Shedders build box for barn owls

Members of Cambourne Shed have been busy building a barn owl box for the Wildlife Trust.

Having already built one box for the Cambourne Reserve, a second box has now been built for use at the Wansford reserve near Peterborough. Reserve Officer Alexandre Audige-Soutter requested the box to replace a "very sad and rotten barn owl box that is of no use any more".

The owl box was constructed over two visits to the premises of Cambridge Shed (CAM Shed), which is based at Madingley Hall. Cambourne Shed has formed a partnership with CAM Shed that allows Cambourne based Shedders to become members of CAM Shed and take advantage of the active Shed premises. The premises are also used by Comberton Shedders.

Our thanks to Alex Barrett and everyone at CAM Shed for facilitating this partnership



that enables groups from three different areas to use the fantastic Shed at Madingley.

Cambourne Shedders will start work on a third owl box for potential use in Madingley Hall gardens.

Cambourne Shed continues to work with local Scout groups and the Town Council on potential premises in Cambourne.

County Lines (continued)

– a charity whose experience working with families and highlighting the role of parents and guardians in work to protect young people from exploitation is well-respected and gives a unique experience for both families and young people who may have only heard messaging from police or schools about this subject. Part of the presentation includes a parent with lived experience of supporting their child when they discovered they were being exploited – the sharing of this experience will remind us that criminals who exploit young people have a very well-developed and adaptable business model, we better understand how ANY young person can be tricked by their promises, and why it can sometimes feel hard to resist; as well as the helplessness and loneliness the parent can feel, and crucially early signs and support options that might help us all to take action before our children are dragged in more deeply.

The details of the event are Cambourne Soul Youth Building, 6:15pm entry for 6:30pm start, Wednesday 8th May. The session is open to any grown ups with an interest in supporting young people in our community, especially those with parental responsibility.

Light up Cambourne news





Cambourne Church Gardens

To celebrate 25 years since the first residents moved in to Cambourne in 1999, Cambourne Church is making a Silver Jubilee garden in the land around the church building.

Our first day's work on 24th February was blessed with sunshine and enthusiastic compost spreaders of all ages, who laid a cardboard base and composted greenwaste for us to grow vegetables for the Foodbank.

The second Saturday 9th March involved seed planting in modules and building compost bays for our own leaves and coffee grounds from 19 The Coffee House. Now we need to collect rainwater from the church roof to continute to keep the beds thriving.

With the advice of the Wildlife Trust we shall dedicate an area next to High Street for long grass where small creatures, bugs, and insect larvae can develop undisturbed, as well as taller plants for flowers and seedheads to encourage pollinators and birds.

To help shape the future of the remaining church land as an accessible place of welcome, sanctuary, remembrance, peace, produce and wildlife, we really need your ideas on what could be in the next phases of the design, so that we can try and shape



the future of the church Jubilee Garden for Cambourne residents, new and old.

Wildlife Trust walks and talks around Cambourne

Last year we trialled a few wild home-school sessions in Cambourne for families who are educating outside of school. We had a great time and found that young people benefitted from the small group size and flexible approach. This year we are expanding the offer to 15 sessions, split into three blocks of five families are welcome to attend these as one-offs, or as a short, or longer programme. The activities are child-led and run by a Level 3 trained Forest School Leader and experienced environmental educator: there is an early-bird discount and reduced cost for members.

Cambourne robots recharged

Starship Technologies has announced the installation of the first wireless charging station for its robots in Europe.

The Starship robots have become a familiar sight, delivering groceries to households in Cambourne from the Upper Cambourne Co-op.

You may have wondered where they sleep at night? Well quite simply the robots used to be collected from Cambourne, transported by van to Cambridge, recharged and then returned to Cambourne. Not any more!

Cambourne is leading the way... Thanks to a collaboration with Cambourne Town Council, a fleet of Starship robots will now recharge autonomously in between making grocery deliveries across Cambourne.

Since first launching its autonomous delivery service in Cambourne in May 2022, Starship's robots have become a popular sight in the neighbourhood. The on-demand, convenient and environmentally friendly service has helped cut down on car journeys and provided a valuable solution to people living with mobility challenges.

Starship first introduced wireless charging stations on George Mason University campus in the US over six months ago. The introduction of charging stations in Cambourne marks the first European installation.



Starship now expects to further reduce emissions in Cambourne as robots will no longer need to be taken away by van to recharge. Wireless charging is more energy-efficient, allowing the robots to charge up overnight, while they're sleeping. In this way, wireless charging will also lower the cost of providing autonomous delivery services in the long term.

