Work gets underway on A428 dualling from Caxton Gibbet to Black Cat

Residents of Cambourne may have noticed the extensive roadworks on the A428 heading west towards St Neots.

The A428 between St Neots and Caxton Gibbet is the only remaining stretch of single carriageway between the M1 near Milton Keynes and Cambridge.

The work being carried out will upgrade the road between Caxton Gibbet (the A428 roundabout between West Cambourne to the south and Papworth Everard to the north) and the Black Cat roundabout on the A1, creating a new 10 mile stretch of dual carriageway.

National Highways says that the new road will:

- Cut journey times by more than a third at peak times, saving up to 10 minutes each way and as much as 1.5 hours over a working week.
- Cut congestion on the existing road, removing the temptation for drivers to use local roads to avoid delays: the aim is to reduce cars on local roads by up to 4,000.
- Maintain biodiversity and improve air and noise quality for communities.

National Highways is also undertaking archaeological investigations: "Before we start to build, our archaeologists carefully excavate and record what's beneath the surface. We are carrying out advanced work around our proposed route - so you may see us in fields and land nearby.

"This means local people, communities and enthusiasts discover more about the heritage of the region. By doing this work now, we can sensitively excavate any finds, help keep the overall construction programme as short as possible and reduce disruption for the local community."

The £1bn scheme between St Neots and Cambourne is the biggest road project in the country and involves the construction of many bridges and roundabouts, to ensure traffic will be able to flow freely and uninterrupted both along the new A428 and the A1.

National Highways have also spent £1m providing protections for great crested newts, in particular the barriers alongside the existing A428.

Coronation living heritage fund

South Cambs District Council working with the Town Council has been successful in receiving a grant from the Coronation Living Heritage Fund to plant at least three Micro Woods (each about the size of a tennis court); these are to be planted in Cambourne in the Autumn. The CLHF is designed to create a permanent legacy for the King's Coronation. The Micro Woods follow an innovative way of planting to develop a new wood quickly. More information will follow in the coming months including how the community can help with the planting and establishment of the Micro Woods. Below is an extract from the Forestry Commission web site about the concept of Micro Woods:

"The creation of micro woods, using a planting method pioneered by Japanese botanist Dr Akira Miyawaki, creates miniature woodlands in urban areas. We are excited to see these develop within communities as they emulate a more naturalistic growth to a local area, and by planting mixed native species at close densities in small patches,

we see higher survival rates. They also require minimal maintenance after two to three years and have lower vulnerability to vandalism, helping to contribute to a lasting heritage."

As part of raising awareness of County Lines a session has been arranged.

The session will be presented by Ivison Trust (formerly PACE) – a charity whose experience working with families and highlighting the role of parents and guardians in work to protect young people from exploitation is well respected and gives a unique experience for both families and young people who may have only heard messaging from police or schools about this subject.

Part of the presentation includes a parent with lived experience of supporting their child when they discovered they were being exploited – the sharing of this experience will remind us that criminals who exploit young people have a very well-developed and adaptable business model, we better understand how ANY young person can be tricked by their promises, and why it can sometimes feel hard to resist; as well as the helplessness and loneliness the parent can feel, and crucially early signs and support options that might help us all to take action before our children are dragged in more deeply.

The details of the event are Cambourne Soul Youth Building, 6:15pm entry for 6:30 start, Wednesday 8th May. The session is open to any grown ups with an interest in supporting young people in our community, especially those with parental responsibility.

South Cambs Community Safety Partnership will be providing more opportunities for community members to learn more; please keep an eye on local channels.



There are various useful measures which will help us take care of this fantastic nature reserve: please keep dogs out of lakes and ponds - they disturb sediment, covering the leaves of underwater plants and restricting their ability to photosynthesise and oxygenate the water.

Feeding ducks and swans brings animals out of the water, making them vulnerable to attack by dogs, and also more likely to approach people which not everyone likes! So do avoid feeding them or getting close to them, especially when on nests.

Do take care to reduce any risk of fire - cigarette butts and BBQs can easily start fires and please stick to paths (including dogs) due to ground nesting birds on the nature reserve (skylarks used to nest here, but no longer use the site).

Next month we're all getting **30 Days Wild!** The annual challenge event, where everyone involved does one wild thing a day throughout the month of June. This year marks a milestone for the flagship initiative as it celebrates its 10th anniversary next month. The nature challenge has grown from 12,000 participants in its first year to over half a million last year alone.

