been clear with the Prime Minister that we must do what we can to provide aid for refugees from Ukraine and I

know this sentiment is shared across South Cambridgeshire.

I did spend one good morning early last month speaking to residents of Cambourne with our three candidates in May's District Council elections. As ever, my doorstep conversations were dominated by the discission over the lack of a High Street, the need for leisure facilities such as a swimming pool, and the lack of a cycle way into Cambridge. Cambourne, the only town in my constituency, truly needs better facilities for young people, and I understand a swimming pool is promised as part of the building of Cambourne West. I would be delighted to hear more from residents on this.

New minibus for Cambourne community

I am overjoyed to say that I have secured funding for a new 17-seater minibus for use in the Cambourne community.

I attended a Cambourne community support partnership meeting and explained that Cambourne Community Minibus will serve all aspects of the community, especially the elderly and the youth of Cambourne.

The nearest bus stops in Cambourne should be accessible within half a mile. I have invited the Stagecoach directors for a site visit to assess and propose new bus stops in areas where residents walk longer distances to reach a bus stop.

I met the young people at CYP (Cambourne Youth Partnership) to talk to them one-to-one

along with the young leaders and organised a special meeting with the Town Council. This will ensure the young community are being heard and feel included during the new Soul Building phase.

I also have started discussing with the Town Council and CYP's current leads for extensive activities that we can start together for the youth and children of Cambourne.

I have started running outdoor and in-person events again. People joyfully used the green areas of Cambourne for the kite festival, pancake race and Holi festival of colours. Indoor events on arts and paintings and International Women's Day also brought people together.

I was invited to Cambourne Beaver scouts to explain about the Holi festival at the Cambourne Church where I met the children and scout leaders in an interactive session.

I enjoy and love working for Cambourne.

World Parkinson's Day

Parkinson's Disease is a condition caused by loss of the nerve cells in the brain which make a chemical called dopamine.

It is not clear what causes this to happen but as a result some symptoms are related to movement; most commonly, a tremor (shaking), slowness of movement and rigidity (muscle stiffness). The condition can make it difficult to move around normally and affect fine movements such as handwriting, along with affecting speech, swallowing and facial expression. Sleep and mood may also be affected.

Parkinson's occurs in adults of any age,

affecting around 145,000 people in the UK and everyone's experience is unique. Treatment is usually a combination of medication, support from physical therapists and exercise. There is evidence that exercise plays a significant part in managing Parkinson's, whether for general wellbeing such as walking, joining an exercise class or strengthening or balance exercises.

Parkinson's is a progressive condition and the focus is about managing symptoms. Although there is no cure at the moment, there is considerable research to find better ways to improve symptoms and support people to live with Parkinson's.



MONKFIELD PARK: Over the past two years it's become apparent how important children's mental health and wellbeing are in achieving better learning outcomes and future happiness. With this in mind we abandoned our usual curriculum to give pupils the opportunity to participate in a wellbeing day.



They were able to select from a range of therapeutic, calming and instructional workshops in addition to physical activities across the two days. 



TeamCERC reached the nationals for four consecutive years after being crowned Cambridgeshire champions. The students showcased their skills in robotics, computer programming, teamwork,




