## THINK PINK FOR ELECTRONICS RECYCLING IN MORRISONS CAR PARK AND OTHER AREAS



## New pink collection banks for small electricals in Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire

Recycling small electricals like toasters, phones and hairdryers is now easier for Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire residents, after local councils installed more drop-off points.

Greater Cambridge Shared Waste Service, a partnership between Cambridge City Council and South Cambridgeshire District Council, has placed eight new collection banks for small electrical items at recycling points around the two areas, with more locations planned.

Small old electrical items are one of the fastest growing waste streams in the UK. According to the Recycle Your Electricals campaign, the number of old cables alone that remain in UK households (140 million) is enough to circle the Earth more than five times.

In the Greater Cambridge area, figures from the RECAP waste partnership show that an average of 450 tonnes of small

electrical equipment is disposed of in black bins every year, ending up in landfill where it will never break down and harms the environment.

Greater Cambridge Shared Waste is joining the national Recycle Your Electricals Campaign to stop as many old small electrical items as possible from cluttering our homes or worse, going into kerbside bins where they end up in landfill. The campaign features the quirky 'HypnoCat' who encourages humans to recycle correctly and provides a postcode locator with details of over 2,500 recycling, repair and reuse points across the UK.

Cambridge City Council's Executive Councillor for Environment, Climate Change, and Biodiversity, Cllr Rosy Moore, said, "We're keen for residents to donate unwanted items to suitable charities and look for repair options for their broken appliances wherever possible – our excellent local volunteer Repair Café network is one way to do this. But there will always be some electrical items that are too old or cannot be repaired, and it's very important that these are not binned with household rubbish, or even recycling. They contain precious materials like

gold, aluminium and steel which are needed for making new items, and they have to be recycled separately which is why we are working hard to make it as easy and accessible as possible for residents to recycle them." (continued on page 5)

## Owen Baker

## **Sports Development Office** (Football)

Owen joined the team on October 1st 2021. His role was created as part of the 106 grant agreement jointly with developers Taylor Wimpey and Bovis and the Football Foundation for setting up the 3G pitch, which is the artificial pitch located behind the tennis courts. Our 3G facility is unique in that it is not connected to a school or a sports centre, so the role of Sports Development Officer with special regard to football, was considered important in order to maximise usage of the facility and to ensure that the pitch is being used for the community's benefit. The Town Council and the Cambourne Football Club work together and are jointly responsible for the football in Cambourne. Owen's time in the office is spent in manning the phone, taking sports bookings (except tennis), arranging




private bookings. He also supports the Office team on a regular basis and in a variety of ways, and at any Council Event such as the Fete and the Jubilee party. Owen's hours are flexible as he usually spends at least three evenings a week at the pitch over a two-week rota which ensures that every training session will be observed over this period. He gives support to the coaches who deliver the football in Cambourne and his role involves a lot of interaction with the

players, of which there are around 800! He especially focusses on the older youth ages, building relationships and being someone they can turn to if they need football advice or just to talk. Other evenings are taken up with meetings as the football in Cambourne is run by volunteers, so there may be planning for a new season, disciplinary issues or new initiatives which the Town Council or the Football Club wish to set up. Among the new initiatives set up recently

- 1. Pan-ability sessions for those with physical and mental disabilities to assist those young people to be able to participate in a way that is as independent as possible and without which football would not be accessible to them.
- Kick-about sessions. These happen during most of the school holidays, making the 3G facility available to parents and children, under Owen's supervision and at no cost. Owen loves his job and is clearly very

enthusiastic in every aspect of the work.

## **Electronics recycling**

Cambridgeshire District Council's Lead Cabinet Member for Environment, Cllr Brian Milnes, said: "Through our shared waste service, this is another example of how we are working to make it easier and more convenient for our residents to do their bit for the environment. Anything with a plug, battery or cable is an electrical item and can be recycled. Gather your old or broken small electricals and take them to one of the new recycling banks anything up to 29cm in its largest dimension will fit. Larger items can be taken to the Household Recycling Centres near Milton or Thriplow."

Where are the new pink recycling banks for small electricals?