30 Days Wild has helped people to get outside, enjoy and connect with nature as part of their every- day lives. This June promises to be a bumper one – people of all ages and abilities are urged to participate and the Wildlife Trusts are offering free herb seeds and inspirational guide to everyone who signs-up to do a small, wild thing every day during June.

Expanding towns need an expanding police force

I recently met the Chief Constable of Cambridgeshire Police. We discussed how to reduce crime and boost the police presence in Cambourne and St Neots. Both towns are growing rapidly, and facing problems with antisocial behaviour. He agreed that the expanding towns need an expanded police presence.

I also met with Peter Freeman, Chair of Homes England and the Cambridge Delivery Group, about the Government's plans for development around Cambridge. The Government recently said it will set up a Cambridge Growth Company to oversee the promotion of development. Government thinking on the plans - now called Cambridge 2050 - is embryonic, and contrary to speculation, there has been no decision made about the locations of where new housing may go, or the governance around it. I have repeatedly stressed the need for local authorities to be involved in any decision-making and the very real problems with infrastructure and water shortages.

I visited the new Movement Surgical Hub at Addenbrookes, which opened in November, providing 40 additional beds and three state-of-the-art operating theatres, dedicated to orthopaedic surgery. This will allow an extra 2,700 procedures a year and reduce waiting times. Building has also begun on Cambridge Cancer Research Hospital and Children's Hospital.

Work has continued, focusing on key actions that our town needs, including the pedestrian crossing outside Uplands Place, completing the cycle path to Cambourne Village College on Swansley Lane, upgrading our muddy paths and steps towards a permanent Post Office for our town. We are campaigning hard to make sure Cambourne gets the attention it deserves and that

developers' contributions are spent promptly on our much needed facilities.

This is not a formal consultation meeting, but is an opportunity to ask any questions you may have. This is the first stage of the statutory consultation process.

What image comes to mind when we think about the journey of grief? A nice, straight, clean line with a fixed end point, perhaps? After which life as we knew it returns? In reality, the experiences of those who have been bereaved can more closely resemble a tangled ball of wool with no tangible end. Grief can be a messy business - with big emotions with which we are often unfamiliar, both for the bereaved and for those supporting them.

Queen Elizabeth II quoted Dr Colin Murray Parkes when she said that 'grief is the price for love' - grief is a consequence of love. We grieve because we love and we continue to love (despite the physical absence of the ones we love) and therefore grieve. It is an ongoing journey.

In John's gospel, we can learn a lot from a seemingly insignificant group of people who supported the bereaved family of someone who had died. Insignificant? Maybe - they are not named, nothing is recorded about what they said, they can be completely overlooked in the story. But their impact would have been considerable - they came simply to be present, to console, to comfort but not to fix. They did not stay away because witnessing grief can be uncomfortable.

It is this quiet, supportive presence that we, at Cambourne Church, are aiming to provide at The Harbour Bereavement Café - a monthly, informal drop-in café for those on the journey of bereavement and carrying their personal tangled ball of wool.

Looking Up.

Some folks this month will be celebrating Ascension Day, A day 40 days after the resurrection when Jesus returned to heaven. The ascension is not a big thing in our church as we tend to focus on not his departing but his eventual return.

Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

9 And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight.







CERC empowers young people through European CanSat Competition

Cambridge Electronics and Robotics Club (CERC) proudly embarked on a groundbreaking journey, igniting the passion for STEM among young minds across the nation through the European CanSat competition 2024. In our inaugural participation, CERC took on the mentorship of four dynamic teams, each representing different corners of our diverse landscape.

CERC mentored a team from Edinburgh, another from Aberdeen, and two from Cambridge, encompassing a total of 17 students hailing from 14 schools. Together, they embraced the challenge of designing and launching CanSats, miniature satellites nestled within the confines of a soft drink can. All four teams participated in their respective regional launches and all the teams have been awarded an Industrial Cadets Silver Award by the Engineering Development Trust.

The European CanSat Competition, an ESA Education initiative, serves as a beacon for project-based learning, nurturing essential STEM skills among European youth. Within the limited



volume of a CanSat, teams must ingeniously integrate all the critical subsystems of a satellite. Launched by a small rocket to heights of up to 1 km, these CanSats embark on their missions as they gracefully descend back to Earth.

At CERC, our commitment to fostering STEM education transcends boundaries. By extending our mentorship to teams scattered across diverse communities, we ensure that the transformative power of STEM reaches every corner of our nation. This inclusive approach not only cultivates innovation but also serves as a gateway for students from remote areas who might otherwise lack access to such enriching educational opportunities.






