# **Celebrating the Jubilee**

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II is the first monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee.

Cambourne-based CamCare UK was awarded funding from the Arts Council's Let's Create Jubilee Fund by Cambridgeshire Community Foundation to ensure that creativity plays an important role in local community celebrations for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The funding supported a community picnic (pictured above and right) organised by Cambourne Town Council on 3 June at the Great Camburne cricket pavillion, and on Sunday 12 June, a street art party will take place at Cambourne Market Square (outside Morrisons) from 12-3pm, a children's art contest on the Jubilee theme at 3-4pm at the Hub, an art exhibition at the Hub from 4-8pm by CamCare UK, a dance workshop and a parade by Natyanjali for people of all ages and backgrounds.

The Let's Create Jubilee Fund will support a huge range of projects throughout England. Forty-four community foundations have been awarding grants across the country. Shrobona Bhattacharya, founding chair of CamCare UK said: "The Queen's Platinum Jubilee



is a unique opportunity for the community to get together and celebrate. We are proud to receive Arts Council England funding to run these exciting art projects in Cambourne and collaborate with local artists to enjoy marking this moment in our history."

Darren Henley, chief executive of Arts Council England, said "This June, we'll see communities across England coming together to celebrate a historic milestone for this country. I'm excited to see these projects brought to life in villages, towns and cities across the country as our wonderfully creative communities celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee."

# **CERC** Team win a place in final at Science Museum

**Team CERC (Cambourne Electronics** and Robotics Club) was one of the 14 finalists selected from 300 schools in the PA Consulting Raspberry Pi Competition, 2022.

The final presentation took place on Thursday, 5th May 2022 at the Science Museum in London.

This competition promotes STEM education by challenging school children to invent systems that could benefit society using their engineering and coding skills, and a Raspberry Pi microcomputer. This year's theme was based on innovations to save the planet challenging 8- to 18-year-olds to design technology that will help make

the world a more sustainable place.

Team CERC - consisting of seven students from various schools in Cambridgeshire - participated in and demonstrated the Eco-friendly Smart Delivery System that included prototype design and development, getting feedback from the delivery industry, report writing, presentations to a large number of professionals, networking with industry professionals, attending interviews, and taking questions from the experts.

Jessica Lydon is our Community Development Officer in Cambourne, working from the Town Council Office on the High Street. It is a very varied role, and one of her many responsibilities was the organisation of the Community Action Day on 14th May, which concentrated on cleaning up and recycling.

Another of Jess' recent events was the Jubilee Picnic on the Green, on 3rd June, the preparation for which included acquiring games and equipment for the various activities she had planned, finding entertainment for the day and arranging the various food and drink outlets.

In July the Repair Café will take place again, organised by Councillor Greg Thompson, and the Community Development Officer will be assisting him. For September, Jess is organising the Cambourne Fete, and is also helping the Cricket Club with their CambFest music event later that month.

Another event, being planned for October half term, is the Big Squiggle Hallowe'en art and craft event, and there will also be an Easter Big Squiggle to look forward to next year.

In December her main focus will be on a producing a bigger and better Christmas Market.

Jess is also working on setting up Tempo Time Credits for Cambourne volunteers after an idea suggested by resident Darcy Simpson. Credits will eventually be available for volunteers who help with litter picking, events, the community shop etc and these can then be exchanged for a range of fun activities in and around Cambridgeshire.

Other aspects of her role include arranging the grants for the refurbished skate park, organising the regular litter-picking volunteers; being the point of contact for street traders, food trucks etc and the possible setting up of an occasional Farmers' and Crafts Market; being on the committee for the Cambourne 10K run and liaising with the Christmas Lights committee. Jess is also investigating future visits by the Fun Fair and the Circus.

Next year, the Volunteers Fair will be held again, to show residents what volunteer opportunities there are in Cambourne, and Jess will follow this later in the year with a Thank you Party for all the Cambourne Volunteers.

## Cambourne Covid Community Champions

Last month, I was delighted to announce my Covid Community Champions, those who went above and beyond for our communities during the pandemic as nominated by you. In Cambourne, several members of the community and the Parish Council nominated Nishat Akhter and John Vickery for such an

award. As Chair of Cambourne Crescent, Mr Akhter aided in the setting up of Cambourne's Volunteer Task Force, working with Cambourne Town Council to assist the community.