- Gwydir Street car park, Cambridge
- Lammas Land car park, Cambridge
- Abbey Pool car park, Cambridge
- Chesterton Road public toilets, Cambridge
- Morrisons car park, Cambourne
- Tesco car park, Bar Hill
- Village car park, High Street, Melbourn
- Tesco car park, Fulbourn

What kind of small electrical items can I recycle? Anything up to 29cm in its largest dimension, which has a plug, battery or cable. If batteries are removeable, take these out and recycle them separately. Some examples of suitable items include:

- Kettles, toasters, sandwich toasters, stick blenders
- Games consoles, DVD players
- Hand-held vacuum cleaners, electric toothbrushes
- Mobile phones, tablets and smart devices
- Cables and headphones
- Printers and scanners
- Laptops, keyboards and IT accessories

Please note that smoke detectors, light bulbs, e-cigarettes, batteries, paints, chemicals or aerosols are not accepted in these banks.


## **Cambourne Catholic Church**

We've been able to offer new experiences for young people, taking them out of their comfort zones and helping them to enjoy time with their friends. We're also excited to have been able to run more activities in the new Cambourne Soul Youth Centre, which has given more space for activities such as table tennis, film nights, cooking, baking and

arts & crafts. It's been great to get to know lots of new young people, including those moving into Year 7 who will be able to join in with one of our weekly youth clubs in the new term. Young people have been joining us to cook meals as part of the Holidays, Activities and Food Programme. The big new kitchen in the Soul has meant that lots of fun was had together and we learnt lots about different ingredients, gained experience in food preparation and experimented with new recipes!





## **Cambourne Soul Autumn Term Programme**

Our new programme of youth activities starts in the week beginning 5th September and we're excited that all of the activities (apart from the Wellbeing Cafe) will now be in the new Cambourne Soul Youth Centre.

The following youth clubs are open-access (which means that any young person within the age group is welcome to come along), free to attend (which includes snacks, drinks and activities) and drop-in style (meaning that young people can turn up any time during the session and stay for as long as they would like). When a young person turns up for the first time we will take some basic details, including emergency contact information, then follow up with a message to a parent/guardian to fill in our information and consent form online.

We also run a weekly Wellbeing Cafe, in partnership with Cambourne Church. This is designed as a quieter space for young people who might be struggling with their wellbeing (including mental health) and would like to come and chat with a youth worker, take part in some craft activities, or just need somewhere safe to be.

Fridays from 3.30-5.00pm (in the Church Annexe) Wellbeing Cafe for Years 7-11

As well as these youth groups, we have a range of activities which are more targeted towards different groups, including football, music, boxing and baking. We use these activities to provide youth work support for young people, which can include areas such as mental health, school engagement, relationship challenges, transition support, etc. Young people or parents can get in touch with us and we can discuss how best to provide support.

We rely on volunteers from the community to enable us to run this programme of activities for young people in Cambourne and we love the incredible team we have. We are always looking for new volunteers to get involved, in a youth club or with a specific activity. If you would like to discuss volunteering, please get in touch. Romsey Mill, who we're partnered with, will be running an accredited Level 2 Award in Youth Work Principles course starting later in September, and our volunteers are eligible for a subsidised place on the course.

## The World's Biggest Coffee Morning

At the end of September, people are invited to host a coffee morning to support the essential work of the Macmillan Cancer Support charity.

The official date is 30th September but this can be changed. Macmillan coffee mornings have been happening since 1990.

Macmillan is a UK based cancer charity that provides excellent free resources for patients and their loved ones with information around diagnosis and treatment, financial guidance, an online community forum, health and wellbeing events, a telephone support line and nurses.

Macmillan nurses are specialists in different

areas of cancer care and support patients and their family through their journey with emotional support, advice around treatment, managing side effects and direction to other helpful services such as financial guidance and benefits. One thing that I like about home education is the ability to combine subjects for project based learning. Wh mean by that is in traditional education you have specialized

subjects all separated. However in real life for practical projects you usually combine disciplines. It is not just pure math when making stairs but if you do not use math it can end badly. For example, if you want to teach woodworking, electrics, soldering layout design, computer studies using alternate operating systems, and possibly 3d printing it can all be done by building retro gaming arcade machine.

