

# New Cambourne pharmacy now open

Cambourne has welcomed the new owner of the former Lloyds Pharmacy.

From September 2023 the new owners have been Jardine's, a 40-strong, familyowned group based in Milton Keynes.

Business owners Has Modi and Krishnan Modi (his eldest son) spoke to *Cambourne Crier* about their background and plans for the Cambourne store.

Mr Modi Snr openly acknowledges the problems they inherited from Lloyds Pharmacy - mainly unscheduled closures and unacceptably long queues - and appreciates that as a result of this and other issues, many customers had taken their business to neighbouring pharmacies. They hope to redress this balance and ensure the pharmacy remains open Monday to Friday 9am until 6pm, with plans to extend their hours to open on a Saturday.

Mr Modi went on to explain that Jardine's primarily offers a community centric service. "We love serving new communities, recognising that newly arriving populations have uprooted from elsewhere and in most cases are looking to start families and have needs beyond just fulfilment of prescriptions.

"As well as ensuring people get their medications in a timely manner, we aim to promote healthy living and improving



quality of life. We will offer a wide range of services for common illnesses in collaboration with fellow healthcare providers including a new medicines service, flu vaccination, blood pressure check services and others to follow."

The pharmacy will develop as the community and town develops, changing the business model to suit local needs. Central to this will be a pharmacy user group to continuously monitor the needs of the local population.

Mr Modi continued: "Cambourne has a very good feel to it. I sense that people are very proud of their town and Cambourne exudes a strong community spirit. I also believe that people want to support local businesses and local facilities. We want to serve Cambourne and make a positive difference."

The pharmacy was acquired without any permanent members of staff, so they are now actively recruiting a pharmacy manager and staff who enjoy customer facing roles.

"We are relying on community support in our journey together in order to ensure a sustainable, user-friendly pharmacy service to the community of Cambourne," said Mr Modi.

# CAMBOURNE CRIER OCTOBER 2023 CAMBOURNE TOWN COUNCIL

Cambourne Speed Limit Reduction Following the publication of the Parish plan in 2017 and a consultation with residents, the Town Council has been working with the County Council to get a blanket 20mph speed limit in Cambourne and a reduction in the speed limit on Cambourne Road.

With this in mind the Council surveyed all the roads in Cambourne to establish their layout, design speed (much of Cambourne was designed to be a maximum of 20mph) and any traffic calming. This was to support a Privately Funding Highway Improvements (PFHI) initiative application to the County Council. This was submitted in August 2018.

The County Council started working on the design of the scheme ready for a consultation. They produced a guide price for the work and funds were set aside in the Town Council budget to cover the cost. This was, however, delayed due to the County Council diverting staff to deal with COVID. Once the County Council returned to normal, work was recommenced on the design of the scheme.

This was again put temporarily on hold as the Government had announced a source of funding the County Council could use through the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority to implement the speed reduction throughout Cambourne. The design was then finalised and the County Council went out with a formal consultation between 5-28th July 2023.

Following the consultation, the town Council received the following statement: In July 2023, the County Council published a proposal to introduce a 20mph speed limit zone covering the builtup area of Cambourne and a 30mph speed limit on Cambourne Road (between the A428 and the town).

The County Council received objections to the proposals, so the matter had to be



formally determined by senior officers in consultation with the local County Councillor.

The decision was to go ahead with the 20mph speed limit zone covering the town. However, in respect of Cambourne Road, after careful consideration of the characteristics of the road and taking into account comments received, including from Cambridgeshire Police, the decision was taken that a more suitable speed limit for Cambourne Road would be 40mph.

You can find more information, including a report and the formal decision record on our Delegated Decision Meeting 11-09-23 page. The next steps are that the County Council is working on the delivery of the speed limits with their contractor so that the scheme can be delivered by 31st March 2024. The Town Council will keep the residents updated on progress.




# Alzheimer's disease: Volunteer to tackle dementia

Stemnovate is a Cambridge-based biotech company that provides a drug discovery platform. The company has added new offices and research space at Cambourne Business Park. The company aims to accelerate drug discovery, ensuring safe and targeted treatments while reducing animal testing.

The company is a recipient of several prestigious grants. Among them is a million-pound co-funding from Innovate UK.

This year, Stemnovate established a collaboration with the Babraham Institute to create a brain cell model to study Alzheimer's disease.

Conventionally, researchers require brain samples for such studies, but they are hard to obtain. Stemnovate has unique technology to convert a pinch of skin biopsy or a few Millilitres of blood to stem cells and then direct these cells into brain cells. Dr Ruchi Sharma, CEO of Stemnovate said, "These lab-made brain cells can provide information on disease processes and will be used to test new medicines".

You can make a huge difference by volunteering to participate in this research. We are requesting people who have family members with Alzheimer's to contact us for participation.

#### Cambourne and **Cambridge transport and** anti fraud measures

It has been a busy week and a busy month. I attended Cambourne Festival, held in the town's community centre, meeting stall holders and councillors. I was very happy trying some of the food on offer. I won a pineapple in the raffle, which I ate with friends.

My team and I wrote, stuffed and posted over 4,000 letters to residents of Cambourne about upcoming transport improvements, such as the dualling of the A428 and new train station. I welcomed the local Labour and Liberal

Democrats pressing the pause button on the hated Cambridge congestion charge, which I have been campaigning strongly against. However, they won't confirm they would never bring it back. My fear is that they are simply shelving it until the general election to deny voters the chance to have their say on it, and will then bring it back. The collapse of the congestion charge does bring into question the future of the Greater Cambridge Partnership.

