Community Cinema for Cambourne?

Local people voted a cinema amongst their most desired additional amenities for the town in the latest survey for the

Town Plan. With this in mind, the Cambourne Village College Charitable Trust is now working with the Village College to create a community cinema venue in the new Sixth Form Centre, due to open in September 2024.

This will enhance the facilities for students studying performing arts and provide a separate cinema venue for Cambourne and surrounding villages.

With the capacity to show top-ranking box-office films just weeks after release and live satellite broadcasts of west-end theatre and opera, this latest venture will provide an exciting new amenity.

This is an ambitious project for the town; it will rely on the support of Cambourne Village College and local people for its set-up and ongoing success, but with a comfortable 200-seat venue, excellent facilities and free parking, we have the potential to create a thriving community cinema. It could grow to host several weekly performances with wide-ranging appeal.



Accessing an NHS Dentist in South Cambs

I am aware that NHS Dentistry can be difficult to access in South Cambs. I attended a meeting with the Chancellor Jeremy Hunt with a dozen other East of England MPs, to discuss priorities for the upcoming Autumn Statement, due in November. We all made the case for the Treasury to fund contract reforms for NHS dentists. The current contract gives dentists little incentive to treat NHS patients, and it is far too difficult to access NHS dentistry in many parts of the country.

I also pushed other tax changes that I believe will spur growth - in particular, we need to do

more to help small businesses.

I welcomed the news that fraud against the individual fell by 13% in the year to the end of June. The number of offences had dropped to 3.3 million. Fraud is now at its lowest rates since 2018. As the Prime Minister's Anti-Fraud Champion, I was delighted: it is my job to meet this target, and it shows all the measures the Government, the police, regulators and industry are implementing are working.

Fraud is still the biggest form of crime, and there is still a lot more to do to put the fraudsters out of business. Tech firms in particular need to step to the plate. I also had a meeting with Home Secretary Suella Braverman to discuss the work I am driving across Government to combat fraud.

South Cambs Community Safety Partnership

As part of my role as your district councillor, I am a member of South Cambs Community Safety Partnership, a statutory partnership that brings together the council, police and probation, health and fire services.

We work together to reduce crime, disorder, substance misuse, anti-social behaviour and reoffending. Tackling domestic violence is a priority.

Domestic abuse takes place between people that are personally connected to each other and is abusive. It can be:

- (a) physical or sexual abuse,
- (b) violent or threatening behaviour;
- (c) controlling or coercive behaviour;
- (d) economic abuse such as withholding money or preventing someone working

(e) psychological or emotional abuse.

People of all backgrounds, cultures and religions can experience domestic abuse.

The majority of victims of domestic abuse are women, but it can happen to men in both heterosexual and same sex relationships and by people who identify as transgender or nongender. Domestic violence is taken very seriously by the police.

Men's Health - 20 years of Movember

This year Movember, the charity supporting men's health (and moustache growing) is celebrating 20 years.

Movember raises awareness of all aspects of men's health, both physical and emotional.

Although women are more likely to access mental health treatment and be diagnosed with mental health problems, more than three-quarters of suicides are men. Mental ill health is incredibly common and is often made worse by the challenges that life can bring. Relationship, financial or employment struggles can lead to significant distress and mental health problems.

Signs of this may include irritability, feeling hopeless or worthless and using alcohol or drugs to try and deal with feelings. Often people, particularly men may feel the need to 'tough it out' on their own. This isolation may prevent them from seeing a solution or connecting with those who can offer support. One of the biggest thing that can make a difference is asking how someone is feeling and don't be afraid to ask twice. Listening can be lifesaving even if you think you don't know what to say.

If you're worried, you can direct someone to their GP or to services that can support them (such as Mind) or call 111 and select the mental health option.

County Lines and Young People

Message for parents and communities supported by South Cambs Community Saftey Partnership

What is County Lines?

