BUDGET 2025 - 2026

Every year in January all Town and Parish Councils prepare a budget for the following financial year.

This also has to consider the effect on future years. Cambourne Town Council has to also consider an additional three years, so decisions made for the current financial year do not have a negative effect on future budgets.

This is always a challenging process for a developing community like Cambourne, but this year again it has been a difficult challenge with continued pressure on the budget for 2025/26.

The budget has been formulated to include all the requests considered in the report below presented to the Finance and Policy Committee. The budget calculations also took account of the following resolution agreed at the meeting

- 1. The new staffing structure, salaries and inflation for setting the budget for 2025 -2026 be based on 2.5 -5% in line with the 2024-2025 pay award (National pay award for local government staff) and any increments that are due contractually.
- 2. S106 contributions being received in the last quarter of 2024-25 these included a) Youth Facility (£500,000 This is earmarked to repay the loan from South Cambs District Council)
- b) Community Chest (£10,000/year) The Town Council has allocated £5,000 to community events run by the Town Council and £5,000 for community grants for which a new grant policy has been drawn up which will come into effect on 1st April 2025.
- c) Public Art (£10,000/year)
- d) Blue space (£115,000)
- e) Archaeological Display (£20,000) The amounts above are the s106 figures and are index linked to January 2017 when invoiced
- 3. The works to provide the Modular building for Scouts, Guides and Cambourne Shedders. This includes the £90,000 grant offer.

- 4. Meeting inflationary costs on electricity, gas, diesel and materials used to maintain the buildings and open spaces.
- 5. The commitment to improve the play areas.
- 6. Completing the landscaping to the Youth Building.
- 7. Improve the original Tennis and Netball courts.
- 8. Maintaining the support for youth provision by providing a building and grant funding for Cambourne Youth Partnership, to provide youth clubs and other support for the youth of Cambourne, (works out as £10.32/year on Band D households). In the next financial year, there are some more s106 monies due and potentially further grants coming in.

The budget was originally prepared based on a 3% increase in the band D rate in line with 2024/2025 forecast but, the Town Council would not have the required Risk Management funds for 2025/26 and future years meaning we would fail our Audit process.

To enable the Town Council to carry out the projects it is committed too, the items listed above and meet the risk management threshold for the next 3 years a 7.5% increase in the B and D rate is necessary.

This is lower than the 10% increase over the last two years.

The increase also makes an allowance for Town Council to slowly rebuild its balances in the coming years.

It should be noted that many of the costs are fixed by third parties leaving us no discretion or control to alter them.

Cambourne Town Council looked at all options to try and minimise the increase due to the pressures on residents, brought about by the current cost of living crisis. Most options showed that greater increases would be needed in the future to provide a balanced budget.

Cambourne Town Council took the difficult decision to levy a precept of £857,037.00 on South Cambs District Council. This is a band D rate of £190.55 which is an increase of 7.5% which equates to an additional £13.29. (£1.11/month). This was required to ensure that the Town Council can carry out the

projects it has committed to and meet the risk management threshold for the next three years.

Although 2025 to 2026 has required a 7.5% increase to Band D in the budget, the next three financial years' budget balances with a 3% increase to Band D annually. This is subject to inflation continuing to decrease.

■ DOGS ON LEADS – Countryside Code of Conduct

Due to some recent concerns, we would like to remind dog owners to exercise their dogs on lead. Whilst we understand why owners may want to exercise off lead, particularly around the country park and lakes, it is important to remember that some people are not comfortable with dogs approaching them, or their dogs. Dogs off lead can also cause a disturbance to nesting birds and other wildlife. It also presents an opportunity for dogs to poo unnoticed and not being disposed of. The Town Council follows the Countryside Code.

Wildlife Trust BCN Update: February 2025

The Wildlife Trust for Beds, Cambs and Northants'

Communities and Education Officer runs nature-themed events across the year in Cambourne, with the main programme running from Easter until the end of October. Nearby, we also deliver events at Trumpington Meadows Nature Reserve in Cambridge, and Paxton Pits Education Centre near St Neots. Here is what is planned for Cambourne in 2025 (please note that members of the Wildlife Trust BCN enjoy a discount on events, and there are sometimes early-bird tickets available):

Little Bugs: relaxed, wildlife wanders for families with toddlers, starting up after the Easter holidays and running most Friday mornings until the end of October.

Wild in the Wood: sessions for families with primary-aged children on Wednesdays during school holidays. On the 19th February we'll be dissecting owl pellets to look at the bones of the small mammals they have eaten whole!

