Respect Cambourne's open spaces and facilities



CAMBOURNE TOWN COUNCIL: As the days get longer and weather gets warmer, we would like to remind residents to respect the open spaces and facilities in Cambourne. In recent weeks, we have had almost daily reports of increases in dog poo being left, needless vandalism and litter.

We urge residents to report any vandalism or anti-social behaviour to the Police by calling 101 or completing the online report form www.cambs.police.uk, or calling 999 if it is an emergency.

There are more than 50 bins situated around Cambourne that are emptied regularly. Please pick up after your dog and dispose of in the bins provided. Bags hanging from hedges is harmful to wildlife and dog poo can be harmful to human health too.

Disposable barbecues can be used on open spaces such as Great Cambourne green, Upper Cambourne green or Eco Park green. Users must ensure the grass is protected by raising barbecues off the ground. They must not be used on football or cricket pitches and must be fully extinguished before being put into a bin. No barbecues should be used in the country park, near the lakes or in wooded areas.

The Countryside Code

- Protect the Environment

Take your litter home - Leave no trace of your visit. Take care with BBQS (where permitted). Do not light fires. Always keep dogs under control and in sight. Dog poobag it and bin it, any public waste bin will do. Care for nature - do not cause damage or disturbance.

Note from the editor

It was not an isolated occurence and there have been other serious incidents recently.

Please take the time to explain to your children that vandalism, starting fires and throwing rocks at cars are not a lark or a good laugh but criminal acts.

If you are over 10 in the UK, according to the crown prosecution website, "Children between 10 and 17 can be arrested and taken to court if they commit a crime."

Even if they go to court and the case is discharged - regardless if it is absolute or conditional - according to the sentencing council the child could still bear a criminal record. Should a fine be imposed for a child aged under 16, the parent or guardian is responsible for payment.

As a community we must all respect and protect the open areas and the facilities we are lucky to have.

■ No Mow May

The Council will be participating in No Mow May for verges and some open spaces (not including village greens, play areas or sports pitches) which has been encouraged by Taylor Wimpey, Vistry and Cambridgeshire County Council who contract us to cut the grass. No Mow May is a scheme promoted by bodies such as National Trust and is promoted by Plantlife; the campaign encourages to not cut the grass in May in order to create habitat for invertebrates. This also increases nectar availability for pollinators.

The benefits from a 2019 survey: Over 200 species of flowers were found on lawns; the top three lawn flowers were daisy, white clover and selfheal.

Plantlife created the National Nectar Score - all lawn flowers included in the survey produced a combined 23kg of nectar sugar per day, colossal! This is enough to support 2.1 million honey bees - or around 60,000 hives. 80% of lawns involved in the survey were found to support the equivalent of around 400 bees



a day. 20% were considered "superlawns" - these could support up 10 times as many

Good News for Bourn Windmill

"I bring good news!", says Graham Bruce, a Cambridge Past Present & Future volunteer who helps maintain Bourn Windmill.

"Firstly, following a dendrochronology analysis of Bourn Windmill, we can now definitively state that it is the oldest post mill in the country! The central oak post has been dated as being a tree felled during the first half of the sixteenth century. That means the mill could have been built before 1550, when Henry VIII was King (1509-1547)."

"Secondly, work will commence on replacing the decayed trestle beams at the end of May. This will take around four months and will be done using French oak that has been air dried for a minimum of four years."

This restoration has been made possible through a grant of £149k from The Heritage Lottery Fund and £54k from Historic England. The Heritage Lottery Grant also enables CPPF to provide new signs, two walking trails, renewed interpretation boards and a descriptive video.

At the start of the project, an amazing £20k was raised from public donations along with a grant of £23.5k that enabled the mill to be made safe and for the investigative work to begin. CPPF still needs to raise a further £10k from public donations to complete the project.

The last time the trestle was replaced was in 1874 so, if you'd like to help preserve this wonderful monument of industrial heritage for a further 150 years, then please donate what you can to:

Fuel and homes for Ukraine in Cambourne

Local issues are never far from my mind. Two jump out from the many that constituents raise with me – fuel and homes for Ukraine.

My team is working hard to support residents who are giving space to refugees, but I share their concerns with the timings and information flow from the Home Office. I have raised the matter repeatedly, including writing a letter to the Home Secretary setting out feedback that I have heard from residents, and will keep everyone updated.

I am glad to see the unacceptable fuel shortages, that caused understandable anguish across South Cambridgeshire, have now largely abated. I was aware that Cambourne Morrisons and most nearby stations ran out, and brought this issue repeatedly to ministers. I was glad to see the police cracking down on the fanatics who are trying to close down the oil terminals. I am strongly committed to tackling climate change, but they are undermining public support.

