

# South Cambs DC plans budget for the year ahead and promises greener future



Priorities included reducing fly-tipping, promoting a cleaner, greener future and supporting local residents and businesses with the cost of living.

- Key initiatives for residents include:
- Reducing fly-tipping hotspots through cameras and prompt investigation into dumped rubbish reports
- Civil Parking Enforcement in South Cambridgeshire, working with Cambridgeshire County Council and the Greater Cambridge Partnership
- Helping older people live independently in their homes for longer with a new Mobile Warden scheme
- Supporting the health and wellbeing of residents with grants for local projects
- Continued support for the Homes for



Ukraine scheme

- Goals for helping businesses include:
- Supporting start-ups and small businesses growth
- Advising businesses on how to become greener
- Promoting local businesses, offering tailored support and resources, as well as identifying funding opportunities
- Continuing to support and help establish South Cambridgeshire local markets
- In line with the council's 'green to the core' goals, there are plans to:
- Address water scarcity in Greater
   Cambridge by working with Cambridge
   City Council, the water industry and others
- Distribute up to £125,000 as part of the Council's annual Zero Carbon Communities grant scheme
- Provide grants to villages for more tree-planting

- Award up to £50,000 in grants to help with the installation of electric vehicle charging points at village halls and community buildings
- Continue with plans for a solar farm to power electric bin lorries at the Waterbeach depot of the Council's Greater Cambridge Shared Waste service with Cambridge City Council
- Replace diesel bin lorries as they come to the end of their working lives with lowemission vehicles, or those powered by alternative fuels such as biofuel.

According to SCDC, the Budget outlines how the Council is well underway with an ambitious four-year transformation programme to improve the quality of services while making the most efficient use of funds as possible. The programme is forecast to deliver £2m in savings in the next three years.

### ■ Council Tax

A below inflation increase of £5 per year in Council Tax (for an average band D home) will ensure essential frontline services will continue to be delivered effectively. This will rise to £165.31 per year for a band D home - an increase of around 10p per week. The rise continues to maintain the Council's position in the lowest 25% of taxing District Councils in the country.

South Cambridgeshire District Council's Lead Cabinet Member for Resources, Cllr John Williams, commented: "Councils are always having to find ways to do more with less money and we are happy that our budget contains a wide range of support to residents and businesses in South Cambridgeshire. Raising our small share of Council Tax by a below inflation



increase of £5 a year means we can continue delivering key services that residents rely on."

### Housing

The Council's Housing Revenue Account
– which is a ringfenced account used to
maintain its stock of around 5,600 Council
homes – has its own budget targets.
Highlights include:

- Target to build at least 75 new energyefficient Council homes to be delivered every year.
- During the next two years, more than £2million will be allocated to continue work

to retrofit the Council's existing housing stock, as part of ongoing carbon reduction efforts.

# Wildlife Trust March 2023

Cambourne Nature Reserve is a special place, not only does it allow all types of people to get close to nature, but it also has some interesting and unusual species. Here are some favourites:

Snipe - these wading birds hang out in the marshy areas around Whomping Willow Lake (so ensure dogs stay under control or on leads in this area so as not to disturb them).

Great crested newt - on the move on warm nights in spring, this is our largest native newt; they look black out of water. The males attract a mate by doing a dance in the water and wafting a colognelike chemical towards them with their tail. Newts wrap their eggs individually in leaves in ponds. Please keep dog out of ponds and lakes as they can disturb eggs, release pesticides in the water from worming and flea treatments, and disturb



sediment which settles on underwater plants, preventing them from oxygenating the water

Wasp spider - a harmless spider with fake warning black and yellow colours that mimic a wasp; they may look big and scary but will not bite.

Grass snakes - the only type of wild snake in Cambourne is the harmless

grass snake; they feed on amphibians so can sometimes be seen swimming in the lakes; they are not venomous.

Daubenton's bats can be seen on still nights from April to October, they specialise in catching insects over water. Join a night walk later in the year to see these and listen to them hunt via echolocation picked up on bat detectors.

air source heat pumps linked to solar PV systems. This switch to a 'clean' low carbon heating system is well-suited to retrofitting into older 'new-build' homes such as those in Cambourne, with the solar PV providing power for the air source heat pump which in turns provides heating and hot water. The solar PV system also supplies electricity for lighting, appliances etc.

### Grants

Financial help is available to smooth the switch from traditional fossil fuel heating systems to low carbon alternatives. The government's Boiler Upgrade Scheme (BUS) offers £5,000 to offset the cost and installation of air source heat pumps installed by MCS-certified heating installers such as Infinite Heating & Energy.