Youth Rangers: monthly sessions for secondary-school-age young people who are interested in local wildlife and global environmental issues. We make use of our office and reserve in Cambourne, as well as Trumpington Meadows Nature Reserve, and others nearby, to do practical volunteering, support community events, go on walks, carry out surveys, and enjoy socials with like-mined people.

Walks for adults: there are themed walks aimed at adults planned for May (not-quite-dawn-chorus), June and July (summer wildlife), and July and August (night walks)

Sit and Chat in Nature: these do exactly what the title says! We'll find a nice spot not far from Oaks Wood car park and enjoy the wildlife around us over a cuppa. There a couple if these sessions planned for the warmer months. These sessions are offered as donation-only events.

Nature and Natter: this is a new series of monthly activities with a naturey theme and a focus on friendly chat. Some are based in Cambourne, and some at Trumpington Meadows. They are either a Wednesday evening, or a Saturday morning. Our February session is willow weaving at our head-office in Cambourne on Wednesday 12th Feb 6.30-8.30pm.





Monkfield Medical Practice Care Navigators

Care Navigators at Monkfield Medical Practice are the first face and voice you see and hear when you attend or call the surgery. They are also responsible of all our electronic enquiries.

.....

Their aim is to help you access the right care, at the right time. Given our young patient population we are lucky to be able to promote electronic access via the NHS app and our online portal via the 'contact us' button on our website which can be used when the practice is open from 8am to 4pm, Monday to Friday.

Our phones start ringing from 8am and the doors open at 8:30am. The Care Navigators remain active, prioritising your care until 6pm. They greet each patient as an individual, each problem or query as unique to that individual. They deal with everything from sneezes to cut knees, emotional crisis to suspected heart attacks and then greet the next patient with the same care as the last. The questions they ask are to help them direct you to the most appropriate care.

While care navigators are not clinical, they are trained and have protocols to direct you to the most appropriate place or person. This isn't always a GP, but it can be a Nurse, a pharmacist, a social prescriber, a self-referral, a physio or other avenues. They try always to be compassionate, understanding and approachable, they are here to help you.

The NHS is overstretched at the best of times and sometimes patients can become frustrated, scared or angry and the care navigator is the person in front of them. Sometimes the things that are said or read on social media really hurt: this job is not easy and those encounters can be upsetting. On other days they get thanked and praised for the effort they put in and go home feeling worthwhile.

The care navigators at MMP are dedicated to the patients and work hard to make a difference by supporting patients through their journey to access the right care. Most of our Care Navigators (and many of our staff) live in Cambourne so they are passionate about supporting their community.

A busy start to the New Year

It's been a busy start to 2025 both in Westminster and in the constituency, with new legislation on children's wellbeing and schools to scrutinise in Parliament and local issues to press ministers.

The former contains important provisions to help keep vulnerable children safe, but given the scale of the crisis in Special Educational Needs, it's disappointing it does nothing to address that.

In the constituency, I have written to the Policing Minister about the funding challenges in Cambridgeshire. The provisional allocation of central government Police grant funding was published late last year. It is based on population

data from 2012, not reflecting where we are now!

For Cambourne, I'm looking forward to seeing progress this year on plans for the high street, the Cambourne to Cambridge project, as well as East West Rail - I hope many of you expressed your views. A station will be great for the town, and is something I have long supported, but I'm looking forward to seeing your views - local knowledge should shape such projects.

In January I visited Morrisons and raised questions about the use of the Market Square and the entrance there. It was great to hear about the work of their local Community Champion and the generosity of Cambourne residents through food bank donations via the store.

Cambourne is a great place to live

Cambourne is great place to live with a lively and active community. But our area also struggles with higher than average levels of income inequality.

With food price inflation and the cost of heating rising, South Cambs District Council continues to support our residents with the cost-of-living crisis with a wide programme of cost-of-living support.

We support a network of community hubs and foodbanks, and for the last year, this work has included a Mobile Food Hub working in partnership with Hope CIC. These hubs link in with the Council's work on minimising food waste

making sure surplus food is used.

This winter, officers worked to identify hundreds of residents who might otherwise have missed out on the Winter Fuel payment and the Household Support Fund and have called them up and helped them apply for benefits to which they are entitled but had not claimed.

Plans for the next financial year include providing refurbished laptops that will be targeted at children (11+) who would otherwise be disadvantaged in their education through their family income, and digital skills and financial education workshops for residents.

Kidney stones and how to prevent them

Our kidneys are found below the ribs, either side of the spine. They are very important in removing waste products from the blood, which are then passed out in urine (pee).

Sometimes the waste products can form crystals, which can collect in the kidneys and may grow to form stones. Kidney stones are quite common and and usually affect people between 30 and 60 years old.

