Cambourne Town Council is supporting South Cambs Community Safety Partnership in raising awareness about County Lines.

County Lines awareness from South Cambs Community Safety Partnership The November issue of Cambourne Crier printed an article about County Lines including an explanation of how ANY young person can be vulnerable to being exploited. A relationship between a drug dealer and a local young person may begin in a way that feels friendly and beneficial to the young person, and so they may not tell their parents the details, or realise they are at risk. Signs that adults can look out for include:

- Having more than one mobile phone, or being unusually anxious about letting it out of their sight or you trying to look at it.

- Unexplained money, clothes or gifts.
- Missing school or college, or going missing from home.

- Uncharacteristic changes in behaviour. IVESON (formerly PACE) have a wealth of resources for parents and carers who are concerned.

DOGS ON LEADS

- The Countryside Code of Conduct

Due to some recent concerns, we would like to remind dog owners to exercise their dogs on lead. Whilst we understand why owners may want to exercise off lead, particularly around the country park and lakes, it is important to remember that some people are not comfortable with dogs approaching them, or their dogs. Dogs off lead can also cause a disturbance to nesting birds and other wildlife. It also presents an opportunity for dogs to poo unnoticed and not being disposed of.

The Town Council follows the Countryside Code:

The Countryside Code

- Protect the Environment
- Take your litter home
- Leave no trace of your visit
- Take care with BBQS (where permitted)
- Do not light fires
- Always keep dogs under control and in sight
- Dog poo bag it and bin it, any public waste bin will do

- Care for nature – do not cause damage or disturbance

Spring joys with the Wildlife Trust

Enhancing the enjoyment and understanding of wildlife is a constant remit for the Wildlife Trust. The events programme was quieter over the colder wintry months, but now that spring is springing, here's a snap-shot of activities to engage with over the next few months in the patch between Gamlingay, Cambourne and Comberton.

Sit and chat in nature

Sessions are designed for those who want to enjoy nature on our reserves, alongside a sit down and a cuppa - we won't walk far! These are being held in Gamlingay Wood, 21 and 25 April 10-12ish, and on Cambourne nature reserve, 13 June and 4 July 10-12ish. Walks for adults

Spring wildflower strolls: 2-3 mile walks around our four local ancient woodland reserves:

Cambourne nature reserve is accessible with paths suitable for wheelchairs and pushchairs. Join us for a 'not-quite dawn chorus' on 5 May, and an evening summer stroll on 4 June. There's a longer walk from Cambourne to Bourn Windmill on 22 June, for those confident on more uneven terrain.

Cambourne is still without a High Street

I was able to meet the Prime Minister's newly appointed Towns Tsar, to discuss ways to improve Cambourne, which is still languishing without a High Street.

I also met campaigners for a unitary authority in Cambridgeshire. The county is blighted by too many layers of local government - the mayor of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, the County Council, district councils and parish councils. It is a recipe for political gridlock and enables unaccountable organisations like the GCP (Greater Cambridge Partnership). Those parts of the country that have gone down the unitary route tell me they are generally very pleased with it.

I had separate meetings with local leaders of the bus companies Whippet and Stagecoach, to push them to serve West Cambourne, which currently has no service or stop. This is a big planning failure because the requirements of buses in terms of turning circles wasn't accommodated when West Cambourne was laid out. Whippet agreed to get its X3 bus to stop just outside West Cambourne by the roundabout on the A1198 - it just needs the Combined Authority to install a physical bus stop.

This week, with Health Minister Lord Markham, I formally broke ground for the construction of the new Cambridge Cancer Research Hospital at the Biomedical Campus. The following day health minister Andrew Stephenson came to Cambridge to mark the start of enabling works for the Cambridge Children's Hospital.

My activities to help **Cambourne residents**

I have been busy since my last article in Cambourne Crier. I attended the climate and environment advisory committee meeting at the District Council and asked for the funding to help Cambourne Village College's Eco Club.

The experience of the pancake and egg-spoon race has inspired me to explore the potential of a community sports day. It is a day where families come together, generations unite and the community celebrates the spirit of sportsmanship.

I have advocated tirelessly across local government channels for the installation of seating provisions at Broad Street (opposite Morrisons) to address the prolonged wait times experienced by elderly residents with mobility constraints while awaiting buses. I am still pushing to have a bus stop in Cambourne for the 905 bus, for which discussions are ongoing.

As an active STEM ambassador, I am starting a new club to engage young people in a positive direction with academically oriented pursuits including astronomy, chess, 3D printing, electronics, hardware, origami, vedic maths, VR and drone technology, chemistry for children, HAM radio and rocketry.

I reported a number of crimes and safety issues to the Cambourne Community Support Partnership and Town Council, which were received by me from the residents encountering difficulties

I am working with the officers at District Council regarding fly tipping in Cambourne.

Neurodiversity and autism

Autism affects people in different ways and like all people, autistic people have individual strengths and weaknesses.

Some have limited speech, while others have very good language skills but tend to take things literally, struggle understanding tone of voice and need extra time to process information.

Autistic people can have difficulty recognising or understanding others' feelings although feel their own emotions intensely. They may appear insensitive and find it challenging to form friendships. Routines and patterns are often important which can lead to new ways of looking

at the world. Extreme sensitivity to sounds, touch, tastes and smells is common.

They can often become experts in a particular subject and enjoy sharing their knowledge. It used to be thought that autism was more common in boys. However, it is now thought that girls with autism may hide their symptoms better (masking) and many women are diagnosed well into adulthood. Parents who have children with autism (or suspect it) can feel isolated and the process to get a diagnosis can be long. A new group for parents to support one another is beginning in Cambourne soon and anyone who might find this helpful can contact Sue on naotp6e@gmail.com for more details.

Being told that you are interesting can be nice. Having a man of learning telling his subordinates they are unlikely to see another person like you and having many of them gather round in groups to ask you questions could seem very nice. That is unless all the people in question are doctors. As I was diagnosed with Miller Fisher Syndrome (MFS) which is one of the rare forms of a spectrum of Guillain-

Barré syndrome. That was bad for a while, I lost a great deal of functionality and had pain and spent a week in hospital. I was weakened by the treatment and have been unable to do much. It would make a decent time to throw myself a pity party. Although whilst certainly frustrated in my weakness and loss of being able to see straight I knew my recovery would come. However all thoughts of my current situation vanished when my boy Max was taken in to the hospital a week after me with a problem with his lymph nodes. In fact as I write this near midnight he is still there on his first



Pastor Donavan Bangs overnight hospital stay, still awaiting tests and scans. I'm still chatting with him online during the night as I cannot be there. Nothing quite hits you the same as when your child is sick. Your love for them superseeds your own needs. Your willingness to sacrifice for them, to endure for them and the pain you feel when unable to do anything is terrible. That is the same kind of love God feels for us. Except he could do something about it. Which is why Christ seeing us under the curse and penalty for

sin, sacrificed himself in our place that we might live in him. The forgiveness of sin and eternal life required a perfect sacrifice. As Sir Issac Watts said Love so amazing, so divine, Demands my soul, my life, my all. Now by the time you read this I pray all is physically well with both my family and yours. But as we approcah Easter perhaps it is time to take a closer look at that love of the Father shed abroad for us? To take a look at our spiritual health. Stay well Cambourne.
