



Bottles and butts!



What are all those bottles on canes around the church? Having defied Storm Bert and planted in 420 native species saplings to form a wildlife hedge around the Jubilee Garden, Cambourne Church took the advice of the Woodland Trust - who donated the plants - that we should protect them from rabbits and deer by repurposing plastic bottles to keep the nibblers at bay. The next step is to keep them weed-free with Christmas tree mulch over a layer of cardboard.

In the middle of March work will be underway to harvest rainwater from the church roof so that we have a sustainable way to water our crops.

The flowers around the Annexe have provided seeds for birds and havens for insects over winter, but will now be composted and new flower seeds planted.

The muntjac deer, butterflies and caterpillars took a toll on the veg plot so we weren't able to keep supplies going for the Blue Space Foodbank over winter, but

we will soon be planting seeds for this season, putting in netting as necessary. A new fruit bed will eventually provide rhubarb, currants and soft fruit, but will take a little longer to establish.

Come and help us! The Jubilee Garden is a Community project for all to enjoy.

We'll gather on the third Saturday of each month, 10am to 12noon, 15th March onwards. Plenty for all to do, or just watch! Email garden@cambournechurch.org.uk for more information.

Failure to do so may result in a £500 fine and, more importantly, risks their safety in the event of accidents or emergency stops.

■ Dogs on leads

Due to some recent concerns, we would like to remind dog owners to exercise their dogs on lead. Whilst we understand why owners may want to exercise off lead, particularly around the country park and lakes, it is important to remember that some people are not comfortable with dogs approaching them or their dogs. They can also cause a disturbance to nesting birds and other wildlife and it presents an opportunity for dogs to poo unnoticed and not being disposed of.

The first SBC was set up in 2012 and now there are more than 1,500 chapters in 54 countries around the world. Now there's one in Cambourne. There's no set reading, so no pressure to finish a book on time and no need to think of something smart to say! It's a club for people who enjoy being social and reading together, but prefer to choose their own reads. It's basically BYOB: bring your own book.

It was first set up for people who don't enjoy traditional book groups or who would rather just talk about reading and

books in general. The first half hour is for getting a drink or food, chatting about books and reading.

Then we settle in for an uninterrupted hour of silent reading, just enjoying being in company with other people enjoying books and reading. After that you can chat some more or finish your evening.

And the SBC is for reading whatever you like: paper books, ebooks, audiobooks, journals and magazines, textbooks. There's no need to book or reserve a place - just come along with your reading material and join in.

The Silent Book Club Cambourne meets on the first Tuesday of the month at 7.30pm at the Monkfield Arms. Next meeting Tuesday 4th March 2025. Hope to see you there!

Our Parish Clerk/RFO is retiring after 34 years and we are seeking a replacement. The role is part-time (average 40 hrs per month). Pay is based on national scales dependent on qualifications and experience, but no less than £15.21 per hr.

We need someone with good people and communication skills. The Clerk undertakes the administrative duties for the Parish Council (preparing meeting agendas/minutes etc.) and is responsible for financial management (processing orders & invoices, banking, VAT returns etc.) so proficiency in using Word, Excel, email & social media is essential.

Oxford to Cambridge growth corridor

In late January, the Chancellor made a speech on her plans for the Oxford-Cambridge Growth Corridor.

Although much of the content in the speech was not 'news' as such – she had already committed to prioritising Cambridge Cancer Hospital and upgrading the A428, it was good to see the Government recognising Cambridgeshire as the global leader in research, innovation and technology that it is.

Unfortunately, the East West Rail (EWR) section between Bedford and Cambridge is still yet to be explicitly mentioned by the Government. EWR must not become another HS2, and I will continue to hold the Government to account until it guarantees full funding until completion.

I have spent the last month on the Committee for the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill. My Liberal Democrat colleagues and I have sought to make a number of amendments to its content – namely to expand the availability of free school meals, to crack down on profiteering in special educational schools, and to improve safeguarding for children not in school. Thank you to those that have contacted me about this. I will be sending out a full update in due course.

Finally, a big congratulations to Cambourne Village College, who I recently joined in Parliament to celebrate receiving the prestigious British Council International Schools Award! It is great to have a school in the community with such an international ethos at the heart of its teaching.

Supporting the people of Cambourne

I asked questions to the full Council meeting on behalf of Cambourne residents on the connecting roads to Cambourne Village College from West Cambourne (driving and walking) and what measures have been taken as to flooding situations in West Cambourne.

I surveyed social badminton as this is more affordable and flexible in booking than other places. My ongoing project Cambourne Cookery Club is running well and unites residents, fostering friendship and joy through shared meals, and building friendships. More members are always welcome. I have continued helping the elderly people of Cambourne and taking them out on small trips, shopping and visiting a café.

I am currently running activities on cooking, art, and STEM in Cambourne, with many Hong Kong families joining. I also continue to advocate for a dedicated space for diverse faith groups in Cambourne. To support the local artists of Cambourne, I organised Public Art Exhibitions for them in December and February.

I am strenuously working on funding programs for disadvantaged students, including children affected by conflicts of war and special needs.

I am expanding practical learning programs where children will learn agriculture technology. Recently, I had the opportunity to meet IT students at Cambridge Regional College about their career opportunities in computing and technology.

Lung cancer: look out for the signs

Lung cancer is a serious and common type of cancer. It affects over 40,000 people every year in the UK.

In the early stages, there are often no signs or symptoms. However, in time lung cancer can cause a cough that continues for more than three weeks; breathlessness; coughing up blood; pain when breathing or coughing; tiredness and weight loss. Less common symptoms include changes to the ends of fingers (becoming more curved or larger); wheezing; swelling in the face or neck or a hoarse voice. Lung cancer is sometimes linked to a cancer that has started some where else in the body but there are also several types of cancers

that begin in the lungs and the type of treatment depends on the type of cancer.