The body will try and pass stones and if they are small they may not be noticed.

Larger stones can cause more problems and

may become lodged in the tube connecting the kidney and bladder. Symptoms of kidney stones include pain in the side of the abdomen and groin, which can be severe; a high temperature and feeling or being sick.

In some cases there may also be blood in the urine or symptoms of a kidney infection with smelly or cloudy urine.

The kidneys may become damaged if kidney stones are left untreated, so it is important to report these symptoms to a GP or call 111 to get advice.

Drinking enough fluid to keep yourself well hydrated and your urine pale is the best way to prevent kidney stones developing.

I don't know who was around your table over Christmas or at New Year, but often family gatherings include eccentric aunts, energetic toddlers, and grandparents wishing things were like they were fifty years ago. Maybe I am indulging in caricatures, but the thing about families is that - at their best and despite all the differences - there is a lot of love, laughter, and a place for everyone.

One way the Bible describes the Christian community is as a family. Maybe we have our own equivalents of eccentric aunts, tearaway toddlers, and grandparents hankering for a bygone era. But that is good, because the church is supposed to be a place of diversity - different ages, races, and life experiences - gathered together into one big family.

Cambourne Church is a partnership of four different church traditions. Unlike most parish churches, we relate not only to the Church of England, but to the Methodists, the Baptists, and the United Reformed Church as well. There is therefore an extra dimension of diversity among us, and we do not all have the same experiences or expectations as one another. This is enriching, and can help us to move past caricatures as we focus on what unites us rather than on what divides us.

So I am glad to be the minister of an ecumenical church, where we unite across different traditions to celebrate and share God's amazing love - shown to us supremely in the death and resurrection of Jesus. That is the central truth which holds us together.


Plans and possibilities.

We as a church had a good Christmas celebration with children singing and our traditional meal and gift exchange. We were also able to get the paperwork done for our first filing as a registered charity.

I sometimes talk to other missionaries about challenges, and every field is different. Some face challenges from cultists or tribal leaders. Others face challenges with wildlife, like scorpions or



But there will be plenty more as we are (now that things are not as horrendous as last year) going to attempt to start an addiction recovery ministry. This is basically inviting people that struggle with addictions to hear Biblical principles that may help bring stability to

them. It does not have to be drugs—people are addicted to many things. Alcohol, gambling, adult entertainment, gaming, or many things. If it is compulsive and detrimental, often dominating every aspect of your life, it may be an addiction.

It is like being in a prison to those things, and anything else is secondary including family and friends. This leads to isolation and feelings of helplessness. Jesus came that we might be free. He has paid the price that we might be forgiven. As an addict, forgiveness can be a hard thing to accept, but it is needed to move beyond where you are to where you should be.

More to come later, Cambourne. Be safe.

Take charge and be safe

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has seen an increase in fires involving lithium-ion batteries over the last few years.

Many devices contain lithium-ion batteries. Mobile phones, laptops and games console controllers have these batteries, but so do cordless tools, garden machinery plus e-bikes and e-scooters. These batteries can heat up and cause a fire if not used correctly. You can Take Charge and Be Safe by following a few simple tips:

- Charge batteries when you are awake and alert
- Only use the battery, charger and cables supplied by the manufacturer. Do not overload sockets
- Do not charge e-bikes and e-scooters in escape routes. Batteries can be a fire hazard if they are not disposed of properly. They should never be put in household rubbish or recycling bins. During the processing of waste or recycling, a battery can be compacted and damaged, which can lead to ignition of the highly reactive lithium, leading to a fire starting.

Fires involving batteries cause damage to refuse vehicles and roads, as well as significant delays to bin collections and road closures.

How to dispose of batteries

There are many places to safely dispose of batteries. As well as local recycling centres, many shops around the county have collection bins in-store.

Jeavons Wood indulges in past experiences

Jeavons Wood Primary School: We love to learn about History: finding out what has changed, what has not, the challenges and joys for people in different eras and trying to imagine ourselves in our ancestors' shoes.

"The more you know about the past, the better prepared you are for the future." - Theodore Roosevelt.

We were very lucky to host History Off the Page three times in January. We felt a bit like time travellers speeding through the ages and learning so much.

Year 2 had a fantastic time becoming citizens of 1666 London. They explored various shops and trades, learned about the impact of the Black Plague on the city, and discovered the events leading up to the Great Fire of London.

Year 5 travelled back approximately 535 years to the beginning of the Tudor reign, creating Tudor style portraits and modelling the Tudor Rose out of clay. The best part of the day however was a tie between learning about traditional Tudor dancing and eating a Tudor feast!