If you want to teach autobody work, welding, and corrosion con which also involves chemistry, all can be done with projects like bicycle trailer or a go-cart. Now all of this is flexible and can change depending on the interests of the student. For example,



Max wants to one day build his own vehicle. (Now if he accomplishes this is another matter) However developing the skills needed to do this will be of great value, even if his future career is not related. Basic maintenance regardless if it is with a building or a vehicle will save him a huge amount over a lifetime Now some will say oh, but I cannot teach my child this thing or that. The great thing is that there are tutorial videos on almost everything and not only can you use them to help teach but you also can learn yourself. Things like testing fuses in plugs or cleaning an aerator from a tap are all things that even an 8-yea old can learn. Painting or refinishing furniture can be taught with items that others are literally throwing away. The same goes for soldering, tiling or experimenting with thermoforming or jewelry making.

Also, involve the student in the research portion that way they learn how to get the information in the future. The possibilities a as wide as the motivations and interests of the student, maybe little wider with some well-placed encouragement and practical examples. The key is do not be afraid to try as with the proper safe environment you may discover together new areas of inter and learning.

The prices of the cheapest brands and value ranges have generally increased at a faster rate than for more premium brands. In other words the cheapest food is getting more expensive faster than the general rate of inflation would suggest.

It is not surprising that more help is being sought from food banks ... and for the first time since its inception Cambridge City

Food Bank, which oversees the distribution centre in Cambourne, has expressed concerns about having enough. More people need the help, and fewer people can afford to give it.

So this harvest time let us give thanks for what we have, and be generous so that there truly is enough for all. And let us pray for good harvests that all may be fed.





## Wildfire in Cambourne?

We were told that over the weekend 13/14 August wildfires would very likely break out widely over the Southern parts of Britain having seen dozens each day throughout late July/early August with whole streets destroyed by wildfires. Actually I wonder how many people know that in Lower Cambourne we may have already had at least one such fire.


My wife and I live in Orchard Way and in the early morning after the really hot day of 19th July at about 3am we both smelt burning. I got up to check the house - nothing. I went outside and checked all the neighbours houses - still nothing, but the smell of smoke was very noticeable. Next day we discovered that an area nearby, at the bottom of Crow Hill where the Town Council/Wildlife Trust stack their infrequent grass cuttings, which had been about 6 feet high and probably 30 feet deep by 30 feet wide had burnt out to the point where probably only about 15% is

Was this arson, someone disposing of a cigarette or was it self combustion? Scientifically a compost heap especially one that was formed with wet grass can self ignite at about 250 degrees, a temperature that could have been reached in the centre of the

heap during these hot days. How the fire didn't sweep along the hedges/trees of the bridleway that the fire abutted is a mystery except that just a few feet downwind of the fire is a wide footpath which may have acted as a natural fire break. However, if the fire had ignited the hedge the consequences could have been horrific as there are a number of houses along the bridleway that are very close to the hedge.


With climate change (yes in spite of the doubters it is clearly real) and the likelihood of more record breaking hot summers in the future it seems obvious that judicious pruning to cut back hedges and grasses in order to create fire breaks is one answer. We all have to answer questions about flooding risks and proximity to water when completing insurance questionnaires, maybe proximity to woods and hedges will one day be added. No doubt the Town Council/Wildlife Trust will make all the excuses under the sun not to do anything so we may all as citizens need to be more proactive and careful to protect our homes in future.

## **Dealing with Drought**



With the recent weather and Cambournes notorious lack of rain, what is the average homeowner meant to do? Well, one thing that is relatively simple is the addition of one or several water butts dependent upon your individual needs. The process is usually quite simple for a small unit a single cut and some adjustment of a downpipe and

you will have a reserve of water for at least part of the time. Another advantage of this is that you are not charged for the water that you use, this also means that it lessens the burden on the mains supply by whatever amount you use from your own storage. Now in and of itself, it may not be much but if many people did the same thing thousands of litres can be saved each year. Some people even take it a bit further and have larger or multiple units linked and use the water for other things such as fish ponds. They can also be used with small pumps or sprinklers. Rainwater if properly harvested is great for washing cars as it generally has fewer minerals than tap water. This is