Some banks have cash-back schemes for mortgage customers making their homes greener.

Barclays is offering £2,000 towards an air source heat pump and £1,000 towards solar PV as long as the work is carried out by a Trustmark registered contractor such as Infinite Heating & Energy. Halifax and Lloyds are running similar initiatives. It's also worth noting that there's no VAT on the installation of heat pumps for the next four years.

# Opposing the Cambridge congestion charge

My work in Cambourne has often focused on better public transport, and I have welcomed the Government's £2 bus fares plan over the last few months.

I know many people across the constituency have benefited from this fare reduction. However, I am continuing to work on opposing the inappropriate plans for a congestion charge in Cambridge. The plan will unfairly penalise drivers who have no realistic alternative to driving through the new charging zone, imposing up to £1,300 in extra taxes each year on local shift workers, working parents, tradespeople, the frail,

the vulnerable and their carers. The proposed congestion charge effectively imposes a charge to use our city's hospitals, including Addenbrooke's and Royal Papworth Hospitals.

This will cause an additional difficulty for those who have long-term or regular treatment.

People undergoing treatment often have other significant financial challenges without the additional worries about an additional payment to the combined authority.

Cambourne deserves to have greater access to Cambridge, and I'll fight to ensure it gets just that.

# Public transport and Cambourne activities

I recently organised a consultation in Cambourne where Mr. David Boden, the Business Development Director (East) for Stagecoach, met with residents of South Cambridgeshire to discuss bus routes and financial viability.

During the consultation, residents expressed how important buses are in their lives. To ensure our requirements are being heard, another consultation will be organised in three months' time and I plan to run a questionnaire for residents to gather evidence on the importance of a good bus service in Cambourne and how we can restore all pre-COVID services.

I have also contacted the Cambs GP Network

to start an extra-hour's GP service in Cambourne, similar to services offered at several surgeries outside Cambourne. Additionally, I am planning to organise a consultation with the pharmacy, county members and residents in Cambourne.

As a response to the known shortage of STEM skills in the UK, my registered charity, CamCare UK, has taken several initiatives, including mentoring over 100 students regularly to gain computing skills, including robotics, maths, and engineering in the Blue Space, along with participating in various competitions.

Furthermore, I host a monthly tea party for Cambourne's senior and elderly residents and have many plans to work with them to make them feel better. Cambourne seniors will also be going to different tea rooms, national trust properties, and picnics around Cambridge. The first trip took place on Sunday 19th February.

# Ovarian cancer awareness month

March is Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month. Every year 7,400 women in the UK are diagnosed with ovarian cancer.

Women over 50 who have been through the menopause are at higher risk, as are those with two or more relatives with a history of ovarian cancer.

Problems are not detected through a smear test so understanding the symptoms is important. Although there may be other less worrying causes. If any the following symptoms are happening regularly and are not normal for you they should be reported to your GP who may

arrange for a blood test and ultrasound scan to understand what may be causing them:

- Persistent bloating (a feeling of fullness in the abdomen which is there most of the time).
- Loss of appetite or feeling full more quickly than normal when eating.
- Pain in the abdomen (belly) or pelvic area.
- Feeling the need to urinate more often or needing to go more urgently than usual.

Other symptoms may include a change from normal bowel pattern, extreme tiredness (fatigue) or weight loss that is not expected. As always, the earlier any cancer is picked up the more likely it is, that it will be successfully treated.

There is a story told of a lecturer who took a large glass jar and filled it to the brim with stones. He asked his students if the jar was full. They agreed, but then he added some fine gravel which filled the gaps between the stones. The jar was again declared to be full, but then some sand was added, and it settled into the tiny gaps which remained. Now at last the jar was full. But then a cup of coffee was poured on top, and it too found space in the jar without overflowing.

The lecturer declared that the lesson to learn was that we should focus on fitting the really big and important things into our lives first. If the gravel and sand had been put into the jar before the large stones then the stones would never have fitted. First the big things, then the lesser things, and finally there is always space for a coffee with a friend.

Lent, the forty days leading up to Easter, is a period of self-examination for Christians. It is about remembering what is most important, and re-ordering our lives in the light of what God has done for us in Jesus.

For many there is a practice of giving things up, like chocolate or alcohol. However, the purpose is not to deny ourselves pleasure, but rather to attempt the emptying the jar of our lives and our lifestyles so that the big important stones can find their place.

