# **Act of Remembrance** and parade to take place in Cambourne on 9 November

This year, the Act of Remembrance will take place on Sunday 9th November at 10.50am outside Cambourne Church.

Everyone is welcome at this event as we say 'thank you' to all who have served, sacrificed and changed our world and also to those who are currently doing so. There will be the opportunity for the uniformed organisations, community groups, local businesses and individuals to lay wreaths at the foot of the cross during the service.

There will be a parade of the uniformed organisations starting at the junction of the High Street and Monkfield Lane (by the Monkfield Arms) and moving along the High Street, turning in front of Cambourne Church and then into the church car park from Eastgate. After the service, the parade will then move from the church to the cricket pavilion at the junction of Eastgate and Back Lane.

After the Act of Remembrance, everyone is warmly invited to stay at Cambourne Church for hot drinks and cakes.



The parade route will be closed to all traffic (except pedestrians etc) between 10.00am and 11.45am while the Act of Remembrance and parade take place. Diversions along Broad Street, De La Warr Way and Back Lane will be in place. During this time, the whole of the church car park will be in use for both the parade and members of the public - therefore, please ensure that no vehicles are left in the car park on the Sunday morning. 

# **NHS Survey - Your views matters in Cambourne**

I have launched a new health survey, asking residents about their experience of the NHS.

I am interested in hearing about your experiences of ambulance, surgery and cancer treatment waiting times and more general access to GPs and dentists. There is also an opportunity to detail any specific poor instances of NHS treatment that you might have had. Every response I receive will help build a picture of NHS services in our area, and what I need to do to help improve those that are failing.

I constantly receive messages from constituents

about the poor service they are experiencing on trains to and from London, as well as the rising cost of already costly fares.

I recently raised this with the Secretary of State for Transport in Parliament and pressed her on how she justifies poor service at such a high cost to residents.

While she told me that the Government has not yet confirmed pricing for next year's fares, it seems inevitable that fares will go up if inflation continues to be as high as it is now. She is now, at least, on record saying that fares will be a "balance between affordability and what is fair for taxpayers", and I will certainly be holding her to account on this statement.

# **Dyspraxia - Developmental Co-ordination Disorder**

**Dyspraxia (Developmental Co-ordination** Disorder, DCD), is a condition which affects physical coordination.

It can cause children to appear to move in a clumsy way and they may not perform as well as might be expected in normal daily activities. Dyspraxia does not affect intelligence, but can mean that children are later in reaching their normal milestones, such as crawling, walking, eating independently and writing.

As all children develop at different times, this can mean that getting a diagnosis of dyspraxia can be slow and a child may not be diagnosed until they are over five years old. It is not clear why some people develop dyspraxia, but it is more common in boys and men and may be

linked to being born prematurely and having a low birth weight. Having other family members who have dyspraxia may also make it more likely. Reporting concerns to a doctor, health visitor or school is important so children can receive the practical and emotional support they need to thrive. There are many ways those with dyspraxia can be supported, such as with equipment, occupational therapy and help learning skills in different ways.

Dyspraxia is a lifelong condition, but good support and coping strategies can mean that symptoms feel more manageable.

# £300,000 available to support **community services in South Cambs**

A £300,000 annual funding programme has launched, aimed at empowering local groups that deliver vital services to South Cambridgeshire residents.

# Harvest time in the Jubilee Garden

We don't "plough the fields", nor "scatter good seed on the ground"! In the Jubilee Community Garden at Cambourne Church we use "no dig" cultivation to grow lovely fresh vegetables, harvested each Wednesday for Thursday Foodbank.

The weeds are suppressed with cardboard and a layer of green waste compost, so that the soil ecology is intact and working in harmony with the crops. That does mean that seeds are best started in modules ready to be put in the ground as sturdy young plants. Then they need protection from some of the other natural wonders like caterpillars and deer.

It's not "easy gardening", and it's not always successful, but it has been a delight. Who would have thought, just two years ago, that we would be able to give almost yearround support to the Foodbank?

The land around the church building is a resource to share in many ways; the flower beds round the Annexe have been bright with poppies, marigolds and sunflowers all good for insects. Ladybirdcounting this summer was fun by the back door. The long grass and wildflowers have buzzed with bees, hoverflies and crickets, and we saw 10 different species of butterfly in the Big Butterfly Count. Making an Eco Church Community Garden means we take notice now, and everyone can spend time among the wonders of God's natural world. # **Pastoral thoughts: Maintenance matters**

Recently, I have been doing some maintenance. Both at home and in the ministry. Whether that is replacing a 20year-old fence, recladding a shed, or ordering more USB sticks to transfer files for message PowerPoints, it is all maintenance. Repairing or replacing things when you plan on it is better than waiting for total collapse when you really need it. And the good thing is proper maintenance often is much cheaper and less time-consuming than most emergency replacements.

The same is true spiritually. If we neglect prayer, Bible reading, or fellowship, we may get by for a while, but eventually there will be a breakdown.

Jesus said in Matthew 26:41, "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." Prayer and watchfulness are maintenance for the soul.

With the start of school, we are reminded how important daily habits and steady routines are. A student who studies a little each day fares far better than one who ignores the work until the night before an exam. In our walk with the Lord, a little faithful consistency prevents the crises of neglect. Hebrews 2:1 tells us, "Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip." 
So as this new season begins, let us look to our spiritual upkeep. Read the Scriptures, pray for one another, keep short accounts in forgiveness, and encourage your families

# **Digital Switchover: what** you need to know


By January 2027, traditional landlines will be upgraded with digital technology. This national upgrade is known as the Digital Switchover and will mean that landline calls will be made over the internet instead of the old telephone network. Telephone providers are responsible for switching customers to the upgraded service.

