#### **AGAR 2025**

The Town Council has been working hard to address issues raised in the Annual Governance and Accountability return for 2024/25. Please read our Council minutes to see the steps the Town Council is taking to address these issues. Several key areas have already been addressed, which included the immediate use of accounting software.

# ■ Cancelled - Cambourne Community Fete (20th September)

The Community fete has been cancelled this year - this is due to the amount of work still to do, and with the current staffing levels this was not possible without moving officers from governance matters. It was also felt that following the audit it would not be appropriate to hold the fete whilst officers cannot advise the Council on the total budget.

#### Netball/Tennis Courts resurfaced

The Town Council has supported Cambourne Netball Club with a successful bid for the A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet Legacy Funds by National Highways. This project included the resurfacing of the old courts and the installation of a KL2 Accessible Waterless Toilet and was match-funded by the Town Council. Planning permission for the toilet was granted and installation took place shortly after.

The works have now been completed, and the courts are being well used!



# ■ Countryside Code of Conduct: dogs on leads

As the weather gets better, we would like to remind dog owners to exercise their dogs on lead. Whilst we understand why owners may want to exercise off lead, particularly around the country park and lakes, it is important to remember that some people are not comfortable with dogs approaching them, or their dogs. Dogs off lead can also cause a disturbance to nesting birds and other wildlife. It also presents an opportunity for dogs to poo unnoticed and not being disposed of. The Town Council follows the Countryside Code.





# **Cambourne Library**

#### **Refurbishment Update**

We apologise for the delay in starting building works at Cambourne Library. Our procurement timeline overran, and we were caught out by changes in the building regulations that came into force. As we are changing internal walls the whole building needed to be brought up to spec and this took far more time than anticipated as several other projects countrywide fell into similar issues and expertise to complete the work was in short supply.

We have finally completed the new requirements and contractors are now scheduled to start in early September and hope to complete by the end of the year.

We are still progressing with the design as it has been shared and additional works are largely taking place with the fabric of the building, internal fire safety compartmentalisation and use of materials.

The alternative library provision will remain in place until the library re-opens.

#### **New Cirros Printing**

We are now able to offer printing from both our public PCs and remote devices - customers' own laptops and smartphones. In addition, your printing and photocopying is now paid for by credit or debit card on the payment device attached to the printer. While we all learn how to use this new system there are instruction leaflets available in the library to help navigate how to print and photocopy your documents.

Access to library computers and the photocopier/printer in the foyer is on a self-service basis.

# My tour of Cambourne nature reserve

I recently enjoyed a tour of Cambourne Nature Reserve, a beautifully designed and maintained area managed by the Wildlife Trust, who have just been named 'Charity of the Year' by South Cambs District Council.

The main issue we discussed was water supply. New communities like Cambourne are great examples of how both nature and housing can grow in tandem and they must be allowed to thrive for years to come. A positive step in the Autumn Budget was that the Fens reservoir would be prioritised in order to unlock some of the new housing that Cambridgeshire desperately needs.

But we need much more than this if the Government wants to go beyond the already ambitious Greater Cambridge Local Plan.

As we headed into another heatwave in late August, it was disturbing news that these intense weather events may now be our 'new normal'. At the same time, failure to invest properly in renewable energy has led directly to sky-high energy bills that are hurting families and businesses across the constituency.

In July, I met a group of local campaigners in Parliament as part of The Climate Coalition's 'Act Now, Change Forever' lobby day. The huge number of people that came sent a powerful message that the climate crisis is something that the Government must urgently prioritise.

I recognise the crucial role I must play as an MP in stepping up against climate change, and I will continue to fight for our future as best I can.

# Cambourne - village spirit or concrete jungle?

At the recent District Council meeting, I raised a question that has been on Cambourne residents' minds for over two decades: After 25 years of waiting, when will we finally see Cambourne's High Street delivered?

