Cambourne rolls with the robots

Unless you have actually been living on a Starship, you can't help but notice an invasion of cute little white robots trundling their way through Cambourne.

Cambourne Crier set out to find out what exactly was behind this apparent re-enactment of a scene from a George Lucas movie within the confines of our town.

The six wheeled robots, known as "Starships" are the brainchild of Janus Friis and Ahti Heinla, the founders of Skype, the internet phone company, and have now built the leading autonomous delivery company in the world.

Being much friendlier than Darth Vader, the purpose of the robots is not to take over the world; they simply collect your groceries from Upper

Cambourne Co-op and deliver them to your home.

We are not alone

According to Henry Harris-Burland, Head of Marketing at Starship Technologies, this is not a trial, but a full rollout of the Starship delivery service, in Cambourne. *We are not alone*, because Starships have already covered millions of miles across the world, delivering goods in cities including Los Angeles, Hamburg, Houston and locally in Milton Keynes.

Cambourne is fantastic

"Cambourne is fantastic for robots," said Henry, "We set a mapping robot away to map several towns and possible sites for the robots, as well as working with our partners like the Co-op and Cambourne came out on top with a perfectly located store



nearby. Since then the robots have already covered several thousand journeys in Cambourne alone."

He continued: "We also like to work with local councils which embrace technology and understand the benefits and the council at

Cambourne were amazing, with Councillor Mark Howell taking a particular interest.

"I would also like to add how thankful we are to the Cambourne community regarding how they have embraced the robots."

Starship robots roll into Cambourne

"I have many cards and notes already from children in particular, sent to the robots from grateful customers."

Helping people in their own home

The Starship technology particularly helps people who cannot get out of their home, because a Starship robot can get to them regardless of wind, snow or rain with their weekly groceries or just a single item they have forgotten.

For your safety and security

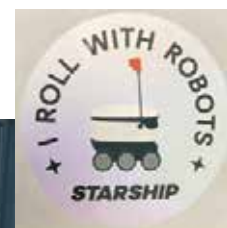
People obviously have security concerns, but these are addressed by the robots having many safety and guidance features and as yet there has not been a single collision with a motor vehicle or pedestrian injury. Starship Enterprises told *Cambourne Crier* that whenever a robot gets into difficulty such as being stuck on a kerb, a Cambourne resident rushes to its aid long before a support vehicle can get to it. It is safe to say that Cambourne has embraced the new technology - with photographs appearing on Facebook of children patting or hugging them as if they were a new puppy.

The safety and navigation capabilities have been well designed, with each robot having a proprietary mapping system using computer vision and a range of sensors, radar, ultrasonic sensors, time of flight sensors, 12 cameras and machine learning - so it gets more experienced the more journeys it undertakes.

Each robot has a siren if tampered with. If one was vandalised the culprit would be caught on camera and their image projected to a central control room.

Interview with a Robot

The robots can also speak, with a range of phrases well beyond "Good Morning" and "Good-bye" and with far better enunciation than R2D2, so we decided to interview Starship 6E108 for its opinion. We stopped it on its journey to ask it how it was enjoying



working in Cambourne. The robot did indeed reply and said: *"Excuse me, please may you let me pass, I'm going to be late for my delivery."*

Experience of Robots in the Community

Tania Thrower, Member Pioneer for the Community at Upper Cambourne Co-op (pictured above), explained how the Starship scheme was working in Cambourne: "The Robotic delivery service was launched in May 2022 and took off straight away, with the robots being used every day.

"We had 170 deliveries on our first day with the highest ever number being 252 in a single day. Anything is being ordered from a full week's shopping to a single packet of biscuits, but you still have to verify your age for alcohol or cigarettes.

"A robot can carry frozen food because the goods compartment is insulated and could carry hot food in the future."

To access the Starship delivery service a customer needs to download the Starship App onto their phone and register. From there they can order their shopping from Upper Cambourne Co-op which is then delivered to their home. Each delivery costs 99p on top of the cost of your shopping.

Tania continued, "There was a lot of concern at first about the robots taking people's jobs, but in fact the opposite has happened and we have had to employ another three members of staff to keep up with the demand."

In terms of the public response, Mohua Bhattacharya of Great Cambourne, who has used the service several times, said: "I

decided to try out the Starship robot delivery service mainly because I had seen them scurrying around the place, looking almost toy-like, yet very purposeful!

"Using the handy money-off coupon that had been put through our letterbox, I ordered a few things that we needed.