Lung cancer usually affects older people and smoking (or passive smoking) is the most common cause which is linked to over 70 per cent of cases.

There are also other substances linked to lung cancer including asbestos, silica, coal and diesel fumes.

As with all cancers, the earlier lung cancer is detected, the better the chance of survival so it is very important to report any symptoms to a GP.

Prepare to hope

Pastoral thoughts: plans and possibilities

Due to the timing of the printing of *Cambourne Crier*, often the articles are sent in weeks prior to publishing. This means that sometimes a lot can happen between submission and printing. This is why you get updates about Christmas activities in February's edition as January's articles have to be in before those events have actually occurred. This is why it is good to plan ahead even though things may change in the meantime.

We as a church had a good Christmas celebration with children singing and our traditional meal and gift exchange. Our helper, Caleb, came back from assisting his mother who lost her home due to a hurricane. We also helped him move to a better place, and he is settled in now. We were also able to get the paperwork done

for our first filing as a registered charity.

I sometimes talk to other missionaries about challenges, and every field is different.

Some face challenges from cultists or tribal leaders. Others face challenges with wildlife, like scorpions or poisonous spiders.

In the UK, although we do have extremists or the occasional bug or that fox that likes to poop in my garden, often the main challenge is the paperwork.

But there will be plenty more as we are (now that things are not as horrendous as last year) going to attempt to start an addiction recovery ministry. This is basically inviting people that struggle with addictions to hear Biblical principles that may help bring stability to them. It does not

have to be drugs - people are addicted to many things. Alcohol, gambling, adult entertainment, gaming, or many things. If it is compulsive and detrimental, often dominating every aspect of your life, it may be an addiction.

It is like being in a prison to those things, and anything else is secondary including family and friends.

This leads to isolation and feelings of helplessness. Jesus came that we might be free. He has paid the price that we might be forgiven. As an addict, forgiveness can be a hard thing to accept, but it is needed to move beyond where you are to where you should be.

More to come later, Cambourne. Be safe.





In the past, you found pleasure in this habit, but over time, the pleasure went away, and now you find that if you do not take part in this habit, it hurts.


All the pleasure is gone, but you feel compelled to take part to avoid pain. What was once a diversion, a pastime has now become an addiction.



Shihua really enjoyed seeing the staging and how the lights brought it all to life: "I loved being under the lights, they were really cool and the stage was really big."



Monkfield excel at public speaking event







District Council's Cabinet outlines aspirations for years ahead

South Cambridgeshire District

Council's Cabinet met on Tuesday 4th February to discuss goals not only for the next 12 months – but also a longer-term Corporate Plan for the years ahead.

Following the successful introduction of the Council's first public-facing use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) on its website during the past year – new websites for the Council, Greater Cambridge Shared Planning and Greater Cambridge Shared Waste will make it even easier for residents to access services, find information and complete tasks online. The new sites will help signpost localised information for residents in one central place – including bin collection dates, important information and local community events.

A telephone Voice AI Assistant will also be introduced – to complement Contact Centre staff who take calls. This will help free-up Contact Centre staff, for longer, to support residents with more complex issues over the phone.

Meanwhile, the Greater Cambridge Shared Waste service that South Cambridgeshire District and Cambridge City councils share will commence the roll out of a new food waste collection service to residents in 2026.

Residents will be given plenty of notice to help prepare for the introduction – which will see them benefit from a dedicated weekly food waste collection. This will help Greater Cambridge Shared Waste capture even more food waste - by diverting it from disposal in the black bins

- which will then be transformed into renewable energy or a valuable compost product for agricultural use.

Setting a vision for the years ahead

Cabinet members also backed the Council's proposed new priorities for the next five years.

It's after the Council asked residents to help shape its plans for the years ahead – to ensure South Cambridgeshire remains one of the best places to live and work in the country. Almost 400 responses were received during last year's six-week consultation which asked for views on the proposed new priorities. That feedback helped develop a new draft Corporate Plan, setting out key objectives for how, over the next five years, the Council will achieve its new priorities for South Cambridgeshire.

The five new proposed priorities are:

■ Healthy and Supported Communities

- Supporting and engaging with our communities is key to tackling the



at all. This of course can cause us a significant delay in responding to emergencies where someone's life could be at risk and our attendance time is crucial.

This is a growing problem due in part to increasing car ownership, reduced or unused resident parking areas, traffic calming schemes and thoughtless parking by some motorists. The problem can be compounded at night and during the school pick-up and drop-off times. The average fire engine is 2.6 metres (nine feet) wide and 8 metres (26 feet) long - when you park your vehicle in a narrow street, always check you have left enough room for a fire engine to get past.

Balancing the budget

Most of the Council Tax that SCDC collects is passed to Cambridgeshire County Council, Police, Fire and Rescue Service and parish or town councils. Some is also passed to the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority, to support local buses. Less than half of the District Council's annual budget is funded from local Council Tax. Other funding sources include some outside of the Council's control, such as Business Rates and grants, whilst funding is also generated from our investments.

A £5.09 per year increase in Council Tax for the average band D home was agreed by Cabinet members – to help to ensure essential frontline services continue to be delivered effectively. If approved at the Full Council meeting on 25 February, this would mean the average band D home charge for South Cambridgeshire District Council would become £175.40 per year.

South Cambridgeshire District Council's Lead Cabinet Member for Resources, Cllr John Williams, said: "It continues to be challenging for councils due to increasing demand for our services coupled with reduced funding. So, it's a fantastic achievement for residents that we're a financially-sound Council – but important to remember we only retain a very small amount of the Council Tax we collect. Most of it gets passed on to other authorities – and we continue to do all we can to make the most of every pound we do receive."