I also asked whether the administration would deliver an urbanised design more like a high rise city development and concrete jungle, or would they provide the village-style community that was envisaged for Cambourne. I continue to press for plans that reflect our town's character, with local shops, a Post Office and accessible amenities.

I attended the High Street update meeting with Planning Director Stephen Kelly and made these points again. I was reassured that there will still

be opportunities for meaningful public consultation.

At the same Council, I also opposed the proposal for four days of work with five days of payment, which is funded by taxpayers' money. Why can't the District Council follow a fair principle of four days' work with four days' pay, or three days' work with three days' pay, just like everyone else in society? By allowing this, the Council risks creating an unfair society, when teachers, nurses, police officers, and so many others are paid only for the days they work.

After 10 years of asking for a bus shelter, I am pleased to say we have a new bench that has finally been installed at the Broad Street bus stop.

# Lupus erythematosus

Lupus (systemic lupus erythematosus) is a condition which causes pain in the joints and muscles, skin rashes and extreme tiredness.

The rash is often over the nose and cheeks and can come on after being in the sun. It is sometimes described as looking like a butterfly and it is not contagious. Other symptoms include hair loss, weight loss, tummy pain, low mood, mouth ulcers, swollen glands and a high temperature. Symptoms of lupus can become worse for a few weeks or longer (relapse) and then settle down again for a period of time (remission).

For some people their symptoms remain the

same all the time. Lupus can affect the skin more widely and the organs inside the body causing inflammation. In severe cases this can be life threatening. Lupus is not always easy to diagnose but keeping a record of symptoms and blood tests may together help to identify it.

Lupus is an autoimmune condition, which means the immune system in the body is attacking healthy areas of the body. The causes are not known but it is more common in women than men and those from an African, Caribbean, Asian or Chinese background.

Currently there is no cure for lupus, but if treatment starts early symptoms can improve.

# **Cambourne primary school** pupil wins competition to design a dinosaur

Arya Sareen, aged 11, a recent Year 6 graduate from Hardwick and **Cambourne Community Primary** School, has won a competition to "Design a Camsaurus".

The competition was hosted by the Sedgwick Museum and Grand Arcade. His entry was selected from over 300 submissions for its scientific detail, creativity, and stunning artwork.

Arya's fictional dinosaur, "The Camsaurus", was imagined as if it was making its habitat along the River Cam.

Camsaurus features a maroon feathered crest for mating displays, insulating plumage down its back, and hooked claws for fishing, making the Camsaurus both anatomically plausible and beautifully marked.

Having nurtured a passion for dinosaur evolution and natural history from an early age, Arya is also a gifted artist. His ability to blend science with art impressed judges and scientists alike.

In August, Arya was honoured at the Sedgwick Museum, where he met Professor Dave Norman and Dr Alex Liu from the University of Cambridge to explore real fossils and discuss evolution with the experts.

"I was overjoyed at the opportunity to speak with prestigious scientists about a subject I am really passionate about," he said.

His design was transformed into a soft toy, capturing every intricate detail of his drawing.



"When I received the soft toy, it was as if my paper creation had come alive I am incredibly grateful to the Sedgwick Museum and the Grand Arcade for presenting such an opportunity."

Arya's achievement is a celebration of youthful imagination, scientific curiosity, and artistic ability and is an inspiring reminder of the wonders that emerge when creativity meets knowledge.

# 10 years of Cambourne Foodbank

The Cambourne Welcome Centre of the Cambridge City Foodbank is now 10 years old. It is open 10am-12pm every Thursday morning in The Blue Space, Eastgate. It offers emergency food crates for individuals or families for three days in receipt of a foodbank voucher. The need for these food vouchers has increased enormously over the past 10 years as the cost of living has risen.

Each food crate includes basic staples such as pasta, cereal, tins of meat/fish/vegetables/soup, etc. There is also an extras box which includes other food items that have been donated, plus a toiletries box. Clients coming to the foodbank are able to select one or two items from these boxes as well as the staples box. If you would find an emergency food parcel helpful, there are several agencies around Cambourne that can issue vouchers. These include SCDC.