It's important to check how the Digital Switchover will affect you, especially if you also rely on personal alarms or telecare devices (like fall detectors or lifelines), which may stop working. For many, the change will be simple. All you will have to do is plug your landline phone into a broadband router instead of a traditional phone socket. But if you don't have an internet connection at home, or if you rely on your landline every day, this change might affect you more.

#### **Prepare for the Digital Switchover**

- 1. Call your phone company ask if the change affects your phone line or any connected devices. Ask to speak to customer services and use the number on your most recent bill.
- 2. Ask for help if you need it a trusted friend, family member or neighbour can help you make the call to your phone provider or speak to your provider on your behalf.
- 3. Watch out for scams your phone provider will not ask for money upfront. If something doesn't feel right, hang up and call the official number.

You can usually keep your existing phone and number.

# **Have your say on SDCD** council tax support scheme consultation



A public consultation has launched on proposed changes to South Cambridgeshire District Council's working age Local Council Tax Support scheme, which aims to provide greater support and improved outcomes for

customers. The consultation will enable residents and stakeholders to provide input on the proposed changes and allow the Council to assess the potential effects on residents. Additionally, the changes aim to streamline administration and improve efficiency, as well as align with other local authorities and prepare for future changes to local government. A finalised scheme based on the outcomes of the consultation will be presented to a Full Council meeting in February - when District Councillors will decide whether to adopt it.

#### Summary of the proposed changes:

- Use of Universal Credit new claim notifications as application and award date - This aims to reduce the risk of residents missing out on support due to delays in submitting their Council Tax Support application or the application being received after their Universal Credit award is issued.
- Revisions to backdating provisions extend the backdating period up to 12 months and allow claims to be backdated to the date the Council Tax liability has been notified.
- Simplification of non-dependant deductions by introducing a flat-rate deduction.
- Alignment of disability and carer premiums with Universal Credit align the value of disability and carer premiums in the Local Council Tax Support calculation with those used in Universal Credit so residents can better understand their entitlement.
- Simplifying income bands and adjustment rules to reduce the number of income bands and introduce rules to disregard minor income changes.
- Enhancements to award notification processes by providing full award details via the online portal and include key information in Council Tax notifications.

SCDC's Lead Cabinet Member for Resources, Cllr John Williams, said: "The proposed changes aim to ensure residents receive the support they are entitled to, and I encourage people to take part in the consultation. The Council's means-tested banded discount scheme continues to provide up to 100% support for working-age residents, ensuring support reaches those most in need. Following a comprehensive review in 2023/24, the scheme was confirmed to be both robust and responsive - offering vital support to residents facing financial uncertainty during the ongoing cost-of-living challenges."







#### Stay fire safe in your kitchen

More than half the fires crews attend in the home start in the kitchen. This can be down to a number of things. Below are some simple safety tips to help you stay fire safe in the kitchen:

- Avoid leaving children in the kitchen alone when cooking on the hob. Keep matches and saucepan handles out of their reach to keep them safe.
- Take care if you're wearing loose clothing - this can easily catch fire.
- Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob.
- Double check the cooker is off when you've finished cooking.
- Don't store items on top of hobs.
- Take care if you need to leave the kitchen whilst cooking, take pans off the heat or turn them down to avoid risk.
- Make sure saucepan handles don't stick out – so they don't get knocked off.
- Keep electrics (leads and appliances) away from water.
- Check toasters are clean and placed away from curtains and kitchen rolls.
- Keep the oven, hob and grill clean and in good working order. A build-up of fat and grease can ignite a fire.

Cllr Natalie Warren Green, Lead Cabinet Member for Environment, said: "We're proud to continue leading the way in tackling the climate and ecological emergencies, working towards a district that is not only environmentally friendly but resilient and future ready.

"The 2025 Climate Action Conference is a rallying call that reminds us that real change begins in our communities, when we come together with purpose and passion. By sharing bold ideas, practical solutions, and collective energy, we're showing what's possible when we unite. Every action we take, no matter the size, moves us closer to a cleaner, greener, and fairer world for generations to come."

Speakers at the event include Ian Walters talking about a biodiversity action plan for Duxford Parish and Josh Newman from Grantchester's HeatLink about the transition to renewable heating.

The Council's charity of the year, the Wildlife Trust Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Northamptonshire, will talk about groundbreaking butterfly research with the University of Cambridge that's changing the way they manage their nature reserves.



# **Beat the Street game offers** month-long activity challenge

A popular interactive game that turns Cambourne into a giant activity competition has launched! The game is fun and free. See how far you can walk, cycle, run and scoot in just 4 weeks between 24 September and 22 October 2025. You can join the game at any point in these four weeks and win some amazing prizes!

The game is open to anyone of any age who would like to take part and have some fun. Children use a game card and a printed map which will be provided by participating primary schools. Players over the age of 13 can download the free Beat the Street app to play the game with their phone. Anyone can pick up a free game card and a printed map from one of the distribution points listed on the Beat the Street game website <a href="https://www.beatthestreet.me/Cambourne">www.beatthestreet.me/Cambourne</a> to register and play the game. The distribution points for picking up the game cards and printed maps are:

- 1. South Cambs DC offices
- 2. Cambourne Town Council offices
- 3. Monkfield Arms pub.

You play by creating your Beat the Street account on the Beat the Street website or by downloading the Beat the Street App. You can add family members, and register a card to player proles. Set up a team or join an existing one. You then start your journey - Find your nearest Beat Box using our paper

or digital map and hover your card at the contactless Beat Box until it beeps and flashes. If playing with the app, tap the Beat Box icon on your phone and swipe to collect points. You score 10 points for each extra Box you visit.



Visit two Beat Boxes within an hour and collect 10 points for each Beat Box, then keep going!