Lastly, I hear regularly from residents about youth facilities for Cambourne – they will be as pleased as I am with the progress on opening the new youth building, Cambourne Soul. It will make a huge difference to young people in the area. They are at the heart of the process, with open days being held to consult them on what they want. The building is hugely impressive - large, versatile and even carbon friendly.

I'll keep pushing for more, including a high street and a swimming pool, but it's fantastic to see something like this!

Cambourne Youth Partnership

Over the past 15 years, Cambourne Youth Partnership has been providing youth work support for young people in Cambourne, through a variety of groups and activities.

We are currently based at the Cambourne Soul Youth Centre, where we have a team of youth workers and volunteers running open access youth clubs, football and boxing groups, music sessions, baking and cooking activities and a wellbeing cafe. We also support young people on an individual basis, getting alongside and journeying with them through the challenges they face.

As we look to the future, we're excited by the opportunities offered by the new Cambourne Soul building. We are in conversation with Cambourne Town Council, who will be operating the new building, about continuing to provide open access youth clubs in the youth centre and are looking forward to doing this with improved facilities, such as a proper kitchen, recording studio and hall.

Some of our youth clubs, particularly those for Years 7-9 are currently pushing at the capacity of the existing building, and when we move across into the new space we expect the numbers attending to continue to grow. Sun safety and skin cancer

Keeping safe in the sun helps to protect us from sunburn and the risk of skin cancer.

In the UK the sun is at its strongest from March to October and sunburn can happen even when it's cloudy. Anyone can develop skin cancer but those with fair skin, fair or red hair or who have lots of moles or freckles are at most risk.

Babies have skin that is extremely sensitive and they should be kept out of strong, direct sunlight altogether.

Advice includes wearing protective clothing, a wide brimmed sun hat and sunglasses and keeping in the shade between 11am and 3pm.

Use at least an SPF 30 sunscreen, paying particular attention to skin not protected by clothing. Star ratings show the level of protection against UV radiation with a 5 star rating being the most effective.

There are several types of skin cancer but melanoma is the deadliest. Watch for any changes to your skin including bumps, lumps, sores that do not heal, new moles or changes to existing moles including increase in size, itching, bleeding or crusting.

Also watch for moles that have an irregular or uneven shape or change in colour. These changes can happen over weeks or months and should always be reported to your doctor.

Additional financial support for South Cambridgeshire businesses impacted by COVID

Businesses in South Cambridgeshire which have been adversely affected by the pandemic but unable to access COVID-19 support linked to their business rates may be eligible for the latest financial support.

South Cambridgeshire District Council is now welcoming applications for its discretionary COVID-19 Additional Relief Fund (CARF).

The Government funding is to provide additional business rates relief to support rate-paying businesses affected by the pandemic between 1 April 2020 and 31 March 2021. The support is for businesses which weren't eligible for previous support linked to business rates, who can prove they have been adversely affected by the pandemic and have been unable to adequately adapt to that impact.

Eligibility criteria will apply, and the scheme will not cover ratepayers who were eligible for Extended Retail Discount (covering Retail, Hospitality and Leisure), those who were eligible for Nursery Discount, or businesses where the premises was unoccupied.

Premises that were temporarily closed due to government advice on COVID-19 may still apply.

Full details and eligibility criteria, along with an application form, can be found at www.scambs.gov.uk/CARF Applications will close on 13 May 2022. Rate Relief will be paid onto Business Rates accounts as soon as possible after all

Amazing time to appreciate wildlife in Cambourne

......

May is an amazing time in nature, and is the best time to go on an early morning walk to listen to the birds because the summer migrants and resident birds are in full song.

In Cambourne nature reserve willow warblers have recently arrived from Southern Africa and can be heard singing a tuneful down-the-scale song, also the unusual grasshopper warbler can be heard in scrubby areas. Learn more about identifying birds by their song - join us on a Birds for Beginners walk in Cambourne on 19 May.



We are able to offer more funded courses this year, thanks to Comberton Adult Education Centre covering costs: Wildlife for Beginners, short course at Cambourne nature reserve is a series of three guided walks in a small group, identifying common wildlife, with a similar programme at nearby Gamlingay and Waresley and Gransden Woods. There are other funded sessions running in Cambourne, for toddlers (Little Bugs), and parents or carers of pre-walking babies (Wild Babies). Monkfield Park receives Heritage Schools Award

MONKFIELD PARK: As the Spring term drew to a close we are delighted to be presented with the prestigious Heritage Schools Award for our work on embedding the study of local history and heritage into our curriculum. As part of our work the children participated in a project inspired by the street names in Cambourne. This led them to study the part Bourn Airfield played in WWII and the exploits of the brave Wing Commander, TJ 'Jeff' Jefferson. The pupils collaborated with the folk group The

Young Uns, to write a song dedicated to the brave pilots who carried out bombing and reconnaissance missions. The Years 4 and 5 students have been tracing the history of habitation in Cambourne back to 800 B.C. and with the help of travel writer



Tom Kitching, they participated in workshops to celebrate the history of Cambourne, writing about the artefacts and clues left by our ancestors.