The helpline also offers advice on benefit claims, grants, support with heating and any other financial worries. # **Cambridgeshire drivers** scale Mount Snowdon for charity



Three intrepid bus Drivers have completed a remarkable feat of climbing one of the UK's highest mountains - to raise thousands of pounds for a major local medical charity.



# Long-awaited bench installed at Broad **Street bus stop**

Cllr Shrobona Bhattacharya: After nearly 10 years of asking repeatedly in Town Council meetings, I am very pleased to share that a bench has finally been installed at the Broad Street main bus stop.

This may seem like a small achievement, but for our elderly residents, it makes a world of difference.

In Cambourne, we have three retirement homes in the town centre. Many senior residents no longer drive and rely heavily on buses to reach Cambridge, Addenbrooke's Hospital, and other destinations. I have often seen how they suffer while waiting for long periods, some up to an hour, with mobility difficulties and no place to sit. This simple bench now provides comfort and dignity to those who need it most.

This moment also reminds me of Ex-Parish Councillor Tom Hudson, who for 16 years tirelessly pressed for bus shelters in Cambourne. Sadly, he passed away before seeing this become



a reality. I remember how he often raised the need for a bus shelter on Broad Street and elsewhere in the village.

I sincerely wish that this humble bench could be dedicated to his memory, as a tribute to his persistence and service to our community. In several meetings over the years in Town Council, I asked that, if not a full shelter, at least a bench should be provided at Broad Street, the busiest stop where all kinds of buses call. It was repeatedly minuted in the Town meeting, and I continued to chase it for nearly a decade. Finally, I am grateful to Dawid Illakowicz and our Grounds Team, whose support helped bring this long-delayed facility to life. A small seat it may be, but for many, it is a long-awaited comfort and a symbol of care in our community.

Thursday 24th July and welcomed the residents of Cambourne with delicious food and great company. Central Coop also partnered to bring Spin the Wheel, recipe ideas and banana art!

Cllr Dr Shrobona Bhattacharya conducted the live cooking session, where residents got a chance to prepare some of the dishes under supervision.

This is an interactive, hands-on cooking session; people get a chance to be involved in guided food preparation. Participants choose their vegetables so they can work with ingredients they enjoy. The live cooking session is all about building



confidence, joy, and community through cooking together.

Cllr Bhattacharya said, "We're facing a huge issue around convenience food, burgers, pizzas, chips, and fizzy drinks. These aren't chosen because they taste better or are cheaper; they're chosen because many people avoid cooking altogether. This wasn't a problem in the UK 30 years ago; people knew that soups, lunches, breakfasts, and dinners were made at home. That was family life.

It's not just about food anymore; it's

about loneliness, disconnection, longterm health, and many wider crises. I see all roads, from depression to obesity to cancer, all lead to the NHS. The circle comes back to the NHS. Not cooking at home not only leads to poor health and social isolation, but we're also harming water and land animals by choking them with plastic waste. And on top of that, we are producing millions of tons of single-use plastics on this planet every year. A simple education can be a solution to many things."







# South Cambridgeshire supporting vital services

**Residents of South Cambridgeshire** are thanked by councillors for their support of vital frontline services after the District Council was named the second top District Council nationally for collecting Council Tax.

The government statistics for collection rates show SCDC collected 99.23% of the Council Tax funds it was due to in the 2024/25 financial year - helping to fund essential services such as social care, waste collections, police and fire services, education, homelessness prevention, some local bus services and much more. When considering all councils, the total collection rate across England was 95.88%.