Cambourne Parish Clerk, Mr Vickery (who I was able to present with his certificate last month), worked diligently, dealing with issues raised and responding to residents' needs while maintaining the functions of the Town Council. I was delighted to recognise both on behalf of the residents, and want to thank the hundreds of people in Cambourne who reached out and supported our community during that most challenging time.

Of course, some of the greatest champions during the pandemic were our NHS staff – and yet, NHS workers living in Cambourne get no high cost of living allowance. Workers in outer London boroughs such as Croydon, Barking and Bexley enjoy lower rents than those in Cambourne, but get paid 15% more. It makes it far more difficult for staff to stay in our area.

This month, I asked the Prime Minister to work with me to ensure that NHS workers in Cambridge and South Cambs are paid fairly, and I will continue to fight for a better settlement for them.

# How I have begun my new term in office

#### It is my great pleasure to serve as your District Councillor for a second term and Town Councillor for a third term in Cambourne.

These are matters I have been involved with: - I initiated the process with the Town Council to have a zebra crossing in Monkfield Road with two other Councils (District and County).

- I was invited to meet the students of Cambourne Village College on two occasions, the first was Diversity celebrations through Arts and then the Eco Club of the College.

- I met management and youth workers in one-toone meetings at Cambourne Soul and talked to young people individually to understand their needs and how I can help. - I am directly involved in many "actions in need" with the Ukraine communities and the new arrivals in Cambourne.

# What have I got to be grateful for?

Gratitude may seem a slightly unusual topic in an article on health, but there is an increasing belief that it can have a significant effect on our emotional (and physical) wellbeing.

The idea of 'counting our blessings' has clearly been around for many years but more recently this has formed the basis of many research studies. These have shown that practicing gratitude (more than just having an "attitude of gratitude") can improve wellbeing, sleep and stress. One way to do this is by completing a gratitude journal every day. The research suggests if you note down three things you are grateful for, that within a few weeks you are likely to notice an improvement in your wellbeing. These should vary every day and can be small things such as enjoying a coffee or a conversation or the smell of a flower or hearing birds singing.

The techniques of mindfulness or 'taking notice' of your surroundings can be useful in helping identify small but wonderful things. Another technique can be replacing the phrase 'I need to...' with 'I get to...'. Although it may not always work, it does often highlight how much we have. You may not feel like being grateful but as David Steindl-Rast said: *"It is not joy that makes us grateful, but gratitude that makes us joyful"*.

# CVC students win Ventura Design Award

**CAMBOURNE VILLAGE COLLEGE** students have won the prestigious Ventura Design Award hosted by the Design Museum. All our pupils in Year 10 Design & Technology class worked in groups on the brief - to design a product inspired by the senses; and at the end of last term, Holly, Amanda, William, Serena and Genevieve heard their group had made the shortlist of 10 finalists chosen from more than 400 entries.

Their design is for an Eco seed - a small floating device that allows users to grow seeds in a glass of water and observe the whole germination process.

The group pitched their idea to a panel of professional designers at the Deutsche Bank headquarters in London and late in April returned for a celebration event at the Design Museum, where they toasted their success. The young people will now work with a professional design team to get their Eco seed into production which will be sold at the museum's shop this summer, with profits donated to a charity of their choice.



DT teacher Pauline Courtois, who oversaw Cambourne's entry and accompanied the students to London, said: "We could not be more proud of their achievements. This win is a testament to their hard work, dedication and passion for the subject. I am so happy that they've had this incredible opportunity to experience the design process at a professional level and be part of such a creative industry."

Choices this term include learning French, 'The Wildlife Gang' (bird spotting, pond dipping, and nature photography), Eurovision, 'MART' (using maths to create art), Cricket and 'Survival' (den building, cooking on a fire pit, map work and orienteering).







# **Council and charities** provide bicycles for **Ukrainian guests**

#### People who have fled Ukraine and arrived in South

Cambridgeshire can now request a free bike as part of a District Council initiative with local charities.

Guests from Ukraine who have arrived as part of the Homes for Ukraine scheme can now request a quality second-hand bicycle - with bikes being provided by OWL Bikes and Camtrust. Helmets and locks will also be supplied free of charge. The Council will also provide guests with details of a free Bikeability cycle training course, which will include a translator.