### **Peacehaven Baptist Church: Pastoral Thoughts**

### Some time apart.

A few months ago my doctor told me I needed some time away. A holiday, a change of scenery and to temporarily shed the responsibilities that we all bear. I was a little unsure of this as I have never taken an actual holiday in my adult life. Most of my travel had been work related up to this point.

So last month I had a choice of two destinations at very low prices. Either Malta or Turkey. I chose Malta thankfully for even though we had a storm like the one that shipwrecked the apostle Paul there there was no earthquake. We do pray for those affected.

The break I took helped with the cumulative stress to some degree. Just waking up and realising I had nothing I had to do and no one I had to speak to was liberating. In truth I had neglected a good principle over the years of taking time as they say to come apart before you come apart. We all need time of quiet. We all need a time of stillness. And because I did not even take my laptop even communications were limited with people.

However that gave me time to read and time to listen.

The Bible in Psalm 46 says be still and know that I am God. Sometimes our lack of stillness our busy lives interferes with our perception. Even Jesus himself often took time away from the crowds from the noise to quietly pray. I would reccomend some time of peace when you can. You do not need to go to a foriegn land. I could have accomplished the same thing in a tent in Cornwall. ( Although it was Feburary

### **Character is key**

**Educating otherwise:** One great thing about home education is the holistic approach that can be taken to not just what you may classify as education, but in reality the forming of a new member of society. As parents, you need to give more than just information, but instill into the next generation a system of values.

......

The value system you live out in front of them will be transferred to some degree. Information is easy to get, but finding people of integrity and reliability is far more valuable. Qualifications are nice to get a job, but if a person has no work ethic, chances are that keeping that job will not be great. I hear from some of my friends who hire people for work and a lot of the new kids simply do not show up. No call, no explanation no courtesy or communication. It may be a lack of respect for authority, or perhaps a lack of training for responsibility. But how do we train our children for responsibility?

One method I have used is setting tasks for the child. All are reasonable and well within the capabilities of the individual. Timelines and consequences for failure are mutually agreed then I leave them to it. If I come back at the appointed time and it is not done (barring external circumstances) then whatever consequences were agreed to will trigger, whether it is no computer time or added tasks, or loss of some other privilege. That part must be done consistently, rationally and reasonably. This teaches actions to have consequences and the value of keeping your word. Mutual, honest, respectful communication in your words and deeds teaches more than you know.



# **Cambourne** residents encouraged to voice concerns about increase in flight traffic

On 19th October 2020 a public consultation was hosted by London Luton Airport (LLA) and National Air Traffic Services (NATS) regarding a new holding pattern -'stack' to serve LLA. Feedback was invited until 5th February 2021, after which a formal Airport Charge Proposal was on the cards for submission to the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) in June 2021; and if successful its implemention would start in February 2022.

The reality is approximately 24,000 low altitute jets entering Cambourne's airspace since March 2022 using the new approach to LLA and causing serious disturbances to residents. Further negative impact was caused by additional use outside of Luton and Stanstead as well as extended nighttime operations, neither of which was in the consultation.

The post-implementation review is being run by the programme sponsors LLA and NATS. The application to expand LLA operarations could result in a flight every two minutes for 21 hours daily, impacting our communities. The post implementation review ends on 31st May 2023 and the design will be approved permanently if no or a few objections are received.

It was against this backdrop that RELAS (Reject Luton Aiport Stacking) was formed in February 2022 to alert everyone to the changes to aircraft stacking routes into LLA known as 'Air Deployment 6' - AD6 which resulted in increased noise pollution in previously quiet towns and villages. This is set to increase alongside LLA's plans to expand operations.

RELAS claims AD6 was poorly designed, with insufficent consultation, resulting in severe airspacing issues but says it's not too late to reverse these changes. An ongoing review - either to



improve or abandon AD6 has been extended to September 2023 and is now supported by a number of local ministers and councillors across the region.

Anthony Browne MP has taken his concerns about the increase in flights over villages in his constituency to the Minister for Aviation, Baroness Vere, along with Richard Fuller. Residents have written to Mr Browne reporting changes to their quality of life because of flightpath changes, resulting in sleepless nights and even relapses into PTSDA. His meeting with the Minister and officials has led to a commitment to reviewing the CAP1616 process, which governs changing airspace to ensure there is a more independent review once new flightpaths are implemented.

The CAA has agreed to extend the post implementation review into the flightpaths. This process, which allows residents to feed back having lived for a while under the changes, will now close three months later than planned in September 2023, so the effects can be seen over the busy summer holiday period.

