TOWN COUNCIL

■ AGAR 2024/25

The Town Council is currently awaiting a report from the external auditor. An assessment into what further actions may require is being undertaken and will be provided to the Council in due course.

The recent Interim audit will be considered by the Town Council but was encouraging and a testament to the commitment of the Council's officers and Councillors to change.

■ Staffing

The Council has recently concluded interviews for several roles, including Community Development Officer, Sports Development Officer and Office Administrator.

With these roles filled the Town Council office should be open at the expected hours. This may fluctuate initially whilst staff are being trained.

■ Budget 2026/27

The Town Council has until 6th February 2026 to agree and issue its precept requirement to South Cambridgeshire District Council.

The Town Council is responsible for the allotments, burial ground, community buildings, events, play areas and public open spaces and a number of other functions. These are all funded from the precept and other income the Town Council receives throughout the year.

■ Local Highway Improvement

Bid 2026 Submitted

Cambourne Town Council has submitted its Local Highway Improvement (LHI) bid to Cambridgeshire County Council for the 2026 funding round. The bid is for a pedestrian crossing at Uplands Place, an area where the Council has received

numerous requests and testimonials highlighting the need for improved safety. The Council is aware that there has also been disappointment expressed regarding Back Lane, which has not been included in this year's bid. This location has been considered; however, specific funding has been made available that directly supports an application for Uplands Place, making this bid more likely to be successful.

If alternative funding sources become available, the Council could look at the installation of MVAS units (Mobile Vehicle Activated signs) and other measures, alternatively the provisions would be reviewed in December 2026 ahead of next year's submission.

It is also important to note that the Town Council is only permitted to submit one LHI bid per year, which means priorities must be carefully assessed when deciding which scheme to put forward.

Spotting the first signs of spring on Cambourne's nature reserves

WILDLIFE TRUST BCN: Look out for early signs of spring on our nature reserves in February...

- Frogs, toads, and newts may migrate in late Feb if the weather is mild. If you find an animal at risk, please don't move it far, and use gloves or wet hands.
- Great spotted woodpeckers can be heard drumming in woods in late winter
- Lesser celandine is a low-growing wildflower found in woodlands. It flowers late winter into early spring and has long, bright yellow, glossy, petals, and heart-shaped leaves.
- Rooks and herons both nest communally, and early, in tall trees
- Peacock and brimstone butterflies overwinter as adults and can be seen throughout winter on warm days
- White-tailed and buff-tailed bumblebee are often the first queens to emerge and can be huge!

Here are a few things you can do to help wildlife when visiting nature reserves or other wilder green spaces:

Keep your dog out of the water: Topical flea treatment can affect aquatic invertebrates, and the food chain they are part of, plus dogs disturb sediment which then covers aquatic plants and reduces their ability to oxygenate in the water.

Avoid muddy paths: If you know it will be especially muddy, please walk elsewhere to avoid churning paths. If you end up on a muddy path, please stick to the middle so you don't spread the damage. It helps if you wear appropriate footwear.

Record and report: The Wildlife Trust BCN is always happy to hear about positive wildlife encounters; send us a photo if you can! It would be great if you could submit a formal wildlife record via the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Environmental Records Centre.

This year we are trialling a few community volunteering days suitable for adults, and families with children aged 7+. Booking is essential, so please get in touch if you want to come along.

Online Safety – Social Media for under 16s

I have received hundreds of messages from local parents who are concerned about the consequences of social media on their children's safety and mental wellbeing.

The Liberal Democrats have long raised the alarm on social media harms as a public health crisis, and over the past month

We announced our amendment to the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill, which calls for a ban on harmful social media for under 16s.

Our amendment proposes film-style age ratings of up to 18 for the most harmful platforms and a default rating of 16 for social media. This model, while protecting children from the worst of the online world and providing an incentive for platforms to remove addictive algorithms and harmful content, ensures that children can

continue to use sites like Wikipedia for schoolwork, or WhatsApp to stay connected to family and friends. Both could be age-gated under a blanket under-16 ban. It's important that children are able to access online crisis services such as Childline forums which are caught up in Online Safety Act user-to-user services.

When this issue came to a vote in the House of Lords, the Conservative blanket ban amendment passed with Liberal Democrat support. Children and young people must come first and this vote sends a clear message that Parliament expects urgent progress on protecting children online.

The Bill will soon return to the House of Commons and I will continue to hold the government accountable for protecting our children online.

Grants to support local groups and services

I take heart in local decisions that support people close to home, that recognise the contributions of all in our community and hold tight to democracy.

The national government offered SCDC the chance to postpone local elections in May, but we rejected this, believing that the right to vote is fundamental to all we hold dear.

I am also cheered that due to good financial management, the district council has been able to commit to £900,000 in discretionary funding over the next three years for support grants, recognising the crucial skills that local charities and community groups have to deliver services that make a real difference including supporting

people with their mental health, independent living, advice services, and helping residents through the cost-of-living crisis.

Many of the grants awarded focus on young and older people, reducing isolation and supporting those affected by bereavement.

The 2026-2029 funding allocations were awarded following a rigorous assessment process, ensuring funds are directed where they will have the greatest impact.

As your local councillor, I recently participated in a meeting with relevant transport bodies, the developers and bus companies, unlocking significant funding for buses in our area. I wish progress was faster, but it is being made.

Raynaud's phenomenon

Raynaud's phenomenon is a common condition that temporarily affects normal blood flow to fingers and toes.

It does not usually cause severe problems but can be very uncomfortable. Raynaud's can cause pain, numbness and pins and needles and often causes fingers and toes to change colour.

Symptoms can last anything from several minutes to a few hours. It is usually linked to the cold but can be caused by feelings of anxiety or stress, or using vibrating tools over a long time. If you have Raynaud's it can be helped by keeping warm and wearing warm clothing, especially on your hands and feet.