By 31 March 2025, the Council had collected a total of £156,428,000 during the previous 12 months. As a result, South Cambridgeshire District Council is the second top performing District Council out of around 300 tax-collecting authorities in England. Council Tax is collected by South Cambridgeshire

District Council on behalf of the Police, Fire Service, County Council, Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority and Parish and Town Councils. Only around 7.5% of residents' annual Council Tax bill goes towards services which the District Council provides - such as emptying bins, determining planning applications and homelessness support, with the rest being passed to the other organisations.

South Cambridgeshire District Council's Lead Cabinet Member for Resources, Cllr John Williams, said: "A huge thank you to residents of South Cambridgeshire for doing their part to keep important local services running. The District Council is the collecting body for Council Tax, but we pass most of the money on to other Councils and emergency services. For the average band D house, South Cambridgeshire District Council retains £175.40 a year from the whole Council Tax bill, which is one of the lowest charges in the country.

We fully recognise the ongoing cost of living challenges and remain committed to supporting our residents. If you're struggling to pay your Council Tax, please reach out to us as early as possible. We can help by arranging payment plans and exploring available financial support, such as our Localised Council Tax Support Scheme for those who qualify. We're here to help, and the sooner we know, the more options we may be able to offer." The Government figures also show that South Cambridgeshire District Council collected 99.2% of the Business Rates that it was due to collect from local companies during the 2024/25 financial year - a total of £122,553,000.

Support is available for residents struggling to meet Council Tax payments. Visit the SCDC website for details. South Cambridgeshire residents can also sign-up to receive their Council Tax bill online.

# **Community health** initiatives transform lives across the district

Hundreds of residents of all ages have been supported to live healthier lives thanks to community programmes and initiatives delivered and managed by South Cambridgeshire District Council.

From cookery classes to athletics camps, wellbeing walks and cardiac rehab, the Council is committed to inspiring healthier lifestyles for all.

Some of the successful health and wellbeing activities from 2024 - 2025 include:

Cooking up confidence in the kitchen with three family cooking programmes which brought together 35 residents to learn healthy eating habits and practical cooking skills. Children tried new foods, families cooked together, and confidence soared. One resident said: "Many children tried different types of food for the first time, and because they cooked it, they ate it and enjoyed it!"

Strength and balance for seniors thanks to funding from Care Together. Chair-based exercise sessions were introduced in six sheltered housing schemes, benefiting 59 older adults. One participant said: "I have arthritis pain, but after six weeks, the pain eased, and I feel better for it."

Health and activity advice talks reached over 175 people across 19 venues, including schools, sheltered housing and libraries. The activity talks included helping young people understand the importance of activity in changing focus, having a positive mindset and controlling stress and emotions during two court experience days on the dangers of knife crime.

Over 2,100 students took part in Healthy You Schools Week, with fun challenges and discussions on food and fitness. Fit 'n' Healthy sessions helped 151 Year 5 and 6 pupils understand the link between nutrition and activity.

The Council's physical activity coordinator supported the annual colour run day and spoke to children about healthy eating, activity. A teacher said: "The colour run, and activity village were a hit – children learned, laughed, and got moving!"

Athletics and netball holiday sport camps welcomed over 775 children aged 7-14, supported by 58 volunteers.



Two new walking cricket sessions were launched in Melbourn and Cambourne, adding to eight regular walking sports sessions across the district, including football, rugby,

Nine regular wellbeing walks now take place across the district, with three new routes added this year and 37 new walkers joined, enjoying safe, social, and supportive strolls.

Grants of £8,300 supported activities for people with conditions like Parkinson's, cancer, and anxiety. One participant with Parkinson's said: "My balance is improved as is my tremor and arm strength. The classes lift my mood and make me feel positive. My consultant said my condition is stable - I believe the classes made the difference."

Exercise4Fun sessions at local leisure centres across the district saw 91 people join, with 14 achieving significant weight loss. One participant shared: "After a near-fatal accident, I gained weight and lost confidence. Now, I've lost over 5 stone and feel healthier and happier than ever."

