Wildlife Trust BCN - wild futures and wild presents

Working in conservation is a rewarding job, and like all careers comes with its highlights and difficulties.

This month the Trust's West Cambs 100s Youth Ranger session on Friday 22 December is a talk from Wildlife Trust BCN Communities and Education Officer Rebecca Neal on careers in conservation, with practical advice for young people interested in how to get into the sector, an informal discussion and a walk on Cambourne nature reserve.

Rebecca says: "I have been working for environmental charities for around 18 years and in that time have lived with rare bats, held a dormouse, been paid to watch badgers, been hissed at by adders, used a bathyscope (glass-bottomed bucket to see underwater) to search for rare freshwater pearl mussels and met wildlife presenters such as Lolo Williams and Bill Oddie.

My jobs have always been about connecting people with nature, and there have been so many shared moments with people who have climbed a tree for the first time, held a slug, identified a butterfly, found a water stick insect, saved a toad or simply felt better after some time outdoors. Seeing wildlife is always exciting no matter how many times I've pond-dipped or heard bats on a detector - it's a privilege to do what I love for a job."

Youth Ranger sessions are for young people aged 11-17yrs passionate about wildlife and environmental issues: connecting with young people empowering them to take action for wildlife together and inspire others. Anyone interested please get in touch rebecca.neal@wildlifebcn.org

Light Up Cambourne update!

Latest from LUC:

If you were wondering what has happened to the Light Up Cambourne (LUC) group, we're here with an update.

The truth is that with the current number of volunteers, holding a large event such as the switch on is completely beyond our resources.

In order to keep 'trimming the town' and in recognition of the above, two years ago we decided to change tack by using the money raised from our fundraising events to increase the amount of Christmas lights on display in the town.

This has proven to be both a costly and long process - the cost just to get power to a single lamp post is well in excess of £300 on top of which there is the hiring of access equipment (cherry pickers) to put the lights up and take them down after the festive season ends. The light displays themselves, as you can imagine, aren't cheap either!

However, thanks to the generosity of those who attend our events throughout the year we are making progress! Those of you with sharp eyesight will have noticed power connections have been installed on some of the lamp posts on the Sundial and Morrisons roundabouts and at the junction with the A1198 at the end of School Lane.

This is just the start of a process that will see further light displays being installed as funds allow. (Now is a good time to explain that LUC receives no funding from anywhere other than money raised by holding our events). We are indebted to the town council grounds team who put the lights up and take them down again.

The lights have been chosen and the order for the first tranche of lamppost displays is now under way. Whilst we hope to have some in place for this year's festive season we have to be realistic, knowing how long the process has taken so far, it may well not be until 2024 when they are on display.

If you've yet to sample one of our events which include bingo nights, quizzes and



even murder mystery Who Dunnits? then come along! They are all good fun and you are waited on hand, foot and finger (well nearly!) by the LUC committee serving you drinks and food at your table. Details of forthcoming events are posted on our Facebook page and here in Cambourne Crier.

Cambourne MP appointed Minister of Transport

I was phoned by the Chief Whip, who offered me the position of Minister of Transport, responsible for the decarbonisation and future of transport.

It is a huge agenda, covering the roll out of electric cars, trucks, buses and trains, e-bikes, spaceports, and autonomous vehicles.

The head of propriety and ethics at the Cabinet Office then phoned me to check I had no conflicts (I don't), and late in the evening, the King formally announced my appointment.

I arrived at my new office at 8am the next morning and met the Secretary of State for Transport to discuss the key priorities. The reshuffle continued in the Lords, and by the end of the day, I had also been given responsibility for aviation – which includes airline safety, airports, drones, and sustainable aviation.

It is an immense and immensely exciting brief. I have two main pieces of legislation – the zero emissions vehicle mandate, which will require all car companies to sell 80% zero emission vehicles by 2030; and the automated vehicles bill, which will lay legislation enabling self-driving cars.

On Thursday morning, I attended my first board of the Department for Transport. This weekend I will go to Dubai to represent the UK at a global summit of aviation ministers to



negotiate an agreement to cut emissions from aviation, through using sustainable aviation fuels.

Countries have already agreed that aviation should reach net zero by 2050, and the next step is to agree on how to do that. The UK is committed to the first step of having 10% sustainable aviation fuels by 2030. I spent the week in long debriefing sessions with officials.

I met Jacob Young, the Local

Government Minister, to talk about the problems with the Greater Cambridge Partnership. The GCP has spent large sums of public money not delivering very much, with its failed projects including the Cambridge congestion charge, which I campaigned against. I was shocked to see that at a Cambridgeshire County Council meeting, Liberal Democrat Councillors openly discussed their plans to bring the congestion charge back after the general election.