Year 6 experienced life as an evacuee in WW2 this week. First experience was the school room, practicing what to do in an air raid. In the afternoon, the children went to the market to buy supplies for their new families and enjoyed a 'delicious' spam sandwich at the cafe. Being immersed in the experiences and artefacts was a wonderful way to learn!





The Vine focuses on nature

The Vine Inter-Church Primary started the new year in accordance with the Forest School Association's 6 principles. Initially it all began with pre-school and reception classes. Each group spends a morning outside undertaking activities in the natural environment, which encourages supported risk taking, builds a community for development and learning and promotes resilient, confident, independent and creative learners.

We also introduced lunchtime and afternoon pastoral sessions as Year 2 also get the chance of an afternoon outside. It is our aim that all children get an opportunity to attend Forest School during the academic year.

We started our sessions studying nature, followed by lots of play and exploration of the natural environment. The pupils have enjoyed taking risks, using the rope bridge and swinging to develop their gross motor skill. We recently had the opportunity to extend our forest school area, and the pupils helped to plant over 400 sapling trees on the school site, kindly donated by Bush &Co Estate agents Cambridge. We are all very excited to see how these grow when spring arrives. The kids have had the opportunity to start using tools to make name badges, cooking sticks and even Christmas decorations. They enjoyed learning how to create fire



using a flint and steel, the types and sizes of wood that are needed to make a fire for warmth or for cooking. We ended our term looking at the Winter Solstice and cooking bread and apples over the open fire.

It has been a real pleasure to see the children outside playing and exploring with natural materials; with the mud being a special favourite for jumping



and sliding in as well as being used as face paint!

Cambourne's Shahina Pardhan awarded OBE for services to optometry

Cambourne resident Shahina Pardhan has been named in the King's New Year's honours list and is to receive an OBE (Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire) for services to optometry and preventing blindness.

Shahina, a pioneering professor at Anglia Ruskin University (ARU) and Director of ARU's Vision and Eye Research Institute (VERI) has published research on vision and eye health. The impact of her research on reducing the risk of blindness due to diabetes is far reaching.

The UK's first ever female professor of optometry, Shahina has received numerous accolades and awards throughout her career.

Stanford University named her in the top 2 per cent of the world's scientists and under Shahina's strategic leadership, VERI received "world-leading" status through its publications and impact.

Shahina commented, "I am surprised, humbled and profoundly honoured to receive this honour. It strengthens my commitment to reduce the risk of blindness.

Blindness due to eye diseases such as diabetic retinopathy is preventable if caught in time, and our work has made a difference to people's lives not just in the UK but in other parts of the world. My sincere thanks to everyone who has worked with me over the years."





- BAA reach is spreading due to the partnership

Cambridgeshire's biggest bus operator has revealed some of the initial experiences of its drivers in standing up against Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG).

Stagecoach East's buses officially became places of refuge for people fearing that they will be subject to abusive behaviour last October, when it launched its partnership with Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Police Authority, and the Cambridge and Peterborough Rape Crisis Centre to join the Businesses Against Abuse (BAA) scheme.

Under the scheme, the operator's existing safeguarding procedures are being enhanced with additional training: drivers are being trained to recognise people who are in vulnerable situations either on or off the bus - and are being given guidance in how to offer help.

If a driver recognises that a women or girl may be in fear of abuse on the street, they are authorised to pull over and ask if they need help and then take her to a safe place on route if necessary.

Now, reflecting on the first three months of the scheme, Darren Roe, Managing Director of Stagecoach East, said: "I am so proud of how our Training team, drivers, and everyone concerned have reacted to being part of this important scheme. They are making a real difference in our local communities.

"The message remains the same as it was at launch: your local bus is a place of safety. I would encourage anyone who is in fear or abuse, either on the bus or if they see a bus, to make themselves known to the driver, who will try to help them.

"Even after only the first few months, we have already had numerous incidents where drivers have intervened to stop abuse



against women, and their actions have absolutely kept them safe on our vehicles.

"These have ranged from young women feeling safe seeing our destination messages, diverting a bus service to take a vulnerable women to a safe area, and also direct interventions to keep a predators away from a young girl, one of whom was arrested."

Stagecoach East's high-profile partnership has already been a springboard for BAA, which has seen a boost in the number of businesses wanting to join the scheme, including other bus operators.

If a driver recognises that a passenger is in fear of abuse, they have been given a range of options to help. These are called the "5 Ds" and include delegating, by involving others, distracting, and delaying until it is safe to challenge.

All Stagecoach East buses now display BAA stickers with QR codes by their entrance doors, designating them as safe-spaces and all their buses have multiple cameras, so cases of abuse will be Recorded and Reported.