A total of 257 patients were referred to the Active & Healthy 4 Life exercise scheme with 102 completing the four-month programme and making exercise part of their daily lifestyle. A new cardiac rehab class in Cambourne supported 18 patients on their recovery journey.

# **Cambridge Fire Safety:** Take charge and be safe

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has seen an increase in fires involving lithium-ion batteries over the last few years.

Many devices contain lithium-ion batteries. Mobile phones, laptops and games console controllers have these batteries, but so do cordless tools, garden machinery plus e-bikes and escooters. These batteries can heat up and cause a fire if not used correctly.

You can Take Charge and Be Safe by following a few simple tips:

- · Charge batteries when you are awake and alert
- Only use the battery, charger and cables supplied by the
- · Before you go to bed, check anything still charging is switched off
- Do not overload sockets
- Do not charge e-bikes and e-scooters in escape routes

Batteries can be a fire hazard if they are not disposed of properly. They should never be put in household rubbish or recycling bins.

During the processing of waste or recycling, a battery can be compacted and damaged, which can lead to ignition of the highly reactive lithium, leading to a fire starting.

Any kind of battery can cause a fire if not disposed of correctly and safely. This includes vapes or other e-cigarettes as well as standard batteries.

Fires involving batteries cause damage to refuse vehicles and roads, as well as significant delays to bin collections and road closures.

#### How to dispose of batteries

There are many places to safely dispose of batteries. As well as local recycling centres, many shops around the county have collection bins in-store.

Next up was to set a target: £1,000 was chosen and then the Scouts designed posters which they then sent to




family and friends to ask for sponsorship. Sponsorship came rolling in and when the event itself happened, we were at about £700.

# Max's journey beyond cancer and the charity giving young people hope

Max was just 15 when he was diagnosed with Hodgkin lymphoma.

After a year of treatment and recovery, he was finally ready to get back to life. Today, we are thankful to say he is cancer free. Yet, as with many children who face serious illness, his recovery has involved more than just pills and rest. Rehabilitation is also about regaining confidence, building new experiences, and reconnecting with life.

That's where certain charities step in, organisations dedicated to helping young people who have been through cancer. These groups provide experiences and activities that not only bring joy, but also give young people the chance to bond with others who truly understand what they've endured.

One such organisation is the Ellen MacArthur Cancer Trust. This national charity works with young people aged 8-24, taking them on sailing and outdoor adventures to inspire them to believe in a brighter future, living through and beyond cancer. Every day in the UK, around 12 young people under 25 are



diagnosed with cancer. When we spent time at the children's cancer unit, it was an eye-opener to see just how many children, many younger than Max, were facing such battles.

As the Trust explains, young people remain vulnerable after treatment, as it comes during a time of rapid physical, emotional, and social development. The challenges don't end when treatment stops, many face lasting effects such as fatigue, infertility, osteoporosis, thyroid issues, or hearing and vision loss. Cancer can also affect education. friendships, relationships, and selfimage.

Through their free sailing and outdoor adventures, the Ellen MacArthur Cancer Trust helps young people laugh again, rediscover independence, and gain a renewed sense of purpose. They realise they are not "the only one" and begin to re-establish their confidence, self-worth, and belief in a brighter future.

This summer, Max was offered a place on their under-18s trip near the Isle of Wight. The charity arranged travel,

providing a taxi from Cambridge and back again, all free of charge. He spent days sleeping on the boats, sailing, learning to tie knots, pulling ropes, even taking the helm. There were sports, cooking sessions, shared meals, and more.

"There was always something to do," Max told me. The trip had a powerful effect on him, boosting his confidence and reminding him that he is capable of more than he realised.

And on a personal note: many may not know that Max has been one of the editors for Cambourne Crier since before his diagnosis, and he continues that work faithfully to this day.

As a family, we are deeply grateful to the Ellen MacArthur Cancer Trust for their work and the impact they have had on Max. We also thought it right to share this charity with our wider community, in the hope that more people will be encouraged to support them. You can learn more at