I urged Michael Gove, the Secretary of State for Housing and Regional Development, to fund a feasibility study into a mass transit system for Cambridge, such as the proposal for a light rail system proposed by the campaign group Cambridge Connect.

The GCP could fund a feasibility study, but they are institutionally committed to off-road guided busways.

Cambourne under the microscope

I recently met the developers who are planning a new high street for Cambourne. It has been one of my campaigns to get Cambourne the high street it deserves.

I have also visited Cambourne Village College to meet the new head teacher – the new sixth form that is being built there and will open next year is very exciting.

I met with Zeiss, the electron microscope company, which employs 300 people in Cambourne, and who are upset with South Cambs District Council pushing their own development next to the factory, which will create vibrations and electromagnetic fields that mean Zeiss would have

to close the factory down if it went ahead. The District Council is seriously conflicted because it is deciding on a planning application on its own development that it has a financial interest in.

It would be a real shame for the UK to lose its leading electron microscope company because of bad planning decisions.

They just need to put in a 30m buffer zone between the development and the Zeiss factory, but the Council have refused to do this.

I have launched a survey on what constituents think about SCDC's four day week, where the council have decided to give all council staff a day off each week with no reduction in pay. I received over 1000 responses in the first 24 hours – and residents are not happy about it. The Government also says it is not good value for the taxpayer for councils to give workers a free day off each week.

Addressing the escalating concern of social isolation and loneliness among the elderly in our communities, I have taken proactive steps to enhance their well-being. This includes organising regular group excursions, small trips to garden centres, group cooking sessions, tea parties and group lunches in Cambourne.

Advocating for the retention of Bus 18, I attended a meeting where parents, local councillors, and Mayor Nik Johnson were present. During the meeting, the Whippet Commercial manager pledged (though not fully promised) to make efforts to maintain Bus 18 during school hours for college-bound children.

Celebrating community achievements, I am pleased to announce that Cambourne's local charity, CamCare UK, and CERC have been selected as Elektra's Charity Community Partner 2023 - a prestigious global recognition in the electronics industry for outstanding performance, innovation, and contributions.

Over the past three months, I have organised and hosted several events in Cambourne, including International Languages, Diwali, an Art Exhibition and Sale, and a Christmas Party. Serving as a Trust Governor at a local Primary School in Cambourne, I actively contribute to educational initiatives. Additionally, I am a member of Cambourne Village College Charitable Trust which is endeavouring to bring a cinema to Cambourne to foster community engagement through cultural and cinematic experiences.

Bowel cancer awareness

Bowel cancer, sometimes called colorectal cancer, is the fourth most common type of cancer in the UK.

The main symptoms of bowel cancer are blood in poo; a change in your normal bowel movements lasting for more than three weeks (such as looser poo and needing to poo more often) and lower abdominal (tummy) pain.

However, these symptoms are very common and there are many other causes.

The risk of bowel cancer is linked to unhealthy lifestyles and increased if you have a history of bowel polyps or have a close relative with the

condition. Usually bowel cancer affects those over 50 but it can affect younger people, so anyone of any age should report their symptoms.

All healthcare professionals are very used to dealing with bowel problems and you should never be embarrassed about talking to them.

Bowel cancer can be detected early making it much more likely to be curable. Everyone aged 60-74 is invited to do a FIT test at home every two years and those over 75 can also request a test if they want to. This test looks for hidden blood in the poo which may be an early sign of bowel cancer. Gradually the age of those who are invited to take this test is being reduced and will eventually include everyone aged 50-74 Reference: www.nhs.uk or bowelcanceruk.org.uk

It is a source of disagreement in many families and workplaces about when to start playing Christmas music and put up the decorations. At one extreme some households have an embargo on Mariah Carey and tinsel until Christmas Eve, while others happily replaced pumpkins on their doorstep with Santa's sleigh at the beginning of November.

There is a long tradition among Christians that the period starting four Sundays before Christmas marks Advent, so this year it starts on 3rd December. Advent is a season of preparation leading up to Christmas, which is understood as marking the church's new year because we see the birth of Jesus as the beginning of a whole new creation. In Advent we are invited both to prayerful reflection and to hopeful anticipation.

Light in the darkness. Hope amidst despair. Confidence that God is working out his purposes. These are Advent themes.

At Christmas we see a baby and anticipate all that will be achieved through that life, death and resurrection ... but in Advent we are one step further back, still awaiting the birth. In the midst of a troubled world Advent points to something better being brought into being, but reminds us that we often have to wait in darkness before we experience the dawn. And sometimes when God is doing something remarkable it can begin by looking rather ordinary, even though the whole world is being changed.

May you experience light and hope this Advent and encounter afresh the joy of Christmas. **Revd Bill Miller**