County lines is the name given to drug dealing where organised criminal groups use phone lines to move and supply drugs, usually from cities into smaller towns and rural areas. Any city, town or village could be targeted, and cases have been noted in Cambridgeshire.

"Line" usually refers to the telephone line/number/sim card on which customers can place their order to buy drugs.

How are children involved?

The people with the most control and making the most money won't risk carrying drugs and meeting customers in case this raises suspicions and brings them to the attention of the police. Children are easy to intimidate or bribe, and less likely to be viewed suspiciously by authorities. They are also easy to replace in this "runner" role if they are found out by authorities.

My kid wouldn't do that!

The relationship is likely to begin as one that the child thinks will be positive. The child may be offered an easy, one-off task to earn the money they desire to fit in with friendship groups. They might be approached in person, via a friend or with innocuous-looking social media posts. If the child thinks this person is their friend and offering them an easy way to earn money then they



may not consider it serious enough to overtly tell their grown-up about until they are already in debt and feel trapped.

There are factors such as time in care, exclusion from school or placement in alternative education provision, living in poverty, special educational needs and disabilities that can leave some children more vulnerable to being exploited BUT all children are vulnerable.

So how can I tell?

Signs that you can be alert to include:

- Having more than one mobile phone, or being unusually anxious about letting it out of their sight or you trying to look at it.
- Unexplained money, clothes or gifts.
- Missing school or college, or going missing from home.
- Uncharacteristic changes in behaviour.
- Using new vocabulary such as "Going country", "OT", "Trapping".



The Vine's Yr 4 visits Burwell House

Between 2nd-4th October 2023, The Vine's Year 4 went on their first residential visit to Burwell House. Burwell, Cambridgeshire. Burwell House is a grand, beautifully decorated house which sits on 3 acres of land. It was built in 1787 and was enjoyed as a family home for many generations. In 1964, it was bought by Cambridgeshire County Council for £15,000 and today, it welcomes around 80 primary schools on residential visits each year. Year 4 were ecstatic to be one of these visitors this year.

During their 2-night visit, Year 4 completed a range of teambuilding and Geography based activities. These included: map reading, tree guessing, shelter building, fire lighting, orienteering, and other physical activities

Whilst there, Year 4 also enjoyed a quiz night and a cozy film night. They also thoroughly enjoyed the delicious food served during family-style mealtimes.

ADVERTISE IN CAMBOURNE CRIER

"Advertising in Cambourne Crier worked for me"

As a Cambourne resident, I got to know my neighbours and have a good relationship. After an informal chat one sunny afternoon in 2019, my (carpenter) neighbour Martin Krzak and I decided to go into business together creating a building company we called Great Cambourne Construction (which is now re-named Greater Cambridge Construction).

Starting a new business is a challenge and armed with the less than comforting knowledge that 20% of new businesses go under in the first year, and 60% within five years, we did not underestimate the challenges ahead, particularly marketing the business and choosing the right places to advertise.

Getting a website was an early start, but this is not a panacea since it takes a long time for Google to register the site - and how to get it onto page 1 of an internet search remains a mystery.

Traditional media advertising therefore remained a very important way of reaching customers and it was essential to us that we brought in business straight away, although we appreciated that it can take several months to get recognised and get regular enquiries.

Dipping our Toe in the Water

It was not a difficult decision to dip our toe into the water and advertise in *Cambourne Crier*. What we did not anticipate was how easy it was because after an initial email conversation with Peter and Janet at Pendrill Publications (who publish *Cambourne Crier*), Peter quickly created an advertisement for us at no cost to ourselves. This was not a *Saachi and Saachi*, but it got across the message of who were were as a company and the services Great Cambourne Construction provided.

When you consider advertising, it is easy to waste money on adverts that simply do not work, so you have to be clear who you want to reach (your target audience) and with Great Cambourne Construction, our demographic was pretty straightforward as "home owners in Cambourne", so for us, *Cambourne Crier* was the perfect publication. Furthermore, Great Cambourne Construction was Cambourne based, and we understood property in our own town.