As the PM's Anti-Fraud Champion, I have continued negotiations with tech firms including Meta to get them to introduce systems to stop fraudsters abusing their platforms. I spoke at a conference on fraud to fund managers, and listened in to a focus group feeding into an upcoming public awareness campaign.

#### Freedom of speech in a democracy

#### Freedom of speech in a democracy is something I think we can all agree is vital to a healthy society.

However, equally, residents of Cambourne are entitled to want their town to be kept as smart as possible for their visitors.

For the last three months one resident of South Cambridgeshire has exercised his rights with great impact by leaving a van with banners on it at the entrance to our town. The van was finally removed by South Cambridgeshire District Council on 14th September after it was vandalised overnight and declared to be dangerous. You may wonder why the van was

left there for so long. Well, I can assure you that Councillor Leeming and I were in almost constant contact with both the district council and the housing developers who actually own the land in the middle of Cambourne Road where the van was placed. There was something of an impasse over responsibility, and this led to neither organisation being willing to take action to remove the van.

This was very disappointing, and we will continue to seek to get them to accept responsibility for any such incidents in the future.

The person who owns the van is in an ongoing dispute with the district council and has been clear he intends to put another van on the spot; we will be seeking to get the council and the developers to work together much more quickly the next time.

- Be kind: kindness is good for everyone, whether through volunteering or just a smile or friendly word. - Eat well and keep moving: looking after our bodies helps our mental health and exercise releases hormones that reduce feelings of stress. - Avoid food and drink high in sugar or caffeine and eat a balanced diet with plenty of fruit and vegetables.

- Plan things to look forward to: whether meeting a friend, organising a trip or watching a favourite film, planning is good for our mental wellbeing and sense of hope.

Do you ever pause to reflect as you look around at the Universe of which we are a part? I recently discovered online videos featuring an old friend, who is now a Professor of Astrophysics at Oxford University. She talked about the awe, which is almost universal, when people contemplate the heavens. Of course, this sense of awe is not always connected with a belief in God. Many of us will have watched an excited Professor Brian Cox on television talking about the nature of the Universe without any reference to God. But for my friend there is a part of the Bible that often comes to mind as she pursues her work. When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them? (Psalm 8 v.3-4) We are small and seemingly insignificant beings, awed at the magnitude of the Creation, and yet God cares for us. Every autumn churches, schools and communities celebrate the harvest. We are invited to be grateful for a world in which a vast interplay of natural processes and human actions leads to the food upon which we all rely. Gazing at the heavens, walking beside a field of wheat, harvesting tomatoes in a garden or eating a tasty meal. These can all lead to a sense of wonder and a sense of gratitude, especially when we remember to pause.


# A dramatic evening

When we first arrived in Korea, we spent a week exploring the capital, Seoul, learning about the city, its inhabitants and the Korean culture before moving onto the Jamboree campsite located at Saemangeum.

The people of South Korea are some of the nicest people I have ever met.

The experience on the Jamboree site itself was like nothing else. Even though we unfortunately ended up leaving the Jamboree site early due to the weather, we did have enough time to meet people from all different backgrounds and cultures, make friends and trade gifts and mementos, which was a very special opportunity for me and many others.

While in Korea we took part in multiple activities. One of my most memorable was getting the opportunity to go to the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) where North and South Korea meet each other. This was a very special opportunity as we never expected to be able to visit such a politically important place.

Another exciting activity I took part in was getting to visit

Seonunsa Temple, a Buddhist Temple in Gochang-Gun, where I got the opportunity to take part in a traditional tea drinking ceremony. This was also incredible special as I experienced a different culture and the way they follow religion.



Finally, I was lucky enough to get an access-all-areas tour of the UK Embassy!

I feel that the experience has really benefited and developed me as a person. Even though the Jamboree wasn't exactly what we all expected, we learned to be resilient in the face of challenging conditions and that teamwork, no matter the conditions, means you can succeed and have fun.

It truly was a once in a lifetime opportunity and I consider myself so lucky to have experienced it first hand.

# Fly Tipping in Cambs

South Cambs District Council (SCDC) is determined to crack down on illegally dumped rubbish and has prioritised it as a key objective in its Business Plan by:

· Prompt clearance of rubbish to reduce further occurrences at the same site.

• Deterring criminal activity using 'fly tippers under investigation' stickers to highlight ongoing investigations.

· Joint roadside check initiatives with the Police, MHRC and other partners.

· Fly tipping is a criminal offence which can result in a fixed Penalty Notice of up to £400 or could end up in court with fines of up to £50,000 or even a prison sentence.

Councillor Henry Batchelor, Lead Cabinet member for Environmental Services, said: "Sadly, many people are conned into thinking they are having their waste removed responsibly by answering 'man with a van' ads on social media and have

no idea that their rubbish is destined to be fly tipped. What many people also don't realise is they are then responsible and could be fined for not properly checking the removal business was a reputable waste collection service."

#### South Cambs is urging residents to do the right thing and properly get rid of their rubbish by:

· Consider giving it away for free on Facebook, Gumtree or taking it to your local charity shop.

· If possible, reuse, repair or recycle your items before getting rid of them.

• Ensure you choose a reputable waste carrier disposal service.

 SCDC can arrange for collection of bulky items for many common household goods. They will collect a maximum of nine items per collection. Up to three items can be booked for the minimum charge of £32.50. Additional items are then £5.50 each.

• Take your rubbish to one of Cambridgeshire's Household Recycling Centres.



Wednesdays 4-5pm: 11-12 year olds