Exercise and finding ways of relaxing can also help. Caffeine (found in coffee, tea and cola) can make symptoms worse, as can smoking because it affects the circulation.

Raynaud's can often be managed without medical help, but it is important to see the GP if symptoms are very severe or getting worse; if they only affect one side of the body; for those under 12 years old or if symptoms develop for the first time over the age of 30.

Sometimes Raynaud's can be a sign of a different health condition, if there are also any problems with rashes, joint pain or muscle weakness it should be reported to your GP.

Parish boundary proposal

Most of you will have little reason to think about the boundary of Cambourne parish. I am not talking about the civic boundary of the town of Cambourne, but rather the boundary which exists for various legal and practical purposes for the Church of England.

While the civic town boundary now includes West Cambourne as well as Lower, Great, and Upper Cambourne, the church parish boundary does not yet include West Cambourne, which is legally still within Caxton parish. This does not seem sensible to anyone with whom I have discussed it, and we are in the process of getting the parish boundary redrawn to include West Cambourne. I hope that this will be finalised in the coming months. As part of the

consultation, before the legal change goes ahead, I am offering residents an opportunity to comment on this proposal. You can do this through Cambourne Church office or by contacting the Church of England's Ely Diocesan offices.

For me it is important that West Cambourne is integrated into the rest of Cambourne life in every way possible. For example, we have made representations about transport links, which have now improved somewhat.

As we are a town which now comprises four villages rather than three, this should be reflected in all kinds of ways. The redrawing of the parish boundary is a technical matter, but it is part of a journey to becoming one community.

Pastoral thoughts: Unexpected things

Things happen that are often unpredictable. Perhaps for good or ill, life has a way of surprising us and altering our plans. Because of this, we must maintain flexibility in our pursuits. After all, a diversion is not a total block, merely a path you have yet to take.

One such recent change was our assistant minister moving on ministry. As he and his wife were leading the addiction recovery ministry on Wednesdays, we will be suspending those meetings for now. This does not mean that if someone is struggling in that area we cannot help; rather, assistance will be on a more individual basis instead of a scheduled group setting. We wish

Caleb well in his future endeavours and wherever the Lord leads him. He was a great blessing during my illness, filling in when needed, and has learned much in preparation for future ministry.

In all unexpected situations, especially those that bring difficulty, it is wise to take a moment to assess rather than panic. Ask yourself: are there preparations you can rely upon? I was reminded of this when someone panicked because a piece of equipment stopped working after the power pack finally gave up ... and I handed them a spare I had bought three months earlier.

If there are no preparations in place, consider what has changed, what has

remained the same, and what you can do about it. If you need help, seek it. If nothing can be done, then carry on with what you can do and pray about the rest. Stressing over things beyond your control accomplishes nothing.

Jacob faced this when he feared meeting his brother Esau. He planned, he prepared, and then he prayed – and God changed the outcome. Never underestimate what God can do with even a little faith. The results may be unexpected, but in His wisdom they are better in the long run.

Monkfield Park is an inspiration to geographers

MONKFIELD PARK PRIMARY

SCHOOL was thrilled to learn that it had been awarded the prestigious Primary Quality Mark for its 'lively and effective teaching of Geography'. This is a very special award as it demonstrates how outward looking the school is and a reflection of its unique and diverse community.

As part of the broad curriculum, children are taught about physical, human and environmental Geography to develop their understanding of the world around them and their impact on it. This term they are studying a wide range of topics from climate zones and biomes to the human Geography of South America,



Kenya and China. Year 5 have been studying South America and were delighted to discover that Zara Lachlan, the first woman and youngest person to row solo from Europe to South America, lives locally in Cambridgeshire. The inspired kids wrote to her about her South American odyssey, with their many questions compiled into two books. Zara very kindly sent a wonderful film to the school describing the high points and difficulties of her journey and answering each question in person. Zara is currently training for her next rowing adventure but has promised to visit Monkfield Park to share details of her exciting geographical discoveries.



Is spring really early? A closer look at Wandlebury's snowdrops

Snowdrops and winter aconites are beginning to show across Wandlebury Country Park, prompting the familiar seasonal question: is spring arriving early, or are we simply more attuned to its first signs?

At Wandlebury, these early flowers have been quietly emerging from their bulbs since late autumn. While mild winters can encourage earlier growth, wardens say the story is less about dates and more about noticing what is already there. Peak snowdrop season at the park is still expected in the first week of February, and during half term week.

"Snowdrops and aconites are the bright harbingers of longer days," said Hannah Warren, one of Wandlebury's wardens. "Our display at Wandlebury is unfurling across the old gardens and into the woods, and the coming weeks offer a chance to discover all the early signs of spring."

Alongside these familiar signs are other indicators of change for those who look closely. Tiny pink hazel flowers can be spotted among catkins, while spurge laurel produces small green flowers hidden beneath its leaves, carrying a faint scent of honey. Stinking hellebore, less subtle in name and smell, is another early presence in the park.

Wandlebury Country Park lies on the Gog Magog Hills just south-east of Cambridge and is known for its sweeping views, woodland walks and layered history, including the earthworks of an Iron Age hillfort. The park offers space for winter walks that reward attention to detail as much as spectacle.

One pupil summed up the experience perfectly, saying he "had fun learning about what goes in each bin and can't wait to tell his grown ups how to use them properly".

The workshops not only provided an enjoyable day for the children but also helped them develop a stronger understanding of environmental responsibility, leaving them inspired to make positive changes at home and in their community.





Once a year the team has its annual get-together, this year enjoying a meal at The Red House in Longstowe – a few miles south of Cambourne – at the end of January.