John Vickery, Cambourne Town Clerk, commented: "For nearly two years now, Starship's robots have been embraced and widely welcomed as part of the local community. So we are very proud that Cambourne has been chosen as the location for the first European installation of wireless charging facilities for the robots."

The four-day week and the congestion charge

I worked with my team to scrutinise the latest report on the four-day week from South Cambridgeshire District Council and wrote a column about it for *Cambridge News*.

The only surprising thing about it was their honesty, admitting it is saving a fraction of the money they have previously been loudly claiming.

There has also been a dramatic increase in overtime, as staff struggle to do a week's work in four days, but the Lib Dems refuse to tell the residents paying those overtime bills what the cost of it is.

Is the congestion charge coming back? The much hated driving tax was dropped after our

campaign against it. But many local Liberal Democrat and Labour leaders have been open about wanting to bring it back after the general election. So this week I wrote to every single county and district councillor in South Cambridgeshire asking them to confirm on the record to voters that either they will not renew their support for the congestion charge after the general election, or if they do, it would only be after a referendum on it.

The only responses I have got back so far are from Conservatives, stating they will remain opposed to it. I should add that the congestion charge has nothing legally to do with clean air – I am the minister responsible for clean air policies in all towns and cities around the country, and I can confirm to you that Cambridge's air is cleaner than the national legal limits.

Cambourne 25: working for the people

Our town is 25 this year, something for us to celebrate as we continue to grow and welcome new residents as well as reflecting on the great community we have built.

However, Cambourne has too often been poorly served in term of facilities, resources and safety. If we compare the way that the new town of Northstowe is being built we see that the cycle network and road crossings provision is far superior to that which we have in Cambourne.

We also lack a completed High Street and our Post Office provision remains woeful.

Therefore, working with my colleague Councillor

Helene Leeming, I have set up the Cambourne25 group which brings together officers and councillors from Cambourne Town Council. South Cambridgeshire District Council and Cambridgeshire County Council. We also have representatives from the developers who continue to enjoy the privilege of being able to build our homes and facilities, as well as local schools and other services. My aim as chair of this group is to ensure that once every two months, we get all the key partners in the same room discussing Cambourne's needs and find ways to get them delivered. In our first meeting in February we focussed on the need for a pedestrian crossing from Uplands Place to the High Street shops and the completion of the Swansley Lane cyclepath to the village college and primary school. I look forward to reporting back to you, the residents.

Epilepsy

Around 1 in 100 people in the UK have epilepsy. It is usually diagnosed after someone has had more than one seizure (although not all seizures are due to epilepsy).

Epilepsy can develop because of a genetic condition, damage to the brain caused by illness or injury or a problem with brain development.

Within the brain are millions of nerve cells which pass electrical signals to each other but if these signals are disrupted, an epileptic seizure can occur. Seizures can look quite different for different people. For some, they may fall to the ground shaking (tonic-clonic seizures), others may appear to 'go blank' or seem confused.

Often people may have some sense of warning that they are about to have a seizure and although flashing lights can trigger seizures in some people with epilepsy, this is fairly unusual.

If you witness someone having a tonic-clonic seizure, it is important not to restrain them and only move them if in immediate danger; place something soft under their head if possible and turn them into the recovery position only after they have stopped shaking.

Knowing how long the seizure lasts is important; if it is more than five minutes or they have never had a seizure before, call an ambulance on 999.

CAMBOURNE CHURCH

The data is in and, according to The Global Mind Project's "Mental State of the World" report, the UK is the second most miserable country on Earth. Which is somehow worse than coming dead last.

Most people I've talked to seem to greet this quite cheerfully - it speaks, perhaps, to a pessimistic strain in our national self-image - and it is not wrong to leaven sadness with humour. But we ought not to be flippant or dismissive of such emotions, nor ignore their reality in our lives.

In the Bible, grief and sorrow are regular themes, bringing with them a recognition that God is with us in sad times: they are not evidence of His abandonment. One of the most famous verses insists that 'even...[in] the valley of the shadow of death' God is with us and comforts us; the shortest tells us that 'Jesus wept' even God's son knew, felt and shared in our sorrows. We are also reminded that our emotions are but passing things: 'weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning'.

The week's activities served as a testament to the power of storytelling in shaping young minds and nurturing a lifelong passion for reading.