"I could also order a free tune to play on delivery, which I did!

"The app kept me informed every step of the way - what the estimated delivery time was and where the robot was on the map. In about half an hour, the robot was at the designated spot outside our cul-de-sac. The app pinged the robot's arrival and told me how to open it. Much to my amusement, the robot sang 'Here Comes the Sun' to me as I collected my bag of groceries and I sent it on its way. It was a very good delivery service."

Meet the Town Council Team

Liam Jordan

Groundsperson Team Leader

Liam Jordan currently has a groundsman and an apprentice who help him with his work around Cambourne, in particular looking after the open spaces, gardens and play parks, while other teams look after the verges and sports areas - of which more in another issue of *Cambourne Crier* as this series of interviews continues.

Cambourne has more than 250 acres of land, which all takes a lot of looking after by Liam and the team. On Mondays Wednesdays and Fridays, they empty the litter bins and dog bins (more than 100), inspect all the play parks for repairs, safety and other issues and report back, taking action if necessary to repair or replace damaged equipment. Unfortunately, repairs are required regularly due to vandalism, especially to the safety surfaces in the play areas. This often means having to close a play area until it is safe to reopen. On Tuesdays and Thursdays they use the push-along mowers in the play parks and in areas that the big mowers can't reach. Liam assists with the landscaped areas, filling in holes, re-seeding, planting hedges and trees as necessary as well as general repairs such as replacing loose posts and rotten fencing. He also takes part in the seasonal planting that makes Cambourne so bright and cheerful all year.

Part of his role is to put in new benches and bins where repair isn't possible and also in new areas such as Upper Cambourne. Setting up new play equipment, such as the Youth Shelter in the skate park, also comes under his remit.

Repairs, re-fencing, re-painting and hedge-cutting are still more of the jobs Liam undertakes regularly. Other jobs crop up from time to time, such as assisting with community events, for example moving and setting up marquees and other equipment for community groups, schools and the annual fete. He also takes part in helping to set up and lay out the 10K course with the rest of the Grounds Team and manning the chase vehicle in case of emergency, helping to set up for the fireworks event, installing the Christmas lights and preparing for the switch-on event - the list goes on!

One of the most recent projects - getting ready for the fete later in the year - was to take out trees and hedges at the back of the Sports Pavilion and upgrade the culvert so as to improve access to the toilet facilities there and remove the need for so many portaloos!

Clearing up after vandalism is also part of Liam's role with unenviable tasks such as clearing graffiti, cleaning, repairing or replacing damaged equipment, litter-picking and clearing up the aftermath of deliberate fires.

Liam has been working as a groundsperson for five years, starting as an apprentice and rising to his current position of Groundsperson Team Leader and is very happy in the work he is doing.

Living with Schizophrenia

Schizophrenia is a mental illness experienced by 1 in 100 people and can affect how people think, feel and experience the world.

The most common symptoms are hallucinations (hearing voices, smelling, seeing or hearing things that others don't); delusions (believing things that feel very real but are not based in reality) and disorganised thinking (which can lead to talking quickly or slowly and in a jumbled way).

Sadly there can be a stigma around schizophrenia which can add to an already difficult diagnosis and is often not helped by representations in the media.

Those with schizophrenia are significantly more likely to be a victim of crime than the standard population and are much more likely to be harmed by other people than cause harm.

Schizophrenia tends to develop in early adulthood and the reasons are not fully known; although it is felt genetics, emotional distress, brain injury and use of strong cannabis may be factors.

With treatment and support, many people affected by schizophrenia go on to lead fulfilling lives and manage their symptoms.

Living with schizophrenia should not be a barrier to employment, having positive personal relationships and a good quality of life.

CYP gets £45,000 to provide mental health support

Cambourne Youth Partnership (CYP) has been awarded £45,000 across three years to provide mental health support to young people in the community of Cambourne. The funding is being provided by the UK Youth Fund - Thriving Minds, a new programme being delivered by leading national youth work charity UK Youth.

Earlier this year UK Youth, working in partnership with the Julia and Hans Rausing Trust, launched Thriving Minds, an ambitious fund for projects to improve mental health support and provision for young people through youth work. Organisations will be supported for three years, both with funds and a tailored package of extra support including workshops, training and by building communities of best practice. The initial £10m pot provided by Julia and Hans Rausing has been boosted by an additional £1m from the Westminster Foundation.

