

UK's oldest windmill reopens after being saved from collapse

Bourn Windmill - the UK's oldest windmill - has reopened after being closed for three years. Bourn Windmill was closed in early 2020 when extensive rot was discovered in the beams which support the mill. It was placed on the Heritage at Risk list because of possible collapse. For the past three years the community has been working with local charity Cambridge Past, Present & Future to save the mill which was supported by many funders including National Lottery Heritage Fund, Historic England, The Pilgrim Trust and SPAB Mills. On Wednesday 19th April they gathered at the mill to celebrate saving it for future generations and to reopen it. Visitor open days at Bourn Windmill will resume on National Mills Weekend on Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th May.

The work to repair the mill has been a significant and expensive project which was carried out by a team of specialist experts. The main body of the mill had to



be suspended in mid-air for 6 months whilst the huge supporting structures were removed and replaced.

The mill is owned and cared for by charity Cambridge Past, Present & Future. Their Chief Executive, James Littlewood, is delighted: "I am so pleased that we have been able to save this special building which was built during the reign of King Henry III. It is not just a building that looks nice, it's an ancient machine with lots of moving parts. Due to its relatively small size, people can have a go at turning the mill themselves or being inside whilst it is turning, this is an amazing and unforgettable experience which visitors can enjoy once again.

"Saving the windmill would not have been possible without a real team effort. Historic

England were fantastic at providing support, advice and funding. Without a significant grant from National Lottery Heritage Fund we couldn't have paid for the work. The skilled craftsmen have done an amazing job in weather ranging from blistering 40C to freezing -10C. The mill volunteers have been wonderful at raising awareness of the mill's plight and helping to encourage donations. The mill owes them all a debt of thanks." *Continued on p7...*

Bourn Windmill is located between Bourn and Caxton and is easily accessible on foot from Cambourne. Volunteer guides give tours inside the mill and the opportunity to turn it on special mill open days which take place once a month from May-September: <u>www.cambridgeppf.org</u>

Cambourne community champions meet Prime **Minister Rishi Sunak with Anthony Browne MP**

Cambourne's Cllr Dr Shrobona Bhattacharya and Dr Sujit Bhattacharya were recently invited to Number 10 to meet Prime Minister Rishi Sunak as guests of South Cambridgeshire MP Anthony Browne, who commended their long history of championing science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) within the local community and across the country.

Drs Bhattacharya are the co-founders of CamCare UK and the Cambourne Electronics and Robotics Club (CERC) for children and young people. CERC has previously been awarded the best Youth Initiative Award by South Cambridgeshire District Council.

Cllr Dr Bhattacharya also hosts Come Cook Dine with Me, where she teaches online community cooking classes to help tackle loneliness and promote mental wellness and has run projects on the social prescription for the NHS, all while volunteering with the elderly population in Cambourne. She was recognised as a Community Champion by Metabolic Sciences at Cambridge University in 2019.

Dr Sujit Bhattacharya balances his time as a Mentor at CERC with roles as a Mentor for both the Arkwright Engineering Scholarship and Nuffield Research, and is a Governor at Cambourne Village College.

Cambourne MP, Anthony Browne, nominated the husbandand-wife team, having witnessed their extensive work helping local young people develop their skills within the community. This includes running Science Festivals, the Family Arts Day, and even a community Pancake race in Cambourne, as well as providing trips to Tea Rooms or the beach amongst other activities for Cambourne's older population.

The couple joined the community event at 10 Downing Street, where they were able to meet the Prime Minister and discuss a range of topics including some of the incredible achievements of the young people who have attended their Science Festivals and CERC. They were joined by 100 other community champions and their MPs, touring the House of Commons with Mr Browne before meeting the Prime Minister.

Mr Browne later commented: "I have always been in awe of the commitment Shrobona and Sujit show to their causes, and it has been inspiring to see the benefits of their efforts within our community. I knew they both deserved a nomination.

"The energy they bring to championing STEM, which has always been a passion of mine, is truly wonderful to witness. It is their work, and that of those they have inspired, that is helping to change the narrative around these topics, opening the eyes of a more diverse group to STEM. It is crucial that we acknowledge and celebrate the sheer amount of their own time, energy and resource that they have put into our community.

"I am honoured to have welcomed Shrobona and Sujit to Westminster, and I hope they have a day to remember for a long time to come."

Cllr Dr Shrobona Bhattacharya added: "Meeting with the Prime Minister along with Anthony was an unforgettable experience that left us feeling humbled and inspired. Their recognition of our efforts and dedication to our cause was a profound affirmation of our mission, and we left feeling energised and invigorated.

"Our visit to 10 Downing Street was a reminder of the importance of working together to create positive change and a sense of belonging to something greater than ourselves, history, and heritage we are proud to be a part of.

"With renewed determination and gratitude, we will continue to champion our cause and make a difference in the lives of those around us."



Graham Bruce, Joint Chair of Bourn Windmill Volunteers said: 'It is great to have the mill fully restored and I, along with the rest of the team, are looking forward to welcoming visitors back to the mill on the open days this year."

The famous architect, Lord Norman Foster, gave his unreserved support to the project. He said, "As a young student at Manchester University,



I was drawn to Bourn Mill to create a set of measured drawings of the building – a requirement of my architectural studies. My choice was not only because of my fascination with the ingenuity of a trestle post mill construction - with the entire weight of the structure supported on a central post and trestle – but also the sheer beauty of the overall design, particularly in section. The original drawings that I made of Bourn Mill are at my Norman Foster Foundation and remain one of the most viewed items from the archive, by students and researchers from around the world."