Mr Browne said: "It is important that LLA, NATS and the CAA do not overlook the concerns of residents, nor neglect the human impact of their projects.

"At the heart of this campaign are residents who are suffering, some of whom moved into our area to avoid exactly this kind of disruption. I will continue to fight for them.

"Now, we must ensure local people are always provided with the opportunity to express their views on proposed changes, and transform the process for flightpath implementation.

"I would like to thank the minister for her constructive and supportive engagement." According to Luton Airport, the airspace

change was implemented in February 2022 to simplify arrival routes for flights into the airport and separate them from Stansted's, following an extensive public consultation.

A Luton Airport spokesperson said: "All data gathered post-implementation will be submitted along with all complaints received via the correct/appropriate channels to help inform the decisionmaking process."

Mr Browne is also calling for NATS to revise their guidance to reflect differing ambient noise levels in rural and urban areas.

RELAS is urging everyone who has been affected by noise from the flights to complain via every channel available - to local councillors, NATS and on social media. They have published data on the analysis of pollutions levels from flight patterns and airspace utilisation between April 2022 and January 2023. Lower, Great and Upper Cambourne will all be subjected to substantial increases in noise and air pollution evidence of which is available on their website:

Local Cllr Tumi Hawkins encouraged more complaints to LLA as they have said they have't received many complaints and particularly as Luton hopes to expand from 13 million to 26 million passengers.

To date, RELAS' main focus is to get LLA and NATS to publish all their figures on the flight paths, so researchers can guage its effects and impact on people's behaviour. Residents are encouraged to attend the surgeries so a case can be raised for AD6 to be re-consulted and redesigned as the AD6 is not a 'done deal'. The fight still goes on to ensure the future of village life.



# Cambourne's track & field star is unstoppable

2022 has been a year of Achievement for Cambourne's Willow in Track and Field. In 2021 Willow was ranked 25th in Great Britain & Northern Ireland for Hammer. Unfortunately her coach retired in September and wasn't replaced until February 2022. This took her to London for sessions with the England Athletics technical lead for hammer, Paul Head. Since then, there has been no looking back! Willow retained her Under 17 County



Championship titles in both discus and Hammer whilst also breaking the County Championship Hammer Record with a distance of 49.85m. She also smashed the East Anglian League Hammer Record with her personal best - a massive 53.85m. Willow then competed in the Eastern Counties Championship and won gold in both the Hammer & Discus. There has

also been a Gold Medal for Hammer in the Southern Regional Championships, silver nationally in Manchester, in the U17 at English Schools.

Willow earned an U17 International call up for England in Belfast against Ireland, Scotland and Wales and again achieved a silver medal. There was silver again at the National Championships, and at the last major competition of the year - the School Games 2022 in Loughborough - a mini-Olympics Willow won the silver medal in the Hammer.

Coming to the end of the outdoor season Willow's personal best of 53.85m for Hammer places her second in the rankings for the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland.

'Hands' represented the very best of Cambourne Cricket Club: intensely competitive and hard-working on the field, he was warm, eager to help and possessed a brilliant sense of humour that is nothing short of famous. A huge part of the club for more than a decade, Duncan starred in the club's first-ever cup win in 2018; two stumpings and a catch in a lively wicketkeeping performance which saw Cambourne triumph over Madingley Mulch and lift the Pye Cup.

Off the field, he was always ready to help - around the clubhouse, with the youngsters, or scouting potential tours. This epitomised Duncan – you could not find a stronger 'club man', who provided an arm around the shoulder and encouraged you to believe in yourself, listened to you and made you laugh. An

advocate for mental health, he always encouraged his teammates to talk about their feelings and share their emotions.

He was a beloved friend and above all else, a deeply devoted dad and husband. It is with profound heartbreak that we reflect on his passing and send all our thoughts to his family and loved ones. A message from one teammate reads: "So many of my favourite cricketing memories at Cambourne were games that Duncan played in. It says so much about the man we remember most and not just what he did with a bat, ball and gloves, but about the person.

The humour; the chats; the reminders to check in on your mates - no, really check in on them; the sense of fun; the focus on family life. He was a dad first and foremost and although it meant we saw less of him on the field, I'm so glad that his children were his priority. It's the only consolation."

Memories of his generosity, friendship and sense of humour will live long in the hearts of all those that were lucky to know him. Go well, Dunc. In loving tribute from all at Cambourne Cricket Club.