CYP works in partnership with Romsey Mill to provide youth work support to young people in Cambourne. The team of youth workers and volunteers run several youth clubs and activities across the week, primarily based at Cambourne Soul youth centre.

In July 2020, the prevalence of mental health problems in 5-22 year olds went up to one in six, up from one in nine in 2017. This comes at a time when support for young people is suffering. Children are waiting up to three years for access to mental health care in some parts of the UK. In the last decade more than 4,500 youth work jobs and 760 youth centres have closed, as over £1bn funding has been cut from the sector.

Ndidi Okezie, Chief Executive of UK Youth said: "Youth workers can spot the signs that a young person is experiencing difficulties and can support them to open up, talk through what they are going through and seek help if they need it. With a youth

support system already on its knees post pandemic, we know the numbers of young people that need support from a youth worker are only going to rise as we face the biggest cost of living crisis in a generation. UK Youth are delighted to be able to help fund CYP, one of almost 100 organisations across the UK improving support for young people over the next three years through their incredible work with young people."

Jonathan Buwert, Lead Youth Development Worker with Romsey Mill, working in partnership with CYP, said: "We are delighted to have secured support from the UK Youth Fund - Thriving Minds. As an organisation supporting young people, we have seen first-hand the impact of the pandemic and other issues on the mental health of children and young people. More and more young people are reaching crisis point and turning to us for support. This funding will allow us to continue developing the work that we are doing around mental health, such as the wellbeing cafe, targeted 1:1 mentoring and wellbeing groups in school, as well as supporting the wider work we do in creating spaces for young people to meet together, find support and be inspired through activities such as music, art and sport."

As CYP sets out plans for using this funding to ensure sustainable growth in the mental health support available to young people in Cambourne, they would be keen to hear from local individuals or organisations who are also passionate about supporting young people's mental health and may want to partner with them. As a church we are saying goodbye to two lovely people.

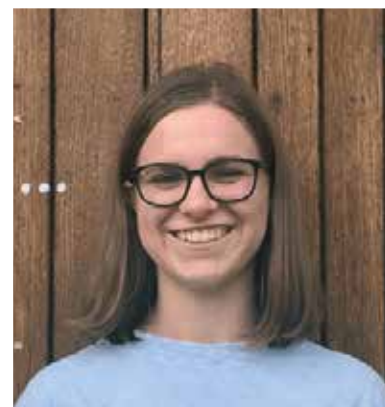

Faith during troubled times.

Over the past several months I have been preaching out of the book of Hebrews chapter 11. For those of you not familiar with the chapter, it reflects on the challenges and triumphs of heroes of faith in often adverse and hostile conditions.

Each situation was different and the act of faith was different. With some, it was standing firm and not bowing to idolatry. Others required moving away from the problem or persons pursuing them. Still more stood to fight and vanquished the opposing forces. In all of these, the application of faith was as varied as the people. However, during this teaching one aspect that can help us today is a basic

principle that is common among the wise. My father also taught me this and that is "Pick your battles." Find out what the actual problem is that you face and ensure that it is the battle that is worth fighting and not a distraction. So often we are bombarded in this life with irritations but they are not only not worth the fight but will hinder us from the real problem. Some people get the wrong idea about Christians and think that they should never get involved with any kind of conflict or never even upset people. This is not the case if the cause for the conflict is a righteous one. Like

Jesus twice in his ministry drove money changers and merchants out of the temple. The first time in John and the second in the other Gospels. People were upset and businesses disturbed, but they should not have been there. A house of prayer should not be disturbed by deposits be they of dubious businesses or old

Bessie making a deposit in the corner. And once the problem was resolved Jesus went right back to teaching. So pick your battles, but afterward press on with the primary goal. Keep focused this month.

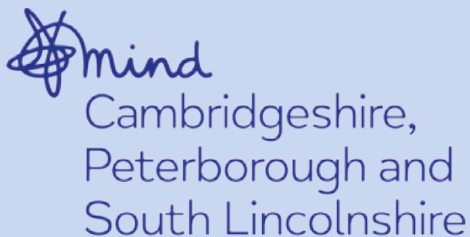

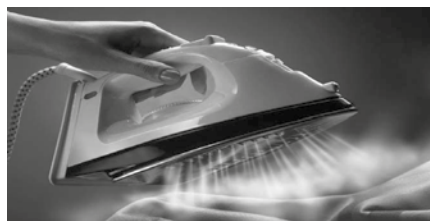

Wildlife Trust July 2022

July is a good time to spot the marbled white butterfly in the meadow areas of Cambourne Nature Reserve.