also the reason some people use fresh rainwater for washing clothes or flushing toilets.( subject to strict safety restrictions so as not to contaminate the mains supply) Care must be taken though to make sure stored water is not exposed to light to keep algae growth to a minimum. Rainwater is not treated and should not be used for drinking. Good resources to learn more are places like waterwise.co.uk or a



multitude of other places. Another thing to think about is what you actually have in your garden. Many people in low rain areas have plants suited to periods of little rain. Now of course you will have to check as our soil in Cambourne is not the greatest as below the surface topsoil is about 100ft of galt clay until it hits lower greensand. This is another reason you do not want thirsty plants close to your home as clay soils often have difficulty with expansion or contraction as water content changes. If we each do what we can, maybe we can save a bit of water and some cash as well.

The 8Us (Under 8) team placed 2nd.


The 9Us (Under 9) won their competition - 1st place.

As a club who has run sessions for girls for many years, it's great to see many young girls getting involved. We spoke to Clare Jenkins who is a coach for Cambourne Town FC and passionate about football along with her daughter Mia. Clare explains how they got involved and how their journey is continuing; "My daughter Mia plays for U15 Girls team and I have been one of the team's coaches for 4 years. I started when her team needed to split (previously had 2 age groups playing together but got too big), so I stepped up and did my FA coaching level 1, despite not knowing much about the sport to ensure she could continue doing something she loved. She, like the Lionesses, is really passionate about ensuring other girls have the opportunity to play and has been helping with both U9 Girls teams this year. She has also completed her referee training course this year and will be refereeing at the Cambourne Town tournament in September.

At Cambourne Village College Mia took part in an initiative run by Owen Baker (Development Officer for the Town Council and Club), called the Football Leadership Academy, to help young people develop their leadership skills, design and deliver their own 6-week football coaching programme for KS2 pupils. She

was the only girl on the course. Mia was also selected to be a Game Changer as part of a nationwide scheme run by Barclays #letgirlsplay to improve access to football for girls in school. She has been active in a tournament for primary school age girls at Linton Village College and sessions at Cambourne Village College VC for younger years.

The recent Euros inspired us both and I volunteered at MK Dons stadium as a ceremony maker for all 4 matches held there. We were both fortunate to be at the Women's Euros final at Wembley - it was amazing!

## **CFTC Subscribes to the FA's Play Safe Campaign**



The FA's Play Safe campaign shines a light on the topic that is important to all members of Football Clubs, from coaches and officials to players and parents. It's a pan-football campaign and has the full support of the Premier League, EFL, FA Women's Super League, FA Women's Championship and the NSPCC.

This September there will be a specific focus by the FA for Play Safe weekend on September 17th and 18th and parents and carers are urged to complete their course 'Safeguarding awareness for Parents and Carers'.

We met with our own Safeguarding Officer Julia Cullum; Julia, what does your role involve at the club?

The Welfare Officer role involves ensuring that the welfare of all the players is protected. This means I am responsible for doing DBS checks for all our coaches and managers and support

Sharon, our accreditation officer, to make sure coaches have completed safeguarding training and first aid training as relevant. It also means I advise coaches on safeguarding matters and respond if there are any queries or issues or concerns raised by parents, managers or Cambs FA.

Where will we find you or get hold of you on match days? If I can make it I will often be down at the pitches on match day watching either my son or daughter play. I am on the coaches whatsapp group so that is the easiest way to get hold of me. For parents they can contact me via the website or via the relevant coach or by emailing safeguarding@cambournetownfc.org.uk

### What types of safeguarding issues should we be discussing with you or reporting?

Anything that would indicate that the safety and welfare of a child is at risk. It is important to remember though that if there is a concern that a child is at risk of serious harm then this is something that would need to be reported to the police or Children's Social Care.

#### What advice would you give a parent who has some concerns about a player, parent or coach?

Please do raise any concerns as soon as possible as it is usually easier to sort things out sooner rather than later. The first step (where appropriate) is usually to discuss with the coach of the team to try and resolve the issue. If it cant be resolved at that level then please do get in touch with me: safeguarding@cambournetownfc.org.uk