Cambourne needs better transport links

Cambourne needs a better transport link into Cambridge, but no-one wants an historic orchard destroyed in the process.

That's why I am very pleased to report that County Councillor Steve Count, Leader of the Conservative group at Cambridgeshire County Council, has successfully submitted a motion asking the County Councillors to vote in favour of a proper comparative study of the GCP's off-road C2C (Cambourne to Cambridge) busway versus an alternative on-road scheme.

The on-road proposal was put together by Cambridge Past, Present and Future (CPPF) in conjunction with a well-respected local transport organisation. It would see a new inbound bus lane and priority measures along Madingley Road (A1303). This would not only protect Coton Orchard, but could be delivered at a fraction of the cost of C2C, offering huge savings that could be spent on other local transport improvements.

Amazingly, despite many requests to do so, CPPF's proposal has never been properly assessed by the GCP or County Council. This would achieve the result without impacting the Transport and Works Order, ensuring Cambourne still gets the transport improvements it needs.

I am fully supportive of the Steve's efforts and the work of local campaign groups to push the County Council to duly assess and consider CPPF's common sense proposal.

Warm Hub in Cambourne

Over the last six months, South Cambs District Council, (SCDC), in partnership with Cambs Acre, have been supporting a community-led initiative to bring 25 Warm Hubs across South Cambs.

In our area, this project has involved over one hundred volunteers with over 9000 people attending Warm Hubs between October and March. People attended Warm Hubs for a wide variety of reasons and when asked about why, the most frequent response was companionship. This is in no small part due to the generosity of volunteers. I would like to thank publicly all those involved with the project here in Cambourne,

especially Hope CIC and Cambourne Church and their wonderful volunteers. Your kindness has helped people get through a very difficult winter.

Going forward, the Warm Hub will now be known as the Cambourne Community Hub and will run in the Hub every Monday and Friday morning.

SCDC agreed a further cost of living support package for residents, worth more than £200,000 at the end of March 2023. It builds on a package of almost £400,000 of support which was agreed by the Council in November last year.

The plans include a roadshow of cost-of-living talks, support to transform some Warm Hubs into Community Wellbeing Hubs, increasing awareness of Council Tax support, more free energy saving appliances and the creation of a South Cambridgeshire sustainable food network.

When I trained as a probation officer, many years ago, I recall sitting outside Plymouth Crown Court and my supervisor saying to me, "Go into the court and pretend you are a probation officer ... it has been working for me for almost 10 years." We all have times when we feel inadequate for the role we are called to fulfil. Almost everyone you meet has insecurities they are trying to hide or downplay.

This issue of *Cambourne Crier* is being distributed on the weekend of the coronation. How could anyone feel up to the role of being Head of State for the United Kingdom and many other countries, and Head of the Commonwealth as well - being scrutinised in public by all kinds of people, few of whom will have all the relevant information. How could anyone feel up to that?

This is one of the reasons why the coronation includes a moment when the monarch is anointed with oil. Since biblical times kings have been anointed, and in part it symbolises God's Spirit being given to help the person fulfil their role. They need God's help. Who wouldn't?

And maybe that is true for each of us as well. We may not be kings or anointed with oil, but we can seek God's help when the tasks before us are so much bigger than we could ever manage in our own strength. So pray for yourself when roles and expectations seem overwhelming ... and pray also for King Charles.

Peacehaven Baptist Church: Pastoral Thoughts

This month is the coronation. Recently I also taught about another coronation in 2 Kings 11 but this was of a seven-year-old child that was the rightful king but he had been raised in secret by the old priest. Because his grandmother had ordered the execution of all the children of her son the king after his death so that she could seize control and unlawfully take and hold the throne which she did for seven years. Once the priest had secured

allies he brought forth the young man and crowned him king in front of the people and they rejoiced to see the rightful heir take the throne. The usurper queen heard the noise and cried treason but she was the only one guilty of that. The people rejected her and she was taken out. She had also brought much corruption and wickedness to the land. The new king brought cleansing and prosperity and peace to the people and they were happy when they saw him. Now for the believer the prayer for those in authority is that we might lead peaceable lives. That is much easier to do when decent people are leading.

Or perhaps we place principles as our king. These can be good or bad

depending on what they are. Honour and integrity with a sound moral code can go far. Now those of us who place our faith in Christ see Him as king and Lord. We try to do those things that please him and follow his royal edicts as written down. And the great thing is that nationality does not matter. If you serve the same Lord we are fellow servants, we are family. We pray for our leaders but keep in mind what Jesus said Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's.



Celebrating Eid-al-Fitr in Cambourne: A time for unity and joy


The Muslim community of Cambourne and surrounding areas recently celebrated Eid-al-Fitr, one of the most important festivals in the Islamic calendar.

We organise a free, timed 2km running event for children aged 4 to 14 that takes place at 9am every Sunday morning on the Cambourne sports fields. Over 100 local residents have volunteered an hour of their time on at least one occasion; totalling over 1,500 volunteer occasions so far. To stage the event, we need 14 to 19 volunteers every Sunday, which means that we are constantly looking for new volunteers to join our team.

There's no long-term commitment, as you can volunteer as a one off, or just a few times, or as often or infrequent as you like.

Volunteers don't need any experience as all roles are simple and fun, and training is provided on the day. You also don't need to be a runner or have any involvement in sport. You just need to be willing to provide an hour of your time on at least one Sunday morning.

Each week we need volunteers to act as marshals on the course, or to help with the results processing which includes