It is an unmistakable, beautiful chequered black-and-white butterfly. You might also see the thick-legged flower beetle - so called because the males have chunky thighs! - which is a vibrant metallic green, they're often seen on oxeye daisy and hog weed.

In order to look after our Wildlife Trust reserves we'd like your help in a variety of ways, for example, reporting problems like graffiti on our signs, book to attend an event, record the wildlife you see, or become a volunteer. If you enjoy Cambourne Nature Reserve, one of the best ways you can help is by becoming a member which brings a discount on the majority of our events.

Volunteering

Cambourne work parties started in November 2021 and are now run by our dedicated team of volunteer wardens with support from our conservation team, on the first Saturday of every month, 9.30am- 12.30pm. Volunteers help across a range of tasks, depending on the time of year: scrub clearance to help ground-nesting birds and breeding newts, footpath maintenance, and simple wildlife surveys to investigate the effectiveness of management. We are really keen to get more local people involved in this work, so if you are interested, please do get in touch.

Sustainable use of our nature reserves

At this time of year, we ask people to be extra careful in not letting dogs disturb wildlife; please stick to the official paths and don't let dogs to run in the meadows and scrub areas - this can disturb ground-nesting birds. We also ask that you keep them out of the lakes and ponds and this can stir up silt and cover oxygenating underwater plants. Barbeques are not permitted on any of our nature reserves.

Events

We run walks and family sessions throughout spring, summer and early autumn, and you might also see us at local events. These events are a chance to learn more about local wildlife and how we manage our reserves, and also to ask questions directly to a staff member.

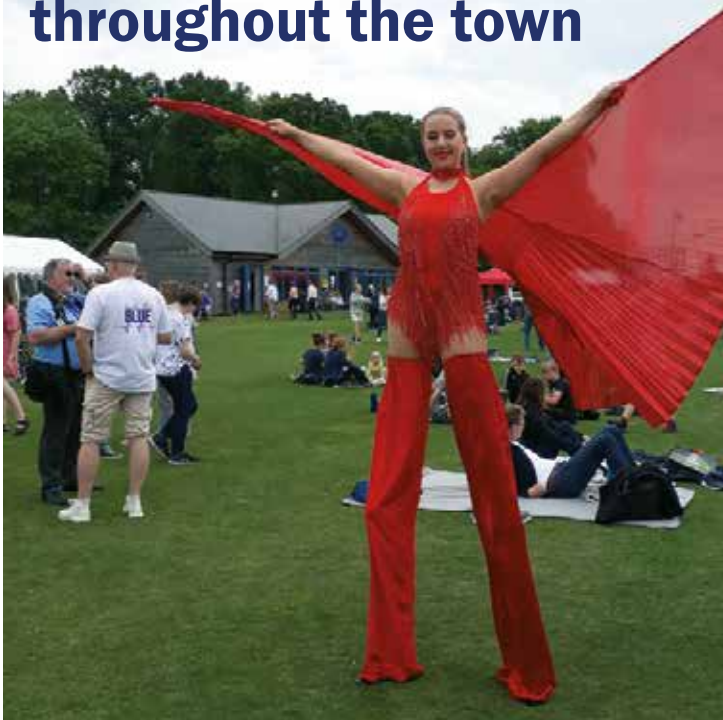

Cambourne Junior Parkrun celebrates first anniversary

After its launch last summer, Cambourne Junior Parkrun will be celebrating its first anniversary on Sunday 24th July.

During the first year, more than 300 children have completed a combined total of more than 3,600km. Children from as young as four up to 14 years old participate in the free, timed 2km running event held at 9am on Sunday mornings on the sports playing fields.

Many parents choose to run the course alongside their children or cheer them on as they run, jog or walk.

Cambourne Juniors are very grateful to the volunteers who assist with the event. With around 20 volunteers needed every week, there's plenty of opportunity for people to get involved and new volunteers are always welcomed.

The event has also been popular with the Duke of Edinburgh Award volunteers. So far eight youngsters have volunteered at the event for three to six months as part of the scheme.

Dozens of wristband rewards have also been handed out to the young athletes. Participants earn a reward once they have completed 11 runs (equivalent to a half marathon), 21 (marathon), 50 (ultra-marathon) or 100 runs. Presentations take place at the event once a child has achieved a goal.