The phone rang the same day as the advert appeared

What we did not expect was the phone to ring the same day as the advert appeared and continue ringing throughout the month! We expected a delay of at least a couple of months before the business found its feet, but in the very first month of advertising we were busy visiting customers, installing kitchen appliances, building kitchens, quoting for bathrooms and later even built a giant rabbit hutch for one lucky bunny!

What we discovered was that *Cambourne Crier* is well read by residents of Cambourne and many of them actively target local companies to do their work, and advertising in *Cambourne Crier* gives residents of Cambourne the reassurance that they are dealing with local companies who care about Cambourne and the services they are providing.

■ Enough business in Cambourne

As months went by, there was no need to advertise in publications in other areas, because we had enough business coming in from Cambourne, and as a close knit community, quite a number of enquiries were from word of mouth, after recommendations from people who had work done



by Great Cambourne Construction, all of which began with *Cambourne Crier*.

We soon had to employ additional people and took on larger projects including total house renovations, extensions, bathroom fitting, garden decking as well as all general building work such as removing walls to create more living space inside of a house. One customer asked us to build them a house.

We are also now members of the Federation of Master Builders.

■ Adverting also generates work outside of Cambourne What surprised us was that adverts in *Cambourne Crier* were seen quite widely and one of the largest jobs we got within months of starting was a total renovation of a terraced house in the centre of Cambridge, which had not been updated since the 1970s. The owner lived in South London!

So if you are thinking about advertising in *Cambourne Crier*, expect enquiries throughout South Cambs and beyond.

■ Advertising in *Cambourne Crier* has been essential for success

Advertising in *Cambourne Crier* has been an essential part of the success and expansion of Greater Cambridge Construction and could also work for your business no matter how large or small. This is a useful checklist of points to consider:

Have your say on SCDC's homelessness strategy

South Cambs District Council has a responsibility to prevent homelessness and receives on average 453 homeless applications each year.

In recent years, more people have approached the Council for support once they are already homeless - rather than when they are threatened with homelessness. Getting in touch with the Council before becoming homeless increases the options and support available. During the 12 months up until the end of June 2023, the Council prevented 210 households from becoming homeless, by providing support through its Housing Advice and Options service.

Locally and nationally, the main cause of homelessness is family and friends no longer being able to house someone, followed by end of a tenancy agreement, with domestic abuse being the third highest cause. People who approach the Council for support with homelessness tend to be of working age, with very few applications from those under 18 or over 65. Also, more applicants are employed than solely in receipt of

Now, South Cambridgeshire District Council is set to begin a consultation into an update to its Homeless Strategy. This is a document that all councils must have - and regularly review.

There are two priorities being proposed. The first is to provide homeless prevention, early intervention, and support. This includes the need to promote early intervention, increasing the opportunities the Council has to prevent

homelessness. Part of this work is also ensuring that the Council prevents and intervenes to resolve rough sleeping. Early and targeted money advice for those on a low income, including those in employment, to help with affordability. Ongoing support and assistance for tenants and landlords in the private rented sector. Ensuring the Council provides an inclusive service, taking account of all protected characteristics, particularly due to the increase in domestic abuse and high levels of homeless applications from those with mental and physical health needs.

The second priority being proposed is to provide suitable housing options. This includes: Improving the housing options available for single people, including those for whom shared accommodation would not be suitable. Reducing the use of bed and breakfast accommodation. Building new Council Homes and Housing Association properties in South Cambridgeshire. Increasing the provision of access to privately rented accommodation including through Shire Homes Lettings - the Council's non-profit property management service which operates a private sector leasing scheme.

The Council is encouraging local people to take part in this consultation. The consultation runs until 5pm on Friday 5 January 2024 and responses can be made using an online form. 