Latest Government figures show that 514 visas have so far been issued for South Cambridgeshire as part of the Homes for Ukraine scheme. This remains the highest number for any District Council area, and the seventh highest figure for any area in England. The bicycle scheme has been put together to support new arrivals in the rural district to meet other guests who have arrived in neighbouring villages. It will also help guests move between communities when public transport may not be available.

OWL Bikes, part of the Papworth Trust, offers quality refurbished bikes for sale - while offering work and training opportunities for local disabled people. Impington-based Camtrust specialises in life and work skills for adults with physical disabilities and learning difficulties. The charity also runs a bicycle refurbishment programme where donated bikes are refurbished by a small team of staff and clients and sold at affordable prices. Camtrust also offers bike servicing.



Meanwhile, residents who may have a spare or not needed bicycle at home are being encouraged to offer it to OWL Bikes or Camtrust as part of the initiative - so the cycles can be refurbished and passed to guests from Ukraine.


Equally importantly, the Council is also offering free Bikeability courses. These courses provide practical skills and advice on how to cycle safely and legally on our roads using qualified, expert instructors - all backed-up by a translator that they will arrange.

If you have a good quality bike you would like to donate please contact Kevin Walshe on 01223 839580.

The bicycle scheme is available to any Ukrainian refugees, including children, who are residing in South Cambridgeshire under the Homes for Ukraine programme. Hosts may wish to apply on behalf of guests.

Once a guest applies for a bike and the Council has confirmed they are eligible, they will be put in touch with the supplier nearest to them so that they can arrange to collect their bicycle. Where no transport is immediately available for hosts to collect bikes, such as if host family has no car, a community group may be able to assist. The Council can help link hosts and guests through to their local community group and District Councillors if needed. Guests or hosts can ask for this support, and raise any further queries or concerns around bicycle collection, by emailing duty.communities@scambs.gov.uk If bikes are no longer needed, they can be returned to the supplier.

# Staying safe when using technology, staying safe online

#### Awareness of road safety is important, and so is online

**safety!** Battling the threats while using technology shouldn't be limited to installing anti-virus software but dealt with sound judgement.

Due to the increasing use of technology and gadgets recently, securing our personal data and information has a significant role. Particularly after the pandemic, technology has become part of our lives more than ever before. Therefore, attackers have shifted their focus from programmed viruses to persuading individuals, gathering their personal information, and using it for deceitful acts. These type of cyberattacks are called social engineering.

Social engineering has become very common. Text messages or social media posts that encourage urgency in prompting us to share our personal data or bank account details, or a link that takes us to a website that looks trustworthy, but could be misleading. Such messages should be handled with utmost care.

Be aware of where and who you share your personal details with and take time to check if the individual or the service is reliable. Be cautions when forwarding text messages or social media posts that promises you exciting offers, this possibly could be a trap. We are advised to be safe in real-life from theft and fraud, but it is equally important to be safe in our virtual or online lives too. It is vital to be aware and educate ourselves, on how to be secure from these threats.

In every website or social media app, we have the option to block and report the individual or service if we doubt its credibility. If you see or experience any cyber attack, you can also directly report them to the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC). (report.ncsc.gov.uk)

At school - secondary and primary - children have online safety week and cybersecurity is the part of the computer science curriculum. They are taught how to keep a password strong and private and also what personal data is. Along with this, parents can support their children to be safe online by checking reviews of books, games or videos they watch using common sense media. (www.commonsensemedia.org)

# Local doctor keeps running for charity

Local doctor Daniel T Rajan writes to *Cambourne Crier*: "On 1st May I ran the Vancouver 2022 Marathon. It's along the Pacific coast and this year there were 18,500 runners!!.

"So why did I run the Vancouver Marathon? I have run many marathons for charity, raising funds for Prostate Cancer UK to eye projects in Angola.

Dying newborns have become part and parcel of tribal life in the Jawadi Hills, Vellore, Tamil Nadu, in South India. Dangerous birthing environments have meant women pay the highest price, with their life, when they go into labour. The lack of a maternity unit has led to 98 per cent of tribal children being born at home, if they survive the birth. Home to 60,000, the region is 12 hours away from a hospital. The journey can be treacherous given the surrounding terrain. To reduce infant and maternal mortality, Christian Medical College Vellore wants to build a maternity and emergency care hospital offering healthcare services 24/7. The overall budget is £50,000 and this is where you come in.