Meanwhile, Year 1 enjoyed an interactive history WOW day to round off their topic about medieval castles with a huge range of activities, including writing medieval music to accompany the telling of the story 'Hairy, Scary Castle', baking bread for dragons, jousting and medieval dancing. Year 2 were transported back to Ancient Egypt, swapping their school uniforms for an

array of dazzling costumes. The children preserved tomatoes using natron, investigated mummification methods and made Canopic jars to protect their mummified tomatoes on the journey to the after-life.

Village College and Hardwick & Cambourne Community Primary needs your support. Now!



Anyone who drives to Cambourne & Hardwick Primary School or to the Village College will be aware of the building activity for West Cambourne now taking place along Sheepfold Lane, the schools' main access road. You may not be aware, however, that our current, direct approach to the schools is to be replaced with a narrowed route through the new estate, including two road junctions and two sharp bends, before re-joining the new section of Sheepfold Lane outside the schools — see photos of construction. These new roads will serve a dense area of housing with cars inevitably parking on the roadside.

The plans can be seen on the South Cambridgeshire Planning Portal: Applications Search (greatercambridgeplanning.org): Application Reference number: 20/01640/REM

Visitors to the schools will know that a single car parked along our existing access road at peak times can bring traffic to a standstill and gridlock the schools' car parks. When coaches are present, the situation is worse. The new access route will intensify this problem with journey times, congestion and carbon emissions all set to rise. Ideally, fewer cars would access our sites – most of the older pupils already walk or cycle – but this is not an option for everyone. We recorded 1,215 car journeys onto our site on a single day last term, yet neither school was directly consulted



about the proposed changes during the planning process, while connectivity, transport flows and travel efficiency seem not to have been adequately considered. At some point, a one-way system through the schools' sites may have to be created – but this is not an imminent, or desirable solution.

There would seem to be two options that would resolve this problem:

Either: Retain access along Sheepfold Lane – at a cost to the developers, Taylor Wimpey/Bovis Homes.

Or: Build a short link road from the Business Park onto Sheepfold Lane – at a cost to South Cambs District Council.







Coffee morning fundraising



Eid Mubarak

What is Ramadan?

Ramadan is considered the holiest month in Islam. It is the month of communal prayer, devotion to the Quran, and internal reflection. Islam follows the lunar calendar instead of the Gregorian calendar, which is why the start date for Ramadan changes every year. This year, the first day of Ramadan was April 2 which was determined by visual sightings of the crescent moon.

From dawn until dusk, Muslims practice self-restraint to uphold one of the basic tenets of Islam - fasting. This daily practice includes abstaining from food and beverage and all forms of immoral or any unkind behaviour.

Ramadan stimulates the ethos of sharing and caring, extra generosity, respect and giving preference to fellow human beings.



Many mosques hold food drives or fundraisers for charity during Ramadan. Many mosques also host open houses for their friends and neighbours of other faiths to join them for their fast-breaking dinner at the end of the fasting day. This year, over 450 residents attended an annual big Iftar event organised by Cambourne Crescent. Ramadan is also a time for significant community and family spirit and providing support. Many individuals and families will

pray and eat together and support each other in many ways throughout this month. The end of Ramadan is a celebration known as Eid al-Fitr, one of the major holidays for Muslims. Families and friends get together, and there is a special communal prayer to mark the end of Ramadan. People often dress up in traditional clothing and eat traditional foods. The greeting Eid Mubarak means "blessed holiday!".

Ramadan reflection

For me, this year's observance of Ramadan promises a particularly exciting, though almost unfamiliar, return to the spiritual community.

It marks my first big communal iftar - the meal to signify the conclusion of the daily fast - and my first taraweeh prayers - the set



of community-led, nightly prayers distinct to the month of Ramadan - in three years. Perhaps most exceptionally, this will be my first-time celebrating Ramadan with the Muslim community in Cambourne.

Spending time with family and friends, both at home and at mosques, is a common custom during Ramadan. Ramadan is to me a metaphor for unity across boundaries. It reminds me that multiplicity and diversity are a blessing. With most of the year spent feeling busy and stuck in a routine, Ramadan demands that we reach out to our local community to build a brighter future of cohesion, understanding and solidarity.

I always see Ramadan as that special time when we can enter a holy quarantine to better ourselves as human beings. It is a time to reflect on our aspirations and endeavours, to renew our sense of faith and refocus on our ultimate goal.


